**Work Environment:** With more and more workers taking up remote positions, we are seeing even a larger demand for live/work-space renovations. The focus being on creating functional spaces that can double for both live/work purposes. New designs for built-in furniture that can be hidden away or used for work and storage. # A Recipe for You!



### **Thai Coconut Curry Shrimp Noodle Soup**

This is easy, delicious and tastes amazing! Great comfort food!

#### Ingredients:

2 tbs butter 1 lb. jumbo shrimp, peeled and deveined 1/2 large sweet onion 1 clove minced garlic 1 inch finely chopped ginger 1 diced red bell pepper 1 tbs lime juice 1 tbs red curry paste 2—13oz can unsweetened coconut milk 4 C chicken broth 2 tsp fish sauce / 1 tsp soy sauce 2 lemongrass sticks 4 stems cilantro 4 Japanese dried chili pods 4-6 oz rice noodles

# **Creating Bathroom Oasis**

Instructions:

- In a large stock pot, on medium heat melt butter, ad onion and bell pepper and sauté until translucent.
- 1. Turn up heat and add garlic and ginger for 1 minute then add shrimp and sauté for 3 minutes.
- Add curry and chili paste, give it a stir then add lime juice, fish sauce, soy sauce and chicken stock. Cook for 1 minute stirring frequently.
- Whisk in coconut milk. Add cilantro, and lemon grass. For added heat you can add 4 dried chili pods. Bring to a boil then reduce to simmer for 8-10 minutes.
- Remove lemongrass sticks, cilantro and chili pods.
  Add rice noodles and simmer for 5-6 minutes.

### Should You Refurbish Your Kitchen Cabinets, or Replace Them? By L. Phillips / Home Organizing

# Deciding between refinishing/refurbishing and replacing kitchen cabinets is a big and costly decision, so we turned to a design expert to help make the choice easier.

Kitchen cabinets have a lot of requirements to meet. They need to be sturdy with ample storage to hold dishes without having the shelving sag, they need to be securely attached to the walls, they need to withstand food splatters, spills, dings, and scratches from heavy kitchen traffic. The doors need to line up and the drawers need to slide easily. They need to be easy to clean and maintain. Easy enough, right? You wish. Finding kitchen cabinets that fulfill all these requirements *and* are relatively affordable isn't easy. A 2020 study found that most people budget and spend between \$25,001 and \$50,000+ on their kitchen renovations. This can be daunting, doubly so when you consider how quickly kitchen design styles shift. So, when it's time to update your kitchen, whether for functional or aesthetic purposes, you have to decide: Will you refinish or replace your kitchen cabinets?

We asked a design trend expert at who does wood refinishing to weigh in on what homeowners need to consider when making that high-stakes choice and this is their advice.

### **Refinishing Kitchen Cabinets**

Experts say you should only consider refinishing the cabinets if the current design is functional and if the original material used is sturdy and still in good shape. If you don't want to change the layout of your cabinets, refinishing them can give a dated finish a fresh new look. High-quality wood cabinets are good candidates for refinishing. Replacing your cabinets may be necessary especially if the cabinets not good quality and are more than 8-10 years old. Refinishing hardy wood cabinets, instead of replacing them can be less expensive but not as much as you would think. Opting to refinish, rather than replace can maybe save you up to \$5,000+ but in the long run is it worth it? If your cabinets aren't wood, refinishing wouldn't be an option. Lacquer cabinets are more contemporary looking, but they're not candidates for refinishing or even repainting, often. Many times the finished look is not everything you might have hoped for and many scratch and stain easily. Keep in mind that sometimes refurbishing, repainting your cabinets is only a temporary fix and may not yield the finished effect you had in mind. Plus, both of these processes are more expensive than most homeowner's realize. Research both options before making a final decision.

### **Replacing Kitchen Cabinets**

Kitchen cabinets with significant damage or that are outdated should be replaced. Covering up warping, water damage, mold, or other issues that impact the quality of the material is only a temporary solution. Warping, 'cabinet soft spots,' and mold are all considered excessive damage and warrant immediate replacement. And, of course, you should replace your kitchen cabinets if the layout of the space doesn't work for you. If your biggest complaint with your kitchen is that the cabinets all seem to be in the wrong spots (or there aren't enough of them), the only solution is to replace them with a more thoughtful layout. Newer cabinetry offers multiple types of storage options to enhance and increase the storage space in your kitchen. Pantry roll outs, utensil trays, garbage pull-outs and built-in spice racks can really enhance your kitchen. New cabinetry also offers more of a long term solution for homeowners and gives them the ability to arrange their kitchen like they want.
