*Old Dominion led by backup QB Blake LaRussa's 495 passing yards pulled off the biggest upset of the CFB season so far as they shocked No. 13 Virginia Tech 49-35 last Saturday. The Monarchs who were 29-point underdogs, were as high as +3000 on the money line in some places!*

### ATS Notables

FIU, Texas A&M, Utah St, Virginia and Washington St are all 4-0 ATS. Meanwhile Appalachian St, Georgia Southern and West Virginia are 3-0 ATS.

Bowling Green, Florida Atlantic, Georgia Tech, Louisville, USC and Wake Forest are all 0-4 ATS. Nebraska and Tennessee are 0-3 ATS.

Missouri games are 4-0 to the OVER while Utah St, Penn St, South Alabama, New Mexico, Toledo, Rice, Ohio and Wake Forest games are 3-0 to the OVER.

Ball St games are 4-0 to the UNDER while Louisville, Washington, Western Michigan, Vanderbilt, North Texas, Central Michigan, BYU and Georgia Southern games are all 3-0 to the UNDER.

### Misleading Finals

**Tulsa** had 32-16 first down and 403-300 yard edges vs Temple but lost 31-17. Tulsa had 5 TO's and two of them were returned for touchdowns.

**East Carolina** had 24-9 first down and 412-296 yard edges vs South Florida but lost 20-13. The Pirates still easily covered.

**Nevada** had a 582-460 yard edge vs Toledo but the Rockets got a blocked punt touchdown and a 98-yard kick return TD to extend their margin (63-44).

**Florida** only had a 387-364 yard edge vs Tennessee but won 47-21 thanks to six Volunteer turnovers in the game.

**Auburn** was actually out-gained by Arkansas 290-225 but somehow the Tigers got the cover as a 29.5-point favorite! Auburn got a 96-yard kick return TD, a key blocked punt and several long punt returns that set them up for short scoring drives in the 34-3 win.

**UTEP** had 24-15 first down and 429-311 yard edges vs New Mexico St but lost 27-20. The Aggies got a 19-yard blocked punt return TD, a 55-yard fumble return TD and the Miners also fumbled inside the New Mexico St 20-yard line.

### Major Injuries

**Coastal Carolina QB Kilton Anderson** (ankle) is doubtful this week at Troy.

**Massachusetts QB Andrew Ford** is questionable for this week's game vs Ohio.

**New Mexico QB Tevaka Tuioti** (concussion) has been upgraded to probable for this week's game vs Liberty.

**San Diego St RB Juwan Washington** (collarbone) is out indefinitely.

**Virginia Tech QB Josh Jackson** (leg) is out indefinitely. Meanwhile, leading pass rusher Trevon Hill was dismissed from the team.

### Bad Beats From Last Week

The **Miami/Bowling Green** totals' line was right around 55 last week. UNDER bettors looked great as it was 31-3 Miami with under 6 minutes left. However, 4 TD's in the final minutes put the game OVER. The last TD was a "Hail Mary" 40-yard pass on the final play of the game!

The **Stanford/Oregon** game not only was a misleading final but was also a bad beat for Ducks' backers. Oregon led the game 24-7 late third quarter and had a TD overturned by replay. At that point, Oregon had a 99% chance to win the game and the Ducks were short underdogs. Two plays later, Stanford got an 80-yard fumble return TD to cut it to 24-14. With less than two minutes left and Oregon just needing to run out the clock up 31-28, the Ducks fumbled giving Stanford life. The Cardinal would tie it with a field goal on the final play and then would win it in OT. Oregon still dominated the stats with a 524-398 yard edge and a 178-71 rushing yard edge.

The **Wisconsin/Iowa** total was right around 43 last week. UNDER bettors looked to be in good position late with Iowa winning 17-14. However, after a Wisconsin TD with under a minute left, the Badgers got the ball back after an interception. Instead of taking a knee, Wisconsin got a 33-yard TD run with :22 left that put the game OVER the total.

### Recapping Week Three Best Bets

Overall, it was another great week as we went 7-1 on our best bets on these pages last week. The college selections continued their big rebound from the opening two weeks with another 4-1 week. The 3★'s did split out. While Michigan St controlled Indiana from start to finish, Iowa St settled for a bunch of FG's and couldn't cover the large spread vs Akron. Baylor was an easy winner over Kansas (led 23 at half-time) and Louisiana Tech only trailed LSU 24-21 before allowing a couple of late TD's. Texas A&M did get the back-door cover on Alabama. In the pros, we were fortunate to get a cover with Cleveland last Thursday Night thanks to Baker Mayfield. Meanwhile Seattle and Baltimore were double-digit winners. **VIP customers easily won a 5★ Totals Game of Month on Ohio/Cincinnati OVER. We gave it out at 52.5 and the line closed at 55.5! It didn't matter as Cincinnati won 34-30. Overall, VIP customers went 11-3!**

**Games in Rotation Order** **HOME TEAM IN CAPS**  
**Thursday, September 27th**

**MIAMI 37 North Carolina 20.** Last week Miami dominated FIU leading 31-0 entering the 4Q but they allowed 17 points and 139 yards in the final stanza to make the final somewhat misleading (still had a 27-7 FD edge). The Canes did turn to N'Kosi Perry at QB and he will probably start here. Meanwhile, North Carolina got a much-needed win over Pitt to cool head coach Larry Fedora's seat for the time being. Tough travel spot here for NC on a short week. We're passing.

