Auxiliary Emergency Fund March 2021

Who is Eligible?

Members of the American Legion Auxiliary whose dues are current and who have maintained membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years) are eligible to apply in the wake of a financial crisis. Temporary assistance may be considered when:

- A financial crisis hits, leaving a member without resources for shelter or utilities, and no other source of aid is readily available.
- A natural disaster or weather emergency leaves a member without shelter or food.
- In extreme circumstances, educational training is needed by a member lacking the necessary skills for employment.

In the case of a natural disaster, an expedited application is available. The completed application can be submitted directly to ALA National Headquarters.

Individual contributors donating \$50 or more can receive a citation and lapel pin.

This is a requirement every year. It only takes a few minutes and then you are in compliance and have met your goals for the year.

If you are a Department Chairman and have a bank account to maintain for your program, please keep your receipts and record all deposits and withdrawals in your check register. Keep this information in your Black Bag so it does not get lost. It needs to be up to date for the Finance Committee Audit Team at the close of the year. Legislative

March 2021

Greetings,

I hope this finds all of you in good health and spirits. We are going on a year with COVID restrictions. Last year, I was in Washington DC for the American Legion Conference. Glad I got home in time. As the delegation from Arizona was arriving to Phoenix, the Governor suspended all incoming and outgoing international travel. We weren't traveling internationally of course, but it was a weird site to see. As some of you know, the Conference this year was cancelled due to COVID.

Not a whole lot has been happening. President Biden was sworn into office on January 20th. Since then, he has signed 52 Executive Orders, many of which are reversing Executive Orders put into place by President Trump. A second impeachment trial of Former President Trump was started in early February by the U.S. House of Representatives. Former President Trump was acquitted.

As many of you know the Governor and President, are still giving daily briefings on the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor has started to allow some elective surgeries. There are two vaccines approved by the FDA, by Pfizer and Moderna. Johnson and Johnson are also jumping aboard and working on getting a one dose vaccine approved by the FDA, as opposed to the two dose ones available now.

Protests and demonstrations in Washington DC as well as State Capitols including ours have died down somewhat. Fortunately, the activities at our State Capitol as of the writing of this bulletin have not turned violent. The fences at our State Capitol have been removed, but strict security restrictions are still in place due to threats on elected officials and COVID restrictions. The good news is that arrests have been made, and more on the way. The State Legislature has convened, and is currently working on passing bills from last session.

In closing, please stay healthy and positive. Remember, we are all in this together. Please remember, to be kind and patient with one another. The National Judge Advocate of The American Legion has issued the following ruling:

"It is crystal clear that The American Legion Post has no authority to control the Unit related to it." The Post may not revoke nor threaten revocation of its Unit's charter.

The Unit should regard its connection with the post as a distinct honor. It should strive unceasingly to carry out the National Constitution's "to participate in and contribute to the accomplishment of the aims and purposes of The American Legion."

This year has been a roller coaster ride for the entire world being held captive by a virus. Our entire health care system has undergone many challenges and now more than ever we need our Health Care Heroes. In light of this there are many student who can certainly use a lift with their education and PPP offers health care scholarships. Please share this information with your Unit.

PPP Nurses Scholarship - \$600

Scholarships are awarded annually to not less than a second year student who is enrolled in an accredited institution in Arizona awaiting a degree as a Registered Nurse. The immediate family members of a veteran will be given first preference. Applicant must be a citizen of the USA and a resident of AZ for at least one year. Rules and regulations concerning this scholarship will accompany application forms.

PPP Scholarship Assistance In Health Occupations - \$500

Applications for assistance to students pursuing a career in Health Care Occupations. Applicants must be enrolled/enrolling in an accredited tax-supported institution in Arizona which offers a certificate or degree in Health Care Occupations (Nursing Assistant, Dental Assistant, LPN, Lab Tech, Physical Therapist, etc.). Applicants must be a citizen of the U.S. and a resident of AZ for at least one year.



VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 1-31-21

All events are suspended until further notice. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Moderna vaccine has arrived and all staff who desired vaccination have been vaccinated. All at risk Veterans and those 75+ have been offered the two dose vaccine. Currently working on Veterans 65+. Current numbers are encouraging according to Director.

Southwest Bind Rehabilitation Center is now closed until COVID-19 numbers improve. They have requested that service organizations provide delivery of in house meals. There will be no volunteers at these meals. There is NO visitation at SAVAHCS. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time. American Legion Auxiliary Gift Shop will have to be done differently this year. The hospital is asking for lists from nursing staff of items needed by Veteran patients. They have requested that all service organizations work together to fill these needs with no duplication. American Legion Auxiliary Christmas Gift Shop donated \$4,000.00 worth of gift cards in support this effort.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021 is \$800.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for February 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021 is \$38,744.33. This amount includes the Christmas Gift Shop donation for 2019. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 24, Unit 66, Unit 68 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Four registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021 is 518.5. S AVAHCS is in the process of bringing back volunteers. Volunteers will be phased in as needed and the process will be closely monitored by the Director. Volunteers will be contacted by the Voluntary Service office as their services are needed. One more Auxiliary volunteer has been called back. This effort is currently being reevaluated due to current numbers and availability of vaccine.

This chairman has volunteered 108 hours and logged 1,560 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of January 31, 2021. This chairman has now logged over 4,000 hours in service to SAVAHCS. This chairman was elected to be the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the VAVS Executive Committee at the meeting on October 8, 2020. The audit of the books was completed. This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need during this time of enormous stress on all community resources. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. Annual Joint Review was completed November 10, 2020.
