PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year! Looking back at 2017, our neighbourhood had a wild and busy year, with some tremendous wins for Sherway.

Our largest success this year was seeing the proposed stormwater management pond for Brentano field be officially moved into the new Dixie/QEW interchange, and completely outside of Sherway's boundaries. This change in Dixie/QEW project design protects our property values, keeps the pond away from our homes and children, and was the result of much advocating by SHORA VP Jamie Pugh, Charles Sousa MPP & Councillor Jim Tovey.

Another great win for Sherway are the developments with Pearson Airport, the Greater Toronto Airport Authority, and their decision on noise sharing, which would put far more air traffic over our heads on weekends and nights. The decision made, after much public consultation, was to not implement any new noise sharing measures, which will continue to keep air traffic over Sherway at about 6% of their yearly volume.

Sherway had success inside our borders in 2017, with a brand new Laughton Heights Park playground, new fitness area, new pavement for the paths, more benches, new larger park trees put in by the city and a successful tree planting done by neighbourhood volunteers. Add in the natural skating rink, and I think we can all agree that the park is an absolute jewel in the middle of our neighbourhood!

Most recently, we just finished Deck The Streets 2017, our holiday lights contest. We had over 135 homes take part this year, with really fantastic prizes and 7 winners. DIXIE / QEW INTERCHANGE UPDATE

Storm Water Pond Relocation

In Summer 2016, our community found out that, due to the Dixie Interchange project, a storm water pond was slated for the Brentano Rd. land near the exit. The purpose of the pond is to collect all of the road waste water for the new QEW Dixie interchange. A community meeting held on June 15th, 2016 discussed the issues surrounding the pond where many Sherway residents voiced concerns about this type of pond, that is typically found in non-populated areas, underground, and not in plain view. The concerns from our neighbourhood include the size, proximity to homes, environmental safety, potential contaminants, cost of cleaning, and the impact on home values.

We are so pleased to say that through our community meeting and support through S.H.O.R.A. we have convinced MTO to relocate the stormwater management pond from the Sherway community to the QEW Dixie Road interchange loop (cloverleaf). MTO reports that the relocation of the pond is meeting MOECC requirements and does not impact any additional properties or back onto residential homes. They will ensure that its design will include all standard safety and maintenance requirements.

Public Information Centre Meeting - December 18th

The Ministry of Transportation (MTO) held a Public Information Center (PIC) on December 18th at Le Tréport Convention Centre. PIC participants included MTO and their third party consultants, Minister Sousa, Councillor Tovey, SHORA representatives and local residents.

The PIC provided the public the opportunity to discuss and ask questions about the project. The initial concerns that our residents raised were detailed in the following letter to MTO from SHORA's president on December 20th. Updates will be provided when we receive a response and more information.

I am writing to you today as President of the Sherway Homeowner's and Recreation Association (SHORA), which is comprised of 600 homes, over 2000 residents and located within your project boundaries for the proposed Queen Elizabeth Way Improvements. A significant amount of our membership has been in touch with our association regarding the Detail Design Phase of this QEW Project, and from our engagement with them, we have only 3 concerns that I believe your project team will be able to remedy. These same concerns were also openly voiced and recorded at the Public Information Centre on December 18th to your team by myself and Jamie Pugh, Vice President of SHORA, and we found all parties to be very understanding about our concerns below, and agreeable on the solutions proposed.

Our concerns are as follows:

- 1. Sherway experiences a large amount of car traffic entering our neighbourhood attempting to reach Sherway Gardens Mall in spite of existing signage. The new Dixie interchange will dramatically increase the volume of traffic on Dixie road, and this will in turn further increase the amount of "lost cars" entering Sherway, driving East to the Sherway Drive dead-end, and turning around as they currently do. We would like MTO to create hardscaping & landscaping that will make it abundantly clear that our neighbourhood is residential only. See attached photo, for an idea of what we mean. This photo is an example only.
- 2. This project is removing 1 of Sherway's only 3 exits, and this will increase the volume of traffic exiting on Sherway Drive and Venta Ave. We ask that MTO in tandem with the region, review the traffic light timing and configuration on both remaining Sherway exits to ensure the increased volume of residents at each intersection can exit the neighbourhood without delay.
- 3. The cul-de-sac at the Eastern most dead-end of Brentano Blvd has been reduced in size, and we have been informed by your project team that the proposed turning radius has been approved municipally. Our concern is the newly created close proximity of this cul-de-sac to the neighbouring properties on the West side. We feel that this cul-de-sac should be redesigned at the dead end, in a way that makes the proposed cul-de-sac pavement no closer than it is currently to 1668 Brentano Blvd, while maintaining the space required for the future maintenance requirements and municipal needs.

