


Hymnals/Missals are back in the pews

overall. We are still continuing all other safety protocols at this time, which includes the light midst disinfectant over all pews twice every weekend. This means we will not be printing the readings within the bulletin itself because the Sunday readings can be found in the black Saint Augustine Hymnal in the pews. If you want to use the hymnals but feel a little unsafe, we encourage you to either use the hand sanitizer at the entrance to the church or feel free to bring your own and use before and after using the hymnal. Also, our volunteer musicians will not be required to use songs from those hymnals at this time, so some songs may be found in the hymnals but others may not be, and that is ok! We are very thankful for all our volunteer musicians, and we will continue to try our best to praise God through our words, actions, and prayers at each Mass as is possible.