**Friday, September 28th**  
**Memphis 38 TULANE 27.** Money has poured in on Memphis each of the last two weeks as their lines have climbed 3-plus points. Last week the money was wrong as they were tied with 4-TD underdog South Alabama at halftime. The Tigers did win by 17 in the end as RB Henderson is the nation's leading rusher now with 709 yards. On the other side, Tulane got run over by Ohio St as the Buckeyes got a late covering TD. We lean with the home dog here.

**COLORADO 35 Ucla 23.** UCLA has lost 12 straight games away from home going 4-8 ATS. Both teams come in off a bye. Obviously, it's been a tough start for new UCLA head coach Chip Kelly as the Bruins are 0-3 and will likely be underdogs in each of their last 9 games. Meanwhile, the Buffs are off to a 3-0 start and have a 3-head monster on offense with QB Montez (73%, 8-2 ratio), RB McMillian (290 yards) and WR Shenault (455 yards). Slight lean on the favorite.

**Saturday, September 29th**  
**BUFFALO 28 Army 22.** Buffalo has been mighty impressive so far at 4-0 for the first time since 1981. Last week the Bulls drilled Rutgers (first ever win over a Big Ten opponent) as QB Jackson has a 15-3 TD-to-INT ratio so far this season. On the other side, Army had the ball for nearly 45 minutes as they almost pulled off one of the biggest upsets in college football history losing in OT at Oklahoma as 30-point underdogs. Their offense converted a combined 17 3rd and 4th downs which kept the high-powered OU offense off the field. We lean with the dog here.

**Cincinnati 40 CONNECTICUT 23.** Last year Cincy won 22-21 in dramatic fashion. UConn scored on the final play but after a 15-yard penalty, missed the extra point. The Huskies have been horrible so far this season as their defense ranks dead last allowing an incredible 664 ypg and 54.5 ppg. Meanwhile we won our 5★ Totals GOM on the OVER last week in the Ohio/Cincy game as the Bearcats rallied from a 24-7 deficit and then held on late. We're passing.

**MICHIGAN ST 38 Central Michigan 10.** Last week we cashed on these pages with the Spartans as they pretty much led from start to finish over Indiana. They did lead 28-7 at one point but allowed Indiana to get back in the game via TO's. On the other side, Central Michigan managed a 17-5 win over Maine despite only 177 total yards. Tommy Lazzaro got the start at QB. Even though our power ratings, say Sparty is the play here, we can't trust them as a big favorite. Pass.

**EASTERN MICHIGAN 24 Northern Illinois 23.** Northern Illinois has won 10 straight series meetings over going 7-3 ATS. NIU is also on a 27-5 SU and 24-8 ATS run on the road in MAC play. Last week the Huskies were drilled by Florida St (outgained 473-221). Meanwhile, the Eagles despite being in a bad spot (3rd straight road trip) nearly pulled off the outright upset in San Diego before falling in OT to the Aztecs. We lean with the road team as this is the first time EMU has had to handle expectations in recent series history.

**BALL ST 33 Kent St 27.** Both teams are much improved this season and a win here could boost their confidence in MAC play. Last week the Cardinals disappointed us losing 28-20 as 3-point favorites at home to WKU as they couldn't hold on to a 20-14 lead. Meanwhile, Kent St had to overcome several travel delays (did their walk-through in an airport hangar!) as they got the cover at Ole Miss (7-7 at halftime). We're leaning with the road dog here.

**WAKE FOREST 42 Rice 18.** After the blowout loss to Notre Dame last week, the Demon Deacons fired their D.C Jay Sawvel while promoting Tim Gilmore to the D.C. position this week. Meanwhile, Rice after a bye week got blown out at Southern Miss (outgained 566-262). We're guessing the Demon Deacons get a one-game bump on defense here. We lean UNDER.