Thank you for the opportunity to voice our concerns and requests. Our association has diligently worked together with the Ministry of Transportation, MMM Group and all levels of government through the Preliminary Design Phase of this project. We look forward to continued dialogue and joint efforts in resolving these three items. I look forward to your response. Happy Holidays,

PEARSON AIRPORT UPDATE

The CENAC (Community Environment & Noise Advisory Committee) held a public meeting Dec. 6th. With the airport set to expand and increase the number of flights overhead, noise mitigation has been a hot button topic amongst several communities. A five year plan called "Growing Responsibly" was presented and is available online which outlines commitments related to the responsibilities of the GTAA over noise management.

Of note, the committee has recommended that Noise Sharing (which would have affected our neighbourhood on weekends) will NOT happen. This is good news for our community.

Also, no new runways are scheduled to be built. The expansion can occur using the existing key East/West runways. The North-South runways will only be used as needed.

Again, this is good news for our community.

SHERWAY TRAIL & RESTORATION PROJECT

SHORA has been in regular contact with the Toronto Regional Conservation Authority (TRCA) regarding their planned Sherway Trail Extension.

The trail currently dead-ends in Etobicoke Valley Park (Alderwood), just south of the QEW bridge at the Etobicoke Creek, and will follow the Etobicoke Creek North, connecting up to Middle road Bridge.

Vince D'Elia, project manager for the Etobicoke Creek Watershed at the TRCA is overseeing this trail project. On his most recent update to SHORA in December 2017, he advised that "as long as the weather conditions remain manageable, we are hoping to construct the pedestrian bridge and approaches in December and January and then complete trail construction (paved trail) in early Spring 2018."

This is good for Sherway, as when this is all completed, our neighbourhood will be able to access the entire Etobicoke Creek Trail, right down to Marie Curtis Park & Lake Ontario, without having to leave the trail.

ENVIRONMENTAL UPDATE

Wood Clean Up

Sherway homeowners had the opportunity to control pests in our neighbourhood with the "Wood Cleanup" September 2017 weekend event. Residents disposed wood from their properties into dumpster bins provided by SHORA in cooperation with the Region of Peel. This project was a huge success with four dumpsters of wood being filled and transported from our neighbourhood!

Illegal Dumping

Residents are always encouraged to keep our neighbourhood clean from littering as well which includes not dumping in open spaces. Please report any illegal dumping to (905) 791- 9499.

Air Quality

Air quality also continues to be an important issue with Sherway's close proximity to the QEW and local industries. Please continue to report odour complaints to the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change's (MOECC) Spills Action Centre (SAC): 1-800-268-6060. SAC operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week and will take odour complaints after-hours (after 5 pm on weekdays and all hours on weekends). Coyotes

Enjoying our neighbourhood also may result in encounters with local wildlife such as coyotes. Always ensure pets are controlled and report any aggressive, sick, or injured coyotes to the City of Mississauga's Animal Services at (905) 896-5858.

While you can register your child at any point between now and September, there are advantages to registering early.

By registering now, you are able to ensure that you are fully in the know throughout the coming months leading up to your child's start date in September. Many schools have "Intro to Kindergarten" nights/events in the spring and summer months that you will only know about if you have registered. Additionally, did you know that many schools receive their funding for students based on registration projections that are made in January/February? By registering early, you're helping to ensure that your child's school receives the funding it deserves, thus helping your child receive as many resources as possible.
