The Evelyn Kalbhin Outstanding Educator Award recognizes an SSM teacher that exemplifies Evelyn Kalbhin's commitment to Catholic education.

Nominees for The Evelyn Kalbhin Outstanding Educator Award Must:

- Be currently employed as a teacher at St. Stephen Martyr Catholic School, with a **minimum of 3 years** of service.
- Be Catholic and an outstanding role model.
- Hold current Kentucky teacher certification.
- Have a positive influence in the lives of students.
- Encourage faith development of students, along with their physical, mental and emotional advancement.
- Have demonstrated record of ongoing professional development.
- Be actively involved in the parish, school and Louisville community.

Nominations are available on the St. Stephen Martyr Parish website, in the parish office or school office. Completed forms may be submitted at any time and must be received by November 2, 2018 for consideration for the 2019 Cards Hall of Fame. Nominations can be submitted by current SSM parishioners, faculty, parents, and alumni.

The Evelyn Kalbhin Outstanding Educator recipient will be selected from a committee that includes St. Stephen Martyr pastor Father Harry Gelthaus, SSM principal Bridget Britt, a current SSM teacher, a Parish Council member, a SAC member and Cards Hall of Fame Event Chair. The recipient of the award **MUST** be able to attend the Cards Hall of Fame event on Saturday, April 27, 2019.