**EAST CAROLINA 34 Old Dominion 26.** Last week Old Dominion pulled off the biggest upset of the season so far beating Virginia Tech 49-35 as 29-point underdogs. A hundred-dollar bet on ODU on the money line would have paid as much as \$3,000! It was a complete stunner considering ODU was pitiful with losses to Liberty, FIU and Charlotte to start the season. Obviously the QB Switch to Blake LaRussa (495 passing yards) worked out for them. Meanwhile ECU had 24-9 FD and 412-296 yard edges vs USF but lost 20-13. The Pirates defense is the most improved unit in the country as after allowing 45 ppg and 542 ypg a year ago, they are allowing only 22 ppg and 320 ypg this year. How does ODU respond to their biggest win in school history?

**GEORGIA TECH 45 Bowling Green 17.** Both coaches deserve to be on the hot seat here especially Bowling Green's Mike Jinks. After the home loss to Miami, OH last week, the Falcons are now just 7-20-1 ATS under him. What's even worse was those who had the UNDER 55.5 in the game as the two teams' combined for 4 TD's in the final 5:34. The last one came on a 40-yarder on the final play of the game to put it OVER! Yikes! Meanwhile, Georgia Tech was crushed at home by Clemson. At 1-3 Paul Johnson and the Jackets need a feel good win. They get it but we're passing.

**BOSTON COLLEGE 35 Temple 17.** Temple has been pure "Jekyll and Hyde" this season. After a blowout win over Maryland, the Owls got a win and cover over Tulsa last Thursday but the game was misleading as Tulsa had 32-16 FD and 403-300 yard edges. Temple forced 5 TO's and returned two for TD's. Meanwhile, the Temple QB's combined to throw for just 8 of 21 for 109 yards. On the other side, Boston College was upset by Purdue as the Eagles had 4 TO's. That ended their 12-game ATS cover streak in the regular season. We like for them to get back on track here.

**CLEMSON 45 Syracuse 21.** Clemson has officially made the switch to Trevor Lawrence at QB after he led 5 TD drives vs Georgia Tech in 6 possessions. For the season, Kelly Bryant had 21 drives but Clemson avg'd 2.2 points per drive. With Lawrence under center (23 drives), Clemson avg'd 4.2 points per drive. Lawrence is completing 65% of his passes for 600 yards with a 9-2 ratio (8th best passer rating in country). We've now upgraded Clemson to our No. 2 team in the country. Obviously, Clemson has revenge here as they lost outright to Syracuse 27-24 as a 23.5-point road favorite last year. While Syracuse is off to their best start since 1991 after a blowout win over UConn last week, they're making a huge step up in class here. Obviously we got in front of a huge line move here when we bet it on Sunday night.

**APPALACHIAN ST 38 South Alabama 17.** We don't agree with the market's continued position against South Alabama. Last week the Jags took big money against them and they easily covered at Memphis (it was 21-21 at halftime). Now the early money has come in against them here. The Mountaineers did crush Gardner-Webb 72-7 (692-160 yard edge). We lean with the road dog.

**DUKE 28 Virginia Tech 23.** Obviously, it was a historic game for all the wrong reasons last week for Virginia Tech. The Hokies suffered the biggest loss for any ACC team in 40 years losing outright as 29-point dogs at ODU. VT allowed more than 600 yards of offense to the Monarchs which was the most by a Bud Foster led defense. The Hokies also lost QB Jackson to a broken leg. Meanwhile, Duke is off to a 4-0 start after a blowout win over NC Central. They haven't beaten VT at home since 1981 (0-7). They do so here.

**UL-Monroe 31 GEORGIA ST 27.** Last week Georgia St was dominated at the line of scrimmage by Western Michigan (out-rushed 294-58) in their 34-15 loss. Meanwhile, ULM's furious comeback vs Troy (trailed 35-7 at halftime) came up just short. We lean with the home dog.

**OHIO 41 Massachusetts 28.** Last week the Bobcats blew a 24-7 lead at Cincinnati but Ohio had a chance to win at the end before getting intercepted deep in Cincy's red zone. We cashed our 5★ Totals GOM on the OVER. On the other side, UMass with Michael Curtis at QB (4 total TD's) in place of the injured Andrew Ford crushed Charlotte 49-31. We're passing until Ford's injury situation clears.

**UCF 38 Pittsburgh 26.** Last week UCF extended their nation's longest win streak to 16 games as QB Milton accounted for 6 total TD's. The Knights took advantage of 3 key FAU TO's. Meanwhile, Pitt suffered an upset loss at North Carolina and are traveling again. We lean with Pitt here, however Sunday Night Owl customers got Pitt above a key "14" number. Now there's been some clear value lost.

**KENTUCKY 24 South Carolina 23.** Both teams are coming in off impressive conference wins. The Wildcats pulled away from Miss St in the rain as RB Snell had 165 yards and 4 TD's. UK dominated the line of scrimmage with a 229-56 rush yard edge as they are 4-0 for the first time since 2008. Meanwhile, South Carolina notched their 10th straight win over Vandy while piling up 534 yards. Kentucky is great as a disrespected underdog but are 0-8 ATS as a home favorite. Meanwhile South Carolina has covered 8 straight away from home. However, Kentucky has won 4 straight over South Carolina and covered 5 straight. We're passing.

