PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As I sit here writing this month's message, I'm mentally rehearsing the budget submission presentation that I have to do at tonight's (April 27) open board meeting. While I'm no stranger to speaking at board meetings this presentation feels different. I can feel the trust that all of you have placed in me to convey our needs and wants to the board. Thank you to all who completed our budget survey earlier this month. This survey was the basis for our submission and includes recommendations for the purchase of more student devices and textbooks, keeping our daytime custodians, the hiring of more teachers, including LSTs, counsellors, and classroom teachers, and creating a plan at NWSS for everyone to have a sense of privacy, whether in classrooms or offices. I will also be advocating for the district to think about what our mentorship program will look like after the funds we received from our last round of contract negotiations run out.

Since Spring Break, I've been contacted by many members concerned about COVID-19 vaccinations and when it will be our turn. The superintendent and I discuss the situation several times a week. CUPE 409 President, Marcel Marsolais and I sent almost identical letters to senior administration and the school board asking for vaccination clinics to be set up within our district so our members could be easily vaccinated when our time comes. Friday, April 23, along with other local presidents had a meeting with Dr. Ariella Zbar of Fraser Health and we discussed the vaccination rollout and the frustration that our members are feeling about waiting for our turn. Dr. Zbar wanted to reassure us that our time will come. The procedure is that they vaccinate one district and then move to the next most urgent district, based on community hotspots. These hotspots may change from week to week, or even day to day, so unfortunately, no timeline can be given. I know that it is frustrating, but please know that I am confident that the school district is doing everything they can to get us vaccinated.

Spring staffing begins the week of May 17, so please keep an eye out for the postings that will begin to come out. I will have our office manager email the postings to everyone on our email list every time I receive them. You can also check on the Atrieev system to see what positions are posted. There should be 4 rounds of postings before June 30 and then hiring will halt until the middle of August.

Lastly, a reminder that our NWTU elections take place next week. On May 4, there will be a special nominations meeting via Zoom. Candidates should email their completed CV to nwtuadmin@telus.net by noon on May 4. Candidates can also run from the floor at this meeting. Any uncontested positions will be acclaimed. If there are contested positions, the election will take place online through the Simply Voting platform on May 6. Please make certain that your email address on the BCTF portal is up to date as this is the database the BCTF and Simply Voting will use to email out your voting link.

As always, I would like to end this message with a big thank you for all that you do to make our schools a safe, kind, and caring place for the students of my adopted home time.

Step 2: Nominations Meeting - Tuesday, May 4 via Zoom

- Please see link sent to personal email on April 27.
- At this meeting members will also be able to nominate themselves from the "floor" to run for the election of any of the table-officer positions.
- Positions with multiple nominees will have the opportunity to speak to the floor.
- · Positions that are uncontested will be acclaimed by the nominee.

Step 3: General Elections - Thursday, May 6 via Simply Voting

- Contested positions from the Nominations Meeting will be voted on.
- Links to voting will be shared by the BCTF on behalf of the NWTU and Simply Voting
