# Discussion and Planning of Event 2025 Details

Rusty: We have 86 vendors, 3 more than last year. We did sell out of booths with a total of 103. We have 17 Direct Sales, 18 information only & 46 Arts & crafts, 7 permitted food by Health Dept., 6 non-permitted food by Agriculture Dept.

Port a johns, water holding tank and golf carts will be delivered Friday.

Ken our electrician, will make sure all the vendors have power that paid for it.

Deborah: Make sure the home school art has index card with name, grade, teacher and school. That is required for all entrees.

#### 9/8/25

Rusty: We have 62 vendors so far. 4 ahead of last year. We did sell out of booths the last 2 years. We have 11 Direct Sales, 8 information only & 33 Arts & crafts.

I ordered the prize ribbons and 10 cases of water.

Randy said the signs & banners are in the Blue Roof House.

Peggy: Can we add the baking contest info to the town website?

Scott: No.

Deborah: Gospel Light is participating in the Art Contest again this year. That makes 5 schools.

Scott: Jason & Ryan will be security again this year.

Rusty, remember to order inflatable from Jumpin' Kids for the cruise in.

Peggy: Order flowers & pumpkins to decorate the stage.

#### 8/11/25

Caroline: Mr. & Mrs. Tim Anderson have volunteered to help at the festival.

Doc: Welcome and thank you for your offer to help.

What have you got for us today Rusty?

Rusty: We have 53 vendors which is 7 ahead of last year. 28 Arts & Crafts, 6 information only, 6 permitted food by Health Dept., 4 non-permitted food by Agriculture Dept. and 11 Direct Sales. I'll get the baking contest forms to Scott to put on town website.

#### Cruise-in

- Friday, Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> from 6 to 8
- In the parking lot at the Community Bldg.
- Jumpin' Kids inflatables
- Scott will play beach music

#### Outdoor generator

- Much quieter now
- Sunbelt rents them for \$955 per day, however they are closed on weekends so it would be cheaper to rent by the week \$2385
- Pickup Thursday and take back on Monday
- 1400 amp generator \$30k \$40k

Doc: Rusty, remember to order more bottled water.

#### 7/14/25

Doc: Rusty, what is happening with vendor signups?

Rusty: We have a total of 39 vendors so far. Slightly ahead of last year's May numbers.

19 Arts & Crafts, 5 Information – No Sales, 7 Direct Sales, 4 Food Permitted by the Health Department and 4 Non-Permitted Food by Agriculture Department.

Peggy: Who are the food vendors?

Rusty 4 Food Permitted by the Health Department: Civic Club, WAGS, Watch Dawg Catering Wagon, Delicias Xpress

4 Non-Permitted Food by Agriculture Department: Lemonade, soda & mini-pancakes, BSA – popcorn & peanut products, VIVARTI Coffee – pastries, "Oh My Cookies".

Peggy: They are all sweets.

Scott: We discussed having a car show at the Community Meeting Space maybe on Friday.

- Friday Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> 6pm 9 pm
- Little Doughnuts will come
- Get a bounce house
- Get a food truck
- Play beach music

Doc: Pilot Mountain has a car show the first Saturday of the month. They have over 100 cars.

Scott: Kernersville has a car museum. On the second Saturday of the month, the Old Salem Chapter of the Antique Auto Club of America.

Peggy: Contact local businesses.

Doc: Ryan Westmoreland and Gene Lawson might be interested in coming.

Scott: For power we might consider renting a diesel generator on a trailer. Kernersville uses them. They aren't as loud as they use to be. We might want to go to Sunbelt and listen to one run before we commit.

#### 5/12/25

Doc: It looks like it is just us today. Rusty, what have you got to tell us?

Rusty: We have 18 vendors so far. We do have one food truck coming, Delicias Xppress.

Walgreens is a new vendor for this year. They will be giving flu shots and blood pressure testing. The blacksmith will be coming back.

We have "Legacy Motown Review" returning and a new band that Wesley found, "None of the Above".

"Legacy Motown Review" - \$4400

"None of the Above". - \$1300

I talked with Brinkley amusements about ride rentals. \$3K - \$8K per day. They don't rent

rides in October because all employees are working at the State and Classic fairs.

Scott: The High School for a fund raiser, could use their parking lot and shuttle people to the pavilion.

Wesley: What about having a "cruise-in" with classic cars?

Doc: Or jeeps. They have their own cruse-in's.

Wesley: Maybe Ron at Extreme Fitness would let us have 10 spots.

Scott: We could pay someone to stay in his lot to keep out others looking to park there. That would save him from paying a lot attendant which he did last year.

Wesley: I'll head this up and pass out applications.

#### 4/14/25

Rusty: Doc is not feeling well and Randy is coaching a softball game today.

Scott: Church's Daycare has offered to help with this years' festival.

Rusty: The Classic Fair dates this year, October 3<sup>rd</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>. The next Saturday is October 18<sup>th</sup>, the third Saturday in October.

\*The festival committee agrees to hold the 2025 Fall Festival on October  $18^{th}$  from 10am - 5:00 pm

Rusty: The "Motown Legacy Review" is already saving that date for us. Many of you have suggested we get a different band to open this year. I'm already searching.

- First 6 food trucks get free space (not food tents or food trailer's) Contact Little League about being a food vendor
- Contact Brinkley Entertainment about rides at the new Community Meeting space Rides in the grass and food in the parking lot Merry go round, slide, carousel add deputy,
  - Talk to school about parking for event as a fund raiser. Maybe \$1 \$2
- Check with fire dept. about bringing the smoke trailer and blood pressure tent

Deborah: If we do something at the new meeting space, maybe we should move the art & baking contest back to the Booe House.

Will we keep the art prizes the same? YES
