

DID YOU KNOW....

Mother Nature has her own schedule for things in the outdoors?

For instance, many agaves, especially those which have red blooms, flower after Christmas when little else is blooming. This gives hummingbirds food when few other flowers are available. Their breeding season starts far earlier than the songbirds, beginning in January and finishing in June. They need the agave nectar and also take advantage of bugs tucked up under leaves and slowed by the chill of early morning.



And, have you ever wondered why so many kittens are born in spring? It's because Nature tells our instinctively (almost) wild cats that food will be abundant in spring because of increased breeding then by mice and other prey animals. Unfortunately, we disturb the balance of mice to cats by traps, but the cats are still programmed for the old operating system.

Many of us buy amaryllis lilies for Christmas, but once they have bloomed and been planted in the yard, they don't bloom the following Christmas, they wait until spring. Though forced to bloom once at Christmas, in the ground they revert to their original natural bloom time programming, responding to the light and warmth of spring as Nature intended. Amaryllis originated in South Africa where seasons are opposite to ours. Our spring is during South Africa's winter (Christmas.)

We can fool Mother Nature some of the time, but not all the time ☺!

IRONMAN OCEANSIDE HISTORY:

The recent Ironman 70.3 Oceanside event has a long history. Up until 2001 the event was held entirely with the Camp Pendleton Marine Corps Base, but following the events of 9/11 for security reasons only part of the bike course goes through the base. The first races were known as Half-Ironman California, until the 70.3 'brand' was created in 2005, leading to the first IRONMAN 70.3 World Championship in 2006.

IRON VAN 70.3° OCEANSIDE

The course starts at the harbor beach with a 1.2 mile swim in the salt water into the harbor to the boat docks. The bike route starts from Oceanside Harbor thru Camp Pendleton & San Onofre Bluffs State Park with a steep descent then the flat but very windy road back to the Harbor. The two-loop, 13.1-mile run course begins at Transition above the Oceanside Pier, down onto the Harbor, on The Strand and through coastal neighborhoods before a spectacular finish.

Participants come from all over the world to Oceanside for this event. It's a premier showcase for our beautiful town and varied amenities!
