Ordinance O-2014-24

AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING MICHAEL J. MATULEWICZ AS A FULL-TIME POLICE OFFICER FOR AMELIA VILLAGE FOR A PROBATIONARY PERIOD AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Mayor of Amelia Village after conferring with the Police Chief, has recommended the appointment of Michael J. Matulewicz as a full-time police officer for Amelia Village, and;

WHEREAS, The Council of Amelia Village concurs in the appointment of Michael J. Matulewicz as a full-time Amelia police officer.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that;

SECTION I. Michael J. Matulewicz is hereby employed as a full-time police officer of Amelia Village, effective May 13, 2014 at a starting salary of \$15.78 per hour.

SECTION II. This appointment is contingent upon Mr. Matulewicz successfully passing pre-employment medical and/or psychological examinations and drug screening to ensure that Mr. Matulewicz is physically and mentally able to perform the duties of a full time police officer and as required by the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund.

SECTION III. In the event that Mr. Matulewicz does not successfully complete the required medical examination, he may continue to work as a part-time police officer at his current rate of pay.

SECTION IV. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 737.17, Mr. Matulewicz shall serve a probationary period of six months; at the end of the probationary period, the Mayor with the concurrence of Village Council shall remove him from the position or appoint him as a permanent police officer.

SECTION V. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION VI. This ordinance is hereby declared an emergency which is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare. The reason for such necessity is that the Police Department of Amelia Village has recently lost several police officers and this appointment will allow the Village to provide the necessary police protection to the citizens of the Village.

MRS. GERBER moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on three separate dates.
