



Columbus, Ohio is known for its contributions to history, many parks, & shopping destinations, is the 15th largest city in the US and is located in the heart of the country. Columbus is the Ohio State capital and within 600 miles of almost ½ of the US population. More of our country's presidents come from Ohio than any other state. Eight of the forty six American Presidents were elected from the Buckeye State, earning Ohio the nickname "the Mother of Presidents."

The first Wendy's is located in Columbus, and has the headquarters of White Castle (started in Wichita). The "Blue Jackets" hockey team is based here. (During the Civil War, Columbus made uniforms for the Union Army.) Ohio State University's OSU Stadium is the 4th largest college football facility. Geraldine "Jerrie" Mock, an OSU grad, was the first female to fly solo around the world. Ohio has a wealth of railroading opportunities and we will see many of them.

NOTE: our convention week begins with checkin Monday, July 31 so as not to miss any tours. The week ends on Sunday, August 6. If you have not been to a T.T.O.S. National Convention before, make sure to get to this one as we will have a great week co-hosted by the T.T.O.S. – Buckeye Division.

HOW TO GET THERE

The Columbus Airport is called the John Glenn International Airport (CMH) and is about 3 minutes from our host hotel – the Marriott Columbus Airport. Some of the airlines that fly into Columbus are Air Canada, Alaska, American, Delta, Frontier, Southwest, and Spirit. There is a complimentary shuttle that goes to the Marriott Hotel; just call 614/475-7551.

If you drive, I-670 runs through Columbus; our hotel is Northeast of downtown and near the airport.

Unfortunately for a few members, there is no Amtrak service to Columbus, Ohio.

OUR HOST HOTEL

The Marriott Columbus Airport is the 2023 TTOS Convention Hotel, and it is located at 1375 N. Cassady Avenue, Columbus. OH 43219. Telephone is 614/475-7551. There is complimentary airport/hotel shuttle service 6am to midnight daily; just call 614/475-7551. The room rates are \$109+/night for king or double beds and the rate is good 3 days pre and post. Check-in is 3pm and check-out is 11am. TTOS has complimentary parking and WIFI. In room



amenities include a coffee/tea, hair dryer, iron & ironing board, and alarm; there is a coin-op laundry and an ATM on-site plus safe deposit at front desk. The hotel is a smoke free facility. This hotel completed a major renovation in 2022. All room reservations must be made before June 30 by calling 614/475-7551, then press #1 to get reservations and identify yourself with TTOS 2023. Best to check-in into the hotel on Monday, July 31so no tours are missed. There is a restaurant on-site called the River City Grille.

Attire: Business casual or better.





NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE

Tuesday, August 1

Depart 7:00 am - Return 9:00 pm Cost: \$90 per person

Of all the tours to be available at the 2023 T.T.O.S. National Convention, this is the most requested tour to be offered. Please register early for this tour as seats are limited!



The museum is located at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, northeast of Dayton, OH. The NMUSAF is oldest and largest military aviation museum in the world, with more than 360 aircraft and missiles on display. This museum draws about a million visitors each year, making it one of the most frequently visited tourist attractions in Ohio.

The museum dates back to 1923, when the Engineering Department of Dayton's McCook Field first collected technical artifacts for preservation. The collection moved to a number of locations and in 1954, the United States Air Force Museum became public and housed in its first permanent location which was a former engine overhaul hangar. Through the 1960's and the 1970's, the square footage grew to triple



its size. In 1988 another hangar was added, and another in 2003 and yet another in 2016 bringing the museum to 1,120,00 sq. ft. In October 2004, the museum name changed to the National Museum of the United States Air Force.

The museum's collection contains many rare aircraft of historical or technical importance as well as other artifacts from the history and development of aviation. A few examples of the 350 aerospace vehicles and missiles include the Apollo 15 command module Endeavor, one of four remaining Convair B-36 Peacemakers, the only surviving North American XB-70 Valkyrie, and the Bockscar - the Boeing B-29 Superfortress that dropped the Fat Man atomic bomb on Nagasaki. You will also see a number of presidential aircraft as well as a museum section devoted to the Wright Brothers. Throughout the museum you will see many pieces of clothing and uniforms and flying jackets.

For an additional fee, guests can view aviationand space-oriented films in the theater that was recently upgraded from Imax to 3D with 7.1 surround sound system.



Note: Wear comfortable shoes as there is lots to see in 19 acres of the museum.

Note: lunch is on your own at the museum cafe. Leave back packs on the bus.

RUTHERFORD B. HAYES PRESIDENTIAL CENTER AND MAD RIVER & NKP RAILROAD MUSEUM

Wednesday, August 2

Depart 7:00 am - Return 8:00 pm Cost: \$115 per person

The Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Center, located in Fremont, OH, is a complex of several buildings related to his life and presidency. It was the first presidential library, built in 1916, and one of three such libraries for US presidents during the 19th century. You will see the Hayes Museum and Library as well as the Spiegel Grove, an estate encompassing the Hayes home, and home of several generations of the Hayes family. The library holds 12,000 volume personal library of Hayes, as well as materials related to his military and political career – particularly his presidency of 1877 to 1881, and 70,000 volumes plus newspapers and journals from the time of the Civil War to the eve of World War I.