**NC STATE 30 Virginia 24.** Last week the Wolf Pack got a big win at Marshall as QB Finley threw for 377 yards. Meanwhile, UVA is off to a solid 3-1 start after pummeling Louisville. For the second week in a row, money is pouring in on Virginia and against NC State. However, we're passing.

**Indiana 34 RUTGERS 20.** This is the largest away favorite role for the Hoosiers in any road trip since 1990! Last week we cashed on these pages fading IU as they fell at home to Michigan St 35-21 (did trail 28-7). On the other side, the Scarlet Knights have taken a clear step back in year 3 under head coach Chris Ash as they are coming off back-to-back blowout losses to lowly Kansas and a MAC team in Buffalo. However, this line looks a little steep.

**AIR FORCE 37 Nevada 30.** Both teams come in off road losses. The Falcons ran a school-record 107 plays but their defense couldn't contain a high-powered Utah St offense in a 42-32 loss. Meanwhile, Nevada fell at Toledo 63-44 in a somewhat misleading final as the Rockets got a 98-yard kick return TD and a blocked punt TD. We're passing.

**Utah 27 WASHINGTON ST 26.** Utah does come in off the bye here while Washington St just played a tightly-contested game vs USC last week that came down to the final play. We came away impressed with the Cougars who led the game 30-17 before USC rallied. QB Minshew was 37 of 52 for 344 yards and 3 TD's. The Cougars have won 3 straight vs the Utes. This one comes down to the wire.

**ARIZONA ST 40 Oregon St 19.** We once again came away impressed with Arizona St last week in their 7-point loss at Washington. The offense managed 164 rush yds which was double what they had vs Mich St and San Diego St combined. This is a big favorite role here for them but the Beavers disappointed us last week in a blowout loss at home to Arizona (outgained 594-238). We're passing.

**2★ BYU (plus the points) WASHINGTON 30 Byu 17.** After last week's major struggle with Arizona St, we don't trust Washington laying a big number with Jake Browning at QB. He's never looked the same since a shoulder injury at the end of 2016 and he doesn't have the weapons on the outside like he did with WR's Ross and Pettis. Meanwhile, we don't expect BYU to be intimidated here considering the Cougars already went into Madison and upset the Badgers this year. Slower pace game with a low total. It will be tough to get margin with an offense that hasn't topped 27 points vs any FBS foe this year. BYU is also on a 9-2 ATS run as a road dog.

**3★ FRESNO ST 38 Toledo 24.** Nice spot here for Fresno St who comes in off a bye. In their last game the Bulldogs crushed UCLA 38-14 and Fresno St is 12-3-2 ATS since head coach Jeff Tedford took over last year. Meanwhile the Rockets are off a misleading 63-44 win at Nevada last week as they were out-gained 582-460 and benefited from a blocked punt TD and a 98-yard kick return TD. Now they make a long road trip for the first time this season and are playing very late at night as the second half of this one will be played after midnight ET. Fresno rolls.

**Western Michigan 28 MIAMI, OH 27.** Last week, Miami (OH) led Bowling Green 31-3 late before there was a bunch of late-game scoring that put the game OVER the total (see bad beats on page 1). It was the first win of the season for the RedHawks. Meanwhile, the Broncos have now won back-to-back games after crushing Georgia St on the road. WMU had a 294-58 rush yard edge. The money is starting to come in on Western Michigan here and we agree as Sunday Night Owl customers got the Broncos at +2.5.

**Florida St 26 LOUISVILLE 23.** A match-up of two of the most disappointing teams in the country this season. Both teams have taken major steps back (see power ratings on the next page). However, Florida St did show some life offensively last week as QB Francois threw for 352 and the Seminoles players had a players-only meeting last week prior to their first cover of the season. The Cardinals are now 0-4 ATS after getting blown out by Virginia last week. Both QB's Pass and Cunningham are struggling. It was the first time in head coach Bobby Petrino's career (169 games) that his team didn't find the end zone. However, we can't trust the Noles laying a TD on the road here especially with Miami on deck. Lean Louisville.

**2★ UNDER 72 Ohio St 34 PENN ST 31.** We have an historic totals' line here. It's the highest line since 2003 for a Penn St game while it is the 3rd highest total for an Ohio St game in that same time frame! Obviously, it's a big game and every possession matters. We get it that this game features the two top scoring offenses in the country but both teams have above average defenses so therefore we don't understand the historic line. There was lots of late scoring for Penn St last week vs Illinois and lots of defensive scores for Ohio St vs TCU that is putting this totals' line too high in the market. As far as the side goes, the last two years the cumulative score is Penn St 62-60 but Ohio St is +383 yards! However, a "White Out" at night is one of the toughest settings in all of college football. We're passing on the side but we love the UNDER.

