Responsive Reading

April 7, 2019, 2 Corinthians 5:14-21, "One Died for All"

Lead: For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

Cong: So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer.

Lead: Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

Cong: All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation.

Lead: We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

Together: God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

April 14, 2019, Romans 5:1-8, 11, "Justified Through Faith"

Lead: Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand.

Cong: And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope.

Lead: And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

Cong: You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die.

Lead: But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Together: Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.



Responsive Reading

April 21, 2019, Matthew 28:1-10, "Jesus Has Risen"

Lead: Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.

Cong: And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men.

Lead: But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

Cong: Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him.

Lead: See, I have told you." So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him.

Together: Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

April 28, 2019, Luke 24:36-45, "Peace Be With You"

Lead: While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

Cong: He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds?

Lead: Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

Cong: When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?"

Lead: They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence. He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Together: Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.