Rutherford B. Hayes was a lawyer who had studied at Harvard and volunteered time as a lawyer for the underground railroad. He served in the House of Representatives and as Governor of Ohio. During the Civil War, he was wounded 5x and served as a major general. His campaign for presidency was founded on the principals of civil service reform and sound currency. As president, he eliminated booze at the White

House. He signed legislation allowing women to argue before the Supreme Court. A few firsts for President Hayes: oath of office in the White House, visited the west coast, started the Egg Roll tradition, had both a telephone and a typewriter at the White House. (Lunch is included and will be served at the library)



After lunch, we will go to the Mad River & NKP Railroad Museum in Bellevue, OH. Here we will be treated to a wide variety of railroad equipment and artifacts at the largest railroad museum in the state of Ohio. The museum has steam engines and diesels, cabooses, mail cars, dining cars, 200-ton wrecker, the first dome passenger car built in the US, box cars, a WWII troop car, telegraph car, watchman's tower, and a section house. You will also see the bell from the Lincoln Funeral Train. The museum is on both sides of a live track and we may see Norfolk Southern trains pass while we are there. The train station has other forms of memorabilia and a gift shop. The museum is run 100% by volunteers willing to talk to you about the history of railroads and Bellevue. We will have fun here. Dinner is included.





WARREN G. HARDING LIBRARY & MUSEUM AND MARION UNION STATION MUSEUM

Thursday, August 3

Depart 8:00 am - Return 4:30 pm

Cost: \$80 per person

The Warren G. Harding Presidential Library and Museum is dedicated to our 29th president of the United States from 1921 - 1923 and is located in Marion, OH adjacent to the Harding Home, now an historic house museum that you will see. We will first go by the Harding Memorial - the largest presidential memorial outside of Washington D.C. At the Library and Museum, we will view multiple interactive exhibits. The museum houses artifacts and memorabilia that were once owned by the former president and his wife Florence. Harding became a publisher of a newspaper, served in the Ohio Senate and Lt. Governor as well as the US Senate. He embraced technology and was sensitive to the plight of minorities and women.



Harding conducted his election campaign mainly from his house's expansive front porch. During the three-month campaign, over 600,000 people traveled to the Harding Home to listen to Warren speak. In 1920, Harding built a small bungalow-style structure behind his home so newspaper reporters had workspace to type their stories. Election Day, Nov. 2, 1920, was Harding's birthday. Oh, what a present it was when he won the popular vote by just over 60% - a landslide!

Not all of the Harding administration served the people of the US. Some of his friends were using their official positions to enrich themselves.

Harding may have said, "They're the ones that keep me walking the floor at night". He asked his Secretary of Commerce, Herbert Hoover, to investigate. However, Harding died before the Teapot Dome Scandal was solved. Note: Lunch will be served at the library and included in price. After lunch we go across town to the Marion Union Station and museum with its unique double railroad crossings and switch tower. The station is a former passenger station that served several train lines: Chesapeake and Ohio Railway,

point between different geographic points.

The Marion Union Station was built in 1902 and featured marble walls and patterned mosaic tiles on the floors. In 1923, it was the last stop on president Warren Harding's funeral train. It

was a canteen stop for soldiers during WWII. It had it last long-distance train in 1971 with the end of the Chesapeake & Ohio's connector to the George Washington. Presently the station is the site of a museum run by the Marion Union Station Association. There is a chance that we could get up into the preserved interlocking tower that overlooks the double-crossover tracks. We should see some of approximately 60 CSX and Norfolk Southern freight trains that pass each day.



AGE OF STEAM ROUNDHOUSE MUSEUM AND DENNISON RAILROAD DEPOT MUSEUM

Friday, August 4

Depart 9:00 am - Return 5:00 pm

Cost: \$85 per person

We will first travel to Sugar Creek, OH to go the Age of Steam Roundhouse Museum. The roundhouse was built by Jerry Joe Jacobson, former CEO of the Ohio Central Railroad System, and houses steam and diesel locomotives, passenger cars and other railroad equipment.

In October 2008, he sold his interest in the OCRS to Genesee & Wyoming, including track, modern equipment and most workshops. He kept a collection of vintage steam and diesel locomotives, other old equipment, and a depot. He then bought 34 acres and began constructing a 48,000 sq. ft. roundhouse with 18 stalls to house his collection. The building was completed in 2011 and all steam locomotives along with a few select pieces of rolling stock were moved inside. It was the first large roundhouse built in the US since 1951. (Since there isn't enough room for photos we placed them at the bottom of page 5.)

NOTE: This is a working railroad and there are inherent dangers involved. All participants must sign a "Waiver and Hold Harmless Agreement" prior to this tour. This agreement will be mailed to all who sign up; read it and return it to the TTOS or you cannot board the bus that day.

Our next stop is the Dennison Railroad Depot Museum. Recognized as a National Landmark, the restored 1873 Pennsylvania depot is the most significant remaining example in the nation of a railroad canteen still reflecting its WWII heritage. It served 1.3 million service members free food by 4,000 volunteers at the then called Dennison Depot Salvation Army Serviceman's Canteen. These service men and women traveled by troop train along the National Defense Strategic Railway and stopped at the Depot as they were going off to fight in the war.

The Homefront hospitality became so well known, that the nickname Dreamsville, USA was given by the soldiers themselves. The Depot is fully restored and now houses a museum, restaurant, Panhandle Theater, and Whistle Stop Gift Shop. We will explore the museum's railroad history and exhibits, and then you can watch the trains run in a large Model Train Layout depicting Dennison in its heyday. Among the railroad cars attached to the depot, we will see a rare WWII hospital car with WWI and WWII collections.

Note: You can eat lunch in the Over the Rail Diner upon arrival (1:00pm?) (Not included)



HOME LAYOUT TOURS
