

SlabIf you like clean lines, a slab door may be the choice for you.
A flat door that essentially looks like a slab of wood.



Raised Panel A panel, usually made by joining pieces of solid stock lumber with adhesive, is secured to the door's frame. Raised panels generally measure between 1/2" and 3/4" thick. A routed edge profile tends to give the door a more elegant appearance.



Recessed Panel The recessed panel door is a flat panel affixed inside a frame constructed with miter or mortise and tenon joints. The resulting appearance has a picture frame-type look and a simpler, more country or transitional appearance.



Curved Panel The top portion of this door's decorative panel curves upward in a gentle arch. The panel itself is generally raised.



Cathedral Panel

A cathedral-type arch is incorporated into the upper rail of this raised or recessed panel.



Beadboard Panel Typically found in a recessed panel, beadboard uses routed beaded details to create a casual country style.
