Book Report Activities

After reading, *choose one* of the following activities to complete for one book and turn in on the first day of school.

1. Grab Bag Book Report:

Choose six items that represent your story: 1 object to represent the setting, 2 objects to represent the main character/characters, 2 objects to represent the plot of the story, and 1 object to represent the conflict of the story. Place all six items in a paper bag of your choice. Write at least 3 sentences about each object and how it relates to the story. You will write your sentences on index cards. Make sure to label each card for what part of the story it represents. Label your bag with the title and author/illustrator of your book. Draw an illustration on the outside of your bag that represents your book. Present a 5-7 minute book talk to the class explaining your items.

2. Movie Poster Book Report:

After reading your book, pretend it has been made into a movie. Create a poster advertising your movie. Be sure to include the setting and main characters. All movie posters must be on a large poster board. The title of the novel must be in large writing and should stand out on your poster. Your name will appear on the poster as either the director or producer. The main characters of the novel will be the cast in your movie. A major illustration or collage should be the focus of your poster. It should give the audience a good idea of the theme of the novel.

3. Book Trailer or PowerPoint/Keynote Presentation:

A book trailer is a short video created by students to highlight the key points of a book. When creating their book trailers, students should be trying to "sell" viewers on their book. Students also have the option of creating a PowerPoint presentation highlighting the key points of their book. PowerPoint presentation slides must include the setting, plot, main characters, key events, and personal opinions. There is no specific length for the book trailer or the PowerPoint presentation. The objective is to have fun and be creative. All work must be saved on a USB drive and brought to class the first day of school.
