Subject: Search Warrants Leads to Arrests

After receiving anonymous tips, Sheriff Hunt and deputies responded to high volume traffic going to two different residences located on Chestnut Street in the City of Martin on Saturday, July 31st, 2015.

Upon obtaining sufficient evidence, sheriff deputies secured search warrants to search the premises of James Nunemaker and Janet Crum, as well as the residence of Edgar Brown.

Conducting a thorough search of both premises, deputies found oxycodone, marijuana, drug scales, pipes and other drug paraphernalia.

James Nunemaker and Janet Crum were taken to the Floyd County Detention Center and charged with:

1. Possession 1st Degree 2 counts; and
2. Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

Edgar Brown, was charged with:

1. Possession of marijuana
2. Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

Deputy Dusty Newsome was the investigating and arresting officer. Newsome was assisted by deputies Justin Cooley, and Brad Caldwell, as well as Constable Larry “Boss” Jarrell **and the Martin City Police.**

The investigation is still ongoing and additional charges are likely.
