

History and Significance This house was built by Daniel (aka David) Huntington c.1866, on a lot given him by his father, George Huntington (ERI-1698), and identical to the one immediately to the east given to his brother, Erastus. These lots, arranged side by side each had identical hall-and-parlor houses. (See also ERI-1545). Unlike his brother, Erastus, Daniel born on the island in 1845,		27. 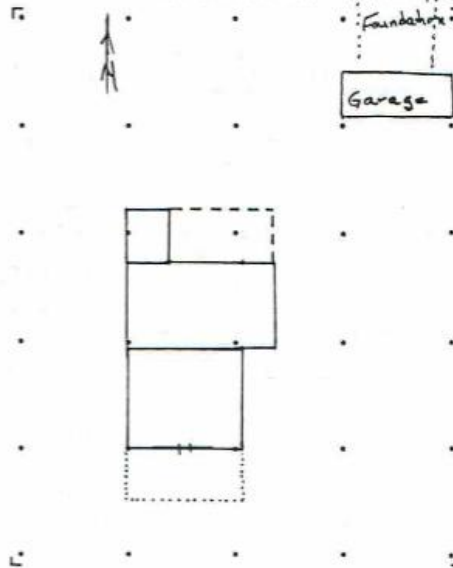

lived on the island a relatively short time leaving soon after 1880. While here he helped manage his father's estates as a farm overseer, and was appointed Custom's Officer. The house was then purchased by Daniel Maag who had emigrated to the U.S. in 1874 from the Black Sea area of Russia, with other Germans fleeing conscription. He came to the island shortly before 1880 at the instigation of his cousin, August Schaedler (ERI-1654), working for Lewis Beatty and John Ranft in their wineries. His wife, Fredrika Youngman, whom he met in the Dakota Territory became the island midwife. C.1896 they were able to buy their own vineyards and house from Daniel Huntington, and in 1910 build a small winery to the rear of their house. This was one of the many small wineries that were in operation on the island in that period. Daniel and his wife were supporters of the German Evangelical Church and served as a trustee. A son, Elmer, born 1888, worked as a foreman for the Kelley Island Wine Co., living for a time in the superintendent's house over the east cellar, and a second son, William, born 1885, was a plant engineer for the KIL&T Co. Both brothers married daughters of August & Amelia Schnittker in Pittsburgh (See ERI-1568). A daughter, Bertha, born 1884, married quarryman Ralph Heckle. After his death in a quarry accident she lived on in the family home for many years.