**Arkansas St 30 GEORGIA SOUTHERN 27.** Last week Arkansas St came away with a 7-point win over UNLV as the Red Wolves took advantage of 4 UNLV TO's. Meanwhile, Georgia Southern who is much improved this season is fresh off a bye. We're passing here.

**GEORGIA 41 Tennessee 10.** Usually we'd find value on Tennessee here. The Vols are coming off a 6 TO performance vs Florida that led to a misleading blowout loss while UGA had 2 non-offensive TD's in a 14-point win at Mizzou. However, Georgia head coach Kirby Smart seemed pretty upset after the win at Missouri last week and they are capable of putting the hammer down here vs a Tennessee team that sees their QB Jarrett Guarantano banged up (probable). We're passing.

**NEW MEXICO 35 Liberty 28.** New Mexico comes in fresh off a bye while Liberty is finding life difficult at the FBS level. After a blowout win over Old Dominion in the opener, they lost by double-digits at Army and last week were crushed at home by North Texas. New Mexico QB Tevika Tuioti is probable here. Long travel spot for Liberty but we don't see much value.

**AUBURN 42 Southern Miss 14.** Last week Auburn somehow got the cover over Arkansas as huge favorites despite gaining just 225 yards on offense. The Tigers benefited from a 96-yard kick return TD, a block punt and several other long returns to crush Arkansas. Meanwhile, Southern Miss handled Rice as QB Abraham was 25 of 34 for 428 yards with a 4-1 TD-to-INT ratio. We thought this number looked cheap but keep in mind Auburn is on a 5-16-1 ATS run as a home favorite since the middle of the 2014 season.

**TCU 33 Iowa St 20.** TCU head coach Gary Patterson is surprisingly just 2-10-1 ATS in his last 13 home favorite roles. The Horned Frogs are coming off back-to-back losses but both games were misleading and that is giving them some value. Last week TCU had 4 TO's vs Texas while the previous week they allowed a couple of defensive TD's. Meanwhile Iowa St was the only loser on these pages last week in their non-cover vs Akron. The Cyclones settled for 4 short FG's. We lean with the home team here.

**ALABAMA 58 UL-Lafayette 10.** Last week we thought the point spread premium would finally catch up to the Crimson Tide and Alabama indeed got back-doored vs Texas A&M as we cashed a 2★ on these pages. Still QB Tua Tagovailoa was magnificent throwing for 387 yards and both him and Alabama are runaway favorites in the Heisman and National Championship futures markets (Tua is -150 and Alabama is -225!!). On the other side, UL-Lafayette was outright upset vs Coastal Carolina. In the past, we'd be fading a conservative Alabama laying this huge number here, but this is the best Crimson Tide offense since arguably World War II. Pass.

**OKLAHOMA 45 Baylor 20.** We didn't downgrade Oklahoma much after their near upset loss to Army last week. It was kind of fluky why it was so close as the Sooners only ran 40 plays in 8 possessions, fewest for them in any game since 1960. Oklahoma averaged nearly 9 yards per play, while Army averaged 4.3. Army

converted 13 third downs and 4 fourth downs extending drives (had the ball for 45 minutes) while OU missed a FG and got stopped on downs at 1-yard line. Yes, we easily cashed on these pages last week with Baylor (led Kansas 23-0 at halftime). However, we were high on Baylor prior to the season and they've still disappointed us even at 3-1 SU. We lean with Oklahoma here.

**UTSA 27 UTEP 17.** UTEP is now on a 0-16 SU/3-12-1 ATS run dating back to last season. However, the Miners should have won last week vs New Mexico St. UTEP had 24-15 FD and 429-311 yard edges but the Aggies got a blocked punt return for a TD and a 55-yard fumble return TD. Meanwhile UTEP also fumbled at the New Mexico St 18-yard line. On the other side, UTSA got a key fumble return TD early in their non-covering win over Texas St. We're passing.

**Purdue 31 NEBRASKA 27.** Did the Huskers bottom out last week at Michigan? It certainly looked that way as they were out-rushed 285-39 and got a late score to prevent the final from looking even worse (lost 56-10). Nebraska is now 0-3 for the first time since 1945. Meanwhile, Purdue finally broke through and upset Boston College as they took advantage of four BC TO's. The Boilers had an impressive 379-229 yard edge. Still, we're not sure we want to lay points with a Purdue team that is 0-3 ATS as a road favorite the last 7 years.

