Eleanora E. Tate is the author of eleven published books for children and young adults, including her award winning "The Secret of Gumbo Grove"; "Thank You, Dr. Martin Luther King,

Jr.!"; "Front Porch Stories at the One Room School"; "Celeste's Harlem Renaissance"; and "Just an Overnight Guest", which was adapted

into a television movie. She also wrote "The Minstrel's Melody", in the American Girl History

Mysteries series.

A former professor of children's literature at North

Carolina Central University, Durham, and a former instructor with the Institute of Children's Literature, West Redding, CT, she was on the faculty of Hamline University's MFA program "Writing for Children and Young Adults" at St. Paul, MN from 2009 to 2014.

For the past five years Ms. Tate has been one of the strongest supporters of St. Paul AME's YES Arts Program and instrumental in its participation in the N. C. Museum of History's annual African American Cultural Celebration (AACC), of which she has been a member of its planning committee and serves as a cohost of its Literature and Spoken Word festivities.

Ms. Tate is a Zora Neale Hurston Award recipient, the

highest award given by the National Association of Black Storytellers, Inc., of which she is a former national president. In 1990 the South Carolina State Senate and House honored her for her literary and community activism. She loves to relax by gardening, going to movies and festivals, and she loves the Lord and her church.



Featured Recipe from Heavenly Delights by St. Paul AME Church, Raleigh NC



Taco Salad pg. 17



Brown 1 pound of hamburger with 1 small (chopped) onion. (I usually add a little taco seasoning to the meat.) When browned, drain and let cool while getting the rest of ingredients ready.

- 1 ½ head lettuce, break in small pieces.
- 2 tomatoes, chopped 1 can ripe olives, chopped
- 1 can red kidney beans, drained
- 1 green pepper, sliced or diced, to your preference.
- 1 pkg Doritos taco chips, crushed Catalina salad dressing

Combine hamburger and other ingredients together but hold off on the Catalina dressing until a few minutes before serving, so chips don't get soggy. Happy eating!
