Special Meeting ----- July 14, 1989

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, ATTENDANCE D. L. Taylor at 7:00 A.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were James Walker, Gary Wilson and John Groo.

Special Service District members present were D. L. Taylor, Gary Wilson, Dan Holyoak and George White.

Others present were Shirley Lammert, Roberta Highland, Dale Pierson, Marsha Modine and Bobbie Domenick.

The metered use chart was discussed, and D.L. sug- IRRIGATION gested we determine as nearly as possible the pumping costs, REPORT and in order to be fair we should correlate use as closely as possible the pumping costs to the use figures. The criteria is going to have to approach all these different categories in a fair manner, and although these different categories cannot be handled simply, but we must be as fair as possible. Dale mentioned there was another category, that we may not be able to pump to the people on the upper end of the system at all. Dale pointed out that we can pump only 2200 gpm, and he is encouraging users to pump their own wells in order to serve more people who do not have a well.

The cost figures were discussed, and Dale reported he had gone over the bills with the power Co. and they were estimating a \$27.50 AF cost. Gary estimates he is paying \$22. to 23.00 per acre foot to pump. The set up fee for the Corbin Well was \$7,000.00. It was suggested the set up fees be put on Capitol Improvement. The set up fee for The Beeman well might be as much as \$9,000.00; Dale doesn't think it will be that much. Jim asked if the Lance Wells are to be metered. Dale reported the Corbin Well is pumping more water than he had expected. The cost figures were discussed at length, Dale reported he had talked with Bob Byrnes, who had talked to Troy Black, who thinks the Lance well could be reamed out, because it scaled up badly.

D.L. asked what about the customers who had been paying part of their pumping costs all spring. This was discussed. D. L. asked about billing the overuse. Board agreed bills be sent immediately to those customers who have used more than their purchased amount of water.

It was agreed by consensus there were certain customers, (Tangren extension and Farnsworth on the mesa) who simply can get no more water this season.

The Board agreed to send Bob Byrnes to the moun- IRRIGATION tain as is prudent, taking into consideration the readings REPORT at the creek. The agreement with the Lances was discussed. The Board agreed by consensus to present the agree- POWER ment as drafted. Jim Walker moved the District accept the AGREEMENTagreements with U P & L for the power. Gary  $\bar{\text{W}}$ ilson LANCE seconded. D. L. Taylor signed the agreements. MOTION CARRIED.

Gary Wilson moved the District accept the agree- POWER ment with the U.P. & L. for power to the Beeman Wells. Jim AGREEMENT-Walker seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

BEEMAN

The District, after discussion agreed by consen- POWER COST sus to work out a formula for each individual based on use SURCHARGE times \$27.50 per acre feet. It was agreed to review power costs and bill customers monthly or as the meters are read.

Jim Walker moved to pay 100% of Wilson's first POWER BILLpower bills, up to the point when the lake went dry (7-13- WILSON 80). Dan Holyoak seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

The Board agreed by consensus that customers be CUSTOMER given 7 days to return forms indicating their intentions to SURVEY either pay pumping costs or using their own water.

The meeting adjourned at 9:25 A.M.