**Texas 27 KANSAS ST 20.** After another blowout loss, this time at West Virginia, it's now safe to say this is one of the weaker Kansas St teams in recent years. However, this is a nice situational spot catching the Longhorns off big wins over USC and TCU and Texas has the Red River Rivalry on deck vs OU. Kansas St head coach Bill Snyder is 9-2 ATS in his last 11 meetings vs Texas and that's where our lean is.

**West Virginia 40 TEXAS TECH 37.** West Virginia has won 4 in a row in the series but last year's win was misleading as they outscored Texas Tech 29-0 to close out the game late. Both teams are off impressive blowout wins. The Mountaineers had 4 TO's and still crushed Kansas St 35-6 as QB Grier had 5 TD passes. On the other side, Texas Tech dominated Oklahoma St on the road as a 2-TD underdog as the Red Raiders piled up a 631-386 yard edge. Texas Tech also had 224 rushing yards while holding the ball for more than 41 minutes. West Virginia has blown out two run-heavy teams (Tennessee and Kansas St) but how will their defense hold up vs a pass happy Red Raiders' team? Still, they have a massive experience edge at QB in Grier vs a true frosh in Bowman. We're sitting on the sidelines here.

**NORTH TEXAS 35 Louisiana Tech 28.** We cashed with Louisiana Tech last week on these pages in their cover at LSU as they only trailed 24-21 late. Meanwhile, North Texas continues their hot start to the season as they are 4-0 after drilling Liberty. It's the best start for the Mean Green since 1966 when Mean Joe Green was actually playing for them. We don't see much value here.

**UAB 34 Charlotte 17.** UAB is coming off a bye as prior we cashed with them in their outright upset over Tulane. Meanwhile, Charlotte is off a blowout loss at UMass and is traveling again. We're passing.

**Oklahoma St 40 KANSAS 20.** We like the spot here for Oklahoma St after a crushing blowout loss to Texas Tech last week. The Pokes were outgained 621-386 and QB Cornelius was just 18 of 38. Meanwhile, we easily cashed going against Kansas on these pages as after back-to-back wins where they were +12 in TO's, they came back to earth last week as they trailed Baylor 23-0 at halftime. We did get in front of a line move here with our early bet.

**Marshall 31 WESTERN KENTUCKY 23.** Even though they are only 1-3 SU on the season, the Hilltoppers looked improved this year as they are 3-1 ATS and are fresh off a come-from-behind win at Ball St last week. Meanwhile, Marshall suffered their first loss of the season at home to NC State last week as they allowed 377 passing yards. Slight lean on the road team.

**MISSISSIPPI ST 31 Florida 23.** The Dan Mullen Bowl! Obviously the story here is the return of Florida head coach Mullen to Starkville after he was head coach from 2009-2017. Mullen knows the players strengths and weaknesses but the Bulldogs should have a chip on their shoulders. Mississippi St was dominated by Kentucky last week and while Florida is off back-to-back blowout wins, both were misleading as the Gators were +54 points in those two games but were only +64 yards as they benefited from +7 TO's.

Certainly not as bad as what Ole Miss vs Alabama was two weeks ago but it will be enough to get us a cover here.

**TROY 37 Coastal Carolina 23.** An important game in the Sun Belt already as both teams come in off three straight wins. The Chanticleers pulled another outright upset, this time at UL-Lafayette last week. Meanwhile Troy raved out to a 35-7 lead at ULM before holding on late. We think you can make long-term money with this Coastal Carolina team but this week isn't the best spot as their QB Anderson is doubtful. We do lean OVER here.

**Fau 34 MIDDLE TENNESSEE 31.** Nice spot here for Middle Tennessee coming off a bye taking on an FAU team that played an in-state for in UCF last week. The Owls have been really disappointing this season at 0-4 ATS but we don't think they're paying a point-spread tax like they were at the start of the season. Pass.

**Usc 31 ARIZONA 28.** We wonder how hot Clay Helton's seat would be in L.A. had the Trojans not rallied from a 30-17 deficit last week vs Washington St while blocking a game-tying FG on the final play. USC has routinely been a horrible road team under Helton at just 10-12 SU/6-16 ATS. They're taking on an Arizona team that played their best game of the season last week in a blowout win at Oregon St. RB JJ Taylor had 284 rush yards. Still the Trojans have the far superior athletes here. Pass.

**Boise St 33 WYOMING 16.** Both teams come in fresh off a bye here. Prior to the bye, Boise was done in by TO's in their blowout loss to Oklahoma St. The thoughts of playing in a "New Year's Six" bowl have to take a back-seat now to winning the Mountain West. Meanwhile, Wyoming has failed to cover in each of their last 3 games prior to the bye. Don't see a lot of value here but note Boise St is on a 37-17 ATS run as a road favorite the last 11 years.

