Pastor's Word

While visiting family in Indiana after Christmas, a large group of us – about 14 or so – went out to eat at El Charro, my parents' favorite Mexican restaurant. There weren't that many people at El Charro on that cold evening, but among the other diners who happened to be there was my cousin Dennis, who I don't get a chance to see very often. For many years Dennis was a high school band director. When I was in sixth and seventh grade, I took saxophone lessons from him. I was happy to tell Dennis that 40+ years later, I still play the saxophone, and I told him about our Yuletide Orchestra. Now a Catholic deacon, Dennis told me that he had played tenor sax at one of the congregations in his 3-point parish a couple of weeks ago.

I always enjoy the Advent and Christmas season here at First Baptist, and playing the saxophone a few times is just a small part of it. This year, the music and worship and fellowship were especially meaningful. Our Music Sunday was wonderful and the Christmas Eve service was a highlight, as always, but what stood out this year was Christmas morning. We rarely have worship on Christmas morning, but this year Christmas fell on a Sunday, and there we were. With a small group, we met in the lounge, and we had a kind of impromptu Christmas pageant in which the story was read and everybody had a "part" to play. There were lots of smiles and lots of laughter, and our worship on Christmas morning helped to make for a special season.

After the holidays, it is a little bit tough to switch gears, but we are now in a new year, with hopes and dreams and goals and plans. One of my hopes for our church is that we might expand our ministry in the community and beyond. A few immediate opportunities come to mind.

First, we are partnering with First Christian, First United Methodist, and Ames UCC to hold a Mental Health Educational Forum. It will be on Saturday, January 15 from 9-12 at First Christian Church. The focus will be on recognizing signs of mental illness and responding in helpful ways. Such persons might include those who stop by the church (or your place of work) seeking assistance as well as friends, family, neighbors, people in the dorm, etc. Julie Saxton, the Mental Health Advocate with the Ames Police Department, will lead the session. This is an area of concern in our community and I am glad that we are working with other congregations to provide this training.

Another opportunity: the deacons were happy for our church to participate in the Ames Interfaith Refugee Alliance. This group, composed of a number of congregations, is looking at sponsoring one or more refugee families in our community, working with city officials and others. Julie Johnston and Susan Russell are our representatives in these conversations – if you are interested or would like to get involved, please talk to one of them.

Pledge Update

Thank you to all who made a financial pledge of support to our church for 2017! Through our stewardship campaign we received 37 pledges, including 4 new pledges, for a total of \$175,500. Thank you all for your generous giving. If you would still like to make a pledge, it's not too late! Pledge cards are available in the narthex or from the church office.

A Way to Do Good and Do Well

The Endowment Committee would like to remind members that contributions from IRAs (either traditional or ROTH) do not have to be included in gross income if certain conditions are met:

- The transferor must be at least 70 and one-half;
- It must be a direct transfer from the trustee of the IRA to the charity;
- The limit is \$100,000 (\$200,000 for married couples if each have IRAs); and
- A charitable deduction is not allowed for the amount excluded from income.

These transfers from your IRA do not increase your adjusted gross income, and may keep you from having your social security income taxed at a higher rate. The qualified charitable distribution (QCD) can count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

You may want to consult with your tax professional and your plan administrator for more details, and before implementing the transfer.

Another effective way to make charitable contributions is to donate appreciated stock that has been held more than one year. In that event, the donor deducts the fair market value of the stock as a charitable contribution and the built-in gain (often called paper gain) is not taxed. Again, consult with your tax professional.

December Special Offerings

Thank you to those gave to the **Christmas Offering.** One half of this offering goes to our Benevolence Fund to assist persons in need who come to our church for assistance; the other half goes to the Emergency Residence Project. We received a total of \$714.

Thank you also to those who contributed to the **Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering**, which provides Thank You checks as well as emergency assistance to retired ministers and missionaries. We received \$755.


Board and Committee News


