

MATERIALS LIST

You May Use:

- Corrugated cardboard (boxes or sheets) – no restrictions
- Cardboard tubes
- Fasteners used may be staples, nails or tape – clear (Scotch-type), packing, duct, gaffer or masking only. Only seams or joints may be taped, not the whole boat!
- Glue – water-based/white glue
- Paint – latex paint only, and spray is ok – but slap it on...decoration and historic boat replication are encouraged!
- Rope or string
- Cloth (for sails only)

TECHNICALS: (Our Technical judge will be walking around during the Boat Show)

You May NOT Use:

- Metal
- Wood
- Rubber
- Styrofoam, or rigid floating foam of any kind
- Plastic sheeting or shrink wrap
- Plastic or plastic structures of any kind (pvc pipe, etc.)
- Screws or metal fastening devices other than staples or nails
- Two-part epoxies, glues or fiberglass
- Metal oarlocks
- Oil-based sealants or paints
- Lacquer, caulk or wax
- Tar-based substances

AESTHETICS: (Our Aesthetics judges will be walking around during the Boat Show)

Creativity counts! Teams or individuals should visibly mark their team name on the boat, as well as prominent display of the TWISTED TEA logo. Kissing up by putting the logo of our sponsor, TWISTED TEA, never hurts either. The decoration must not aid in the buoyancy of the boat. Remember – the more creative, the better – there are big prizes on the line here for Best in Show! Judges are looking in these categories:

1. Use of Color
2. Originality
3. Creativity
4. Logo Placement
5. Humorous
6. Historical Accuracy OR Theme Accuracy
7. Over-all

*All decisions of the boat committee and judges are final.

*Boats are to be judged on design, appearance, apparent sea-worthiness and originality. Appearance can include consideration for costumes worn by the boat crew.

*Prizes will be awarded for best in show and fastest to race.