**Hawaii 38 SAN JOSE ST 27.** There's a lot of excitement for Hawaii football this year as the Rainbow Warriors are off to a 4-1 start and have already topped their season win total. QB McDonald leads the nation in total pass yards (1,759). However, this is now their 6th straight game and they are taking on a San Jose St team fresh off a bye. In the last 8 seasons, Hawaii is 0-5 ATS as a road favorite failing to cover the line by a combined 69 points. We lean with the home underdog here who showed some life in a cover at Oregon.

**NOTRE DAME 30 Stanford 24.** Stanford has owned ND as of late going 7-2 SU the last 9 years and we think much more highly of Stanford head coach David Shaw than we do Brian Kelly. However, this is a bad spot for Stanford who is on back-to-back road trips off arguably the biggest misleading game of the season. At two different points in the Oregon game, the Cardinal had a 1% chance of beating Oregon. However, a long fumble return TD and a late Oregon fumble when running out the clock ignited their 17-point comeback. Meanwhile, there was a change at QB for ND last week at it was a major upgrade. Ian Book is a much better passer than Brandon Wimbush (25 of 34 for 325 yards) and is quicker with decision-making. The Irish offense which hadn't topped 24 points in any of the first three games scored 28 points in each half in the blowout win over Wake Forest.

**Michigan 30 NORTHWESTERN 17.** This is a nice spot for Northwestern who is off a bye and off a very misleading upset loss to Akron the week prior. In the last 10 years, Northwestern is on a 13-6 ATS run as a double-digit underdog are also 14-6 ATS the last 20 in any underdog role. However, the question we ask is who steps up at RB for Northwestern? Their leading rusher Jeremy Larkin just retired. Meanwhile, Michigan has looked mighty impressive. After falling behind Notre Dame 14-0 to start the season, the Wolverines have outscored their opponents 167-43. Obviously, we got in front of a line move here. Now we're passing.

The Bears do have a much improved defense this season as they haven't allowed a TD in the first half this season! That's not good news for a Ducks' team that could be feeling sorry for themselves early here. Finally Cal is on a 8-3 ATS run as an underdog under head coach Wilcox and we've cashed several times on them in that role.

They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 16 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **LSU -12**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

**L.A. RAMS 27 Minnesota 21.** Huge early season battle in the NFC. Obviously, the Vikings were a complete no-show last week vs the Bills not only losing outright as 16.5-point favorites but getting blasted. They were the first team in NFL history to lose by more than a TD laying that kind of number. Minnesota was coming off an OT game vs Green Bay and had this one on deck. The Rams meanwhile have separated themselves from the rest of the NFL as they are now clear favorites to win the Super Bowl. However, they will be without CB's Marcus Peters and Aquib Talib for the next few weeks. We're passing.

**Sunday, September 30th**

**3★ NEW ENGLAND 30 Miami 19.** My how the mighty have fallen. New England has now lost by double-digits in back-to-back games for the first time since 2002. Just last year, New England was laying 16.5-points at home to Miami. Now at 1-2, this almost becomes a must-win for them as they would be 3 games behind the Dolphins with a loss. Miami is 3-0 for the first time since 1998 but have benefited from an easy schedule playing the Titans, Jets and Raiders so far. Now they go to Foxboro where they have lost 9 straight (2-7 ATS) by an average of 18 ppg. The last 8 times New England was coming off back-to-back SU losses, they've gone 8-0 SU/7-1 ATS. We like the Pats to bounce back here.

**INDIANAPOLIS 26 Houston 23.** The Texans have now lost 9 straight games dating back to last season. Last week, they again won the stats (427-379 yard edge) but lost outright to the Giants at home. QB Watson looks like he is regressing and he is playing behind a bottom 5 offensive line. Meanwhile, the Colts nearly upset the Eagles on the road last week as they have impressed so far this season. We lean with the Colts here as right now the Texans can't be trusted.

**2★ Cincinnati (plus the points) ATLANTA 27 Cincinnati 26.** After a solid preseason and a 2-0 start to the season, last week Andy Dalton regressed throwing 4 interceptions in the loss to the Panthers. On the other side, the Falcons lost a shoot-out at home to the Saints. We like the Bengals here as the Falcons are dealing with cluster injuries on defense especially at safety. Meanwhile, it looks like AJ Green will be healthy here for Cincinnati. Note that Cincinnati is on a 7-3 ATS run while the Falcons have been inconsistent to say the least.

**GREEN BAY 28 Buffalo 16.** Obviously, we have Buffalo coming off the biggest upset in the NFL in two-plus decades. Last week rookie QB Allen was sensational in his debut with 3 total TD's. However, this doesn't look like a good spot for them on back-to-back road trips to the NFC North taking on a Green Bay team that just suffered an upset loss at Washington last week. Even if QB Aaron Rodgers isn't 100% here, we'd lean with the home team to get the bounce back win.

