ATTENTION!

Just in case you haven't heard this information elsewhere...

Anyone with a smartphone with a bar code scanning application (free) can scan any Department of Veterans Affairs identification card issued since 2004 and the cardholder's Social Security number (and other information) immediately pops up on the screen. The Department of Veterans Affairs published warnings about the veterans information cards on their website in 2011 and again in July 2013. The VA has begun to work on a new type of card, which will not contain a Social Security number. Meanwhile, veterans should treat their current ID cards just as carefully as they do their Social Security card (or their credit cards) to prevent identity theft.

Service Officer Report: Don't forget to get your Annual Renewal Benefit form 10-10ERZ in to keep your VA benefits.

The VA is implementing a comprehensive national VA Dental Insurance Program (VADIP) to give enrolled Veterans and CHAMPVA (VA's Civilian Health and Medical Program) beneficiaries the opportunity to purchase dental insurance through Delta Dental and MetLife at a reduced cost. One of our members has already purchased this plan and reports that he now pays approx. 50% of what he used to pay for dental *insurance!* Participation is voluntary. Purchasing a dental plan does not affect Veterans' eligibility for VA dental services and treatment. VADIP opened November 15 for the purchasing of plans, with coverage beginning January 1, 2014. Covered services include diagnostic, preventative, surgical, emergency and endodontic/ restorative treatment. Delta Dental and MetLife are offering multiple plans. Each participant pays the fixed monthly premiums for coverage and any copayments required, depending on the type of plan selected.

Dependents of Veterans, except those eligible under CHAMPVA, are not authorized to participate in VADIP. Those individuals may be eligible for separate dental insurance coverage offered by these carriers. Are you eligible? Eligible VADIP beneficiaries include: Any Veteran enrolled in VA healthcare, and any individual enrolled in CHAMPVA. Dependents who do not qualify as a CHAMPVA beneficiary are not eligible.

Searching for the Names of Surviving Michigan WWII Veterans

June 6, 2014 marks the 70th anniversary of D-Day, when 73,000 American troops joined Allied forces in the largest amphibious invasion in world history, leading to a decisive Allied victory marking the beginning of the end of WWII in Europe. The Lakeshore Lancers Marching Band of Stevensville, MI has been invited to join as an official representative of Michigan in Normandy, France, in June of 2014. The kids will be a part of the commemoration activities including a performance at the American Cemetery of Omaha Beach. The band will be one of only 3 American Bands going to Normandy and the only one from Michigan. During their performances the students want to wear a ribbon in honor of each of the last surviving WWII veterans of Michigan. Upon their return to the US, these epaulets will be mailed back to the veterans as a mark of gratitude and appreciation. We need your help in identifying these Michigan veterans of WWII. January is National Blood Donor Month

and Legionnaires everywhere are encouraged to give blood and host blood drives at Posts as part of the American Legion Blood Donor Program - a program that has existed since 1946 to help a life-saving cause that becomes even more important during the harsh winter months.



Posts and Departments that donate the most blood are honored at the National Convention in August each year. Departments are recognized in two areas: for Post participation and individual Legionnaire participation. The National Commander presents both awards at the National Convention. Winning Departments receive certificates signed by the National Commander and National Adjutant. If you decide to donate blood at a blood drive or anywhere during this coming year, please inform our Commander or Adjutant so that your donation can be included in our Consolidated Post Report and we can receive credit for our Post and Department.

Things to remember when a veteran dies

We know how hard it is to remember everything you need to take care of when a loved one passes away, so here is a list that may be of great help to you and your family when the inevitable happens.

1) Contact the funeral director of your choice to arrange for internment. Internment at the National Cemetery is free to the veteran and spouse.

2) Contact the pastor of your choice to arrange for the services you desire.

3) Bring the funeral director a copy of the veteran's DD-214, Discharge Separation Notice, Veterans Administration claim number (if there is one), Social Security Number and life insurance policy.

4) The funeral director will apply for the amount allowable from the VA toward burial expenses and also the allowance from Social Security for burial. Some counties also provide a burial expense for veterans.

5) The funeral director can also apply for a flag to drape the casket.

6) If the veteran is a member of a veterans organization (like the American Legion), the commander should be contacted for a ritual service, honor guard, casket bearers, etc. if needed and/or desired.

7) If the veteran had G (Government) insurance, contact the County Veterans Service Officer (or veteran's organization Service Officer) for assistance in completing the forms. If it is commercial insurance, contact the agent of that company.

8) Spouse should contact the local Social Security Office to file for benefits that may be available for self and for the children of the veteran.

9) Obtain from the funeral director several extra copies of the veteran's death certificate for transfer of titles of ownership for autos, home, bank accounts, etc.

10) The County Veterans Service Officer (or veteran's organization Service Officer) will assist the spouse and children in obtaining any benefits to which they may be entitled such as, survivors death benefits from the VA and headstone if the burial is in a private cemetery. Bring to the Service Officer the following information when applying for benefits:

a) Copy of the deceased veterans service record (DD-214).

b) Copy of Honorable Discharge Certificate.

c) Social Security numbers of the deceased veteran, spouse, and any dependent children.

d) G.I. insurance policies, if any.

e) Information as to marriage, birth certificates of children, and if any prior marriages existed, the information regarding when, where and how the marriage was dissolved (death or divorce).

f) VA claim number, if there is one.

g) Copy of death certificate of veteran.

Veterans - The smart thing to do is to compile as much of this information as possible in advance. Put two copies in safe places and advise your family as to their locations. If you keep one copy in a safe deposit box, keep the other at home (very few people pass away during banker's hours). Please keep a copy of this list for your records.



To safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; To consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness.



FREEDOM FROM FEAR