**DALLAS 21 Detroit 20.** Last week the Lions dominated the Patriots winning outright as TD-home underdogs (25-12 first down edge). One week after torching the Patriots, Bortles led a putrid Jags offense to just 232 total yards and 12 FD's in an upset loss to Tennessee last week. Meanwhile, the Jets blew a 14-0 lead in Cleveland last week as they had a key TO late in the third quarter that gave the Browns life. The Jags should bounce back here and the fact they lost outright to NYJ a year ago should get their attention.

**CHICAGO 24 Tampa Bay 20.** Last week the Bears came back from a 14-0 deficit to beat the lowly Cardinals (still didn't get the cover). The Bears pass rush already has 14 sacks and seven forced fumbles. Meanwhile, the Bucs had a disparate game vs the Steelers. After a horrendous first half that featured 3 "FitzTragic" interceptions, the Bucs trailed 30-10 at halftime. However, in the second half, it was back to "FitzMagic" as they nearly pulled off the monster comeback losing 30-27.

**Philadelphia 23 TENNESSEE 17.** Welcome back Carson Wentz for the Eagles who had a solid outing in his first start back from injury going 25 of 37 for 255 yards as Philly got the "W" but not the cover vs Indy. On the other side, Mariota (51 rush yards) came off the bench to lead the Titans' upset win over Jacksonville last week. That's back-to-back ugly wins for the Titans but they'll take it in division play. Note that new head coach had been familiar with those teams considering he was the D.C at Houston last year. We lean with the Eagles here.

**Seattle 21 ARIZONA 17.** Last week we cashed on these pages with the Seahawks as they got their first win of the season (were +3 in TO's) Still Seattle is dealing with protection issues (allowing 14 sacks already). Meanwhile the Cardinals blew a 14-0 lead vs Chicago and will go with rookie Josh Rosen here. We're passing.

**2★ OAKLAND 24 Cleveland 17.** While the Raiders are off to a 0-3 start, they have held the lead in the second half of every game so far this season. They haven't been in great spots considering they played the best team in the league in the Rams, played Denver in altitude where the Broncos are nearly unbeatable early in the season and then had the long trip to Miami where they wilted in the humidity. This feels like a home run spot for them to get their first win. They're taking on a Cleveland team that is feeling really good about themselves after the comeback win vs the Jets last week. Baker Mayfield will get his first start after going 17 of 23 for 201 yards last week in the Browns first win in 635 days. We like the Raiders here.

**L.A. CHARGERS 27 San Francisco 17.** Obviously, the 49ers season has officially gone down the tubes with the loss of QB Garoppolo to an ACL injury. San Francisco had a lot of preseason optimism but are already 0-3 ATS and now turn to C.J. Beathard. On the flip side, the Chargers are 1-2 but the two losses have been arguably to the two best teams in the league right now in the Chiefs and Rams. However, tough trusting the Chargers in this double-digit favorite role with a defense that has been consistently gashed this season. We're passing.

**New Orleans 26 N.Y. GIANTS 24.** The Giants had a solid game at Houston last week pulling off the outright upset. QB Manning was 25 of 29 for 297 yards while WR Beckham had 109 receiving yards and rookie RB Barkley had 82 rushing yards. Meanwhile, New Orleans won a shoot-out at Atlanta with QB Brees going for 396 yards. We'll take the hook here with the G-Men.

**PITTSBURGH 27 Baltimore 26.** This has been an evenly matched series as of late as the last 26 meetings have seen the teams split out 13-13 with a 12-12-2 ATS mark. Last week we cashed on these pages with Baltimore in their 27-14 win over Denver. Meanwhile the Steelers got a much-needed win on MNF beating the Bucs 30-27 but the Steelers were +3 in TO's and are on pace to set the NFL record for total penalties. Their defense has struggled big time (allowing 29 ppg) dating back to last season when they lost LB Shazier. We lean with the Ravens.

**Monday, October 1st**

**Kansas City 30 DENVER 27.** The Chiefs have been mighty impressive so far this season thanks to their new starting QB Mahomes who now has an incredible 13-0 TD-to-INT ratio (best start to a season in NFL history). How long is that sustainable especially on the division road on a prime time game? He better sustain it as the Chiefs have the worst defense in the league allowing 474 ypg. Last week we cashed against the Broncos in their 27-14 loss at Baltimore. We lean with the home dog here but have been burnt each of the last two weeks fading the Chiefs. Also note that Andy Reid and the Chiefs are on a 5-0 SU/ATS run in the series. Finally Denver has been a home dog to the Chiefs just twice since 1980. They won both of those games outright.
