Marjorie Jean was born on August 17, 1938 in Goodrich, MI, daughter of the late Allen Robert and Clara Gertrude (Drewett) Coventry. She married Paul Wesley Cook on September 23, 1958 in Ortonville. He preceded her in death March 18,

2002. Margie spent most of her young life in Ortonville and Grand Blanc, graduating from Ortonville High School in 1956, majoring in business, as well as participating in band, choir, and cheerleading. After graduating, she worked as a bookkeeper at Consumers Power in Flint. Marge never expected to be a farmer, but she began dating Paul when they were both cast in a production of Brandon Community Players. She took on the role of farm-wife with gusto, helping in the barn and fields, milking cows, even driving truck to the elevator, as well as keeping the farm books, records and income taxes. Also, gardening, canning, freezing, wrapping meat when we butchered and feeding neighbors, friends and relatives that happened to show up at mealtime! But most of all, she cherished being a mother and grandmother, guiding her sons through school, 4-H, FFA, and life lessons. Paul, Marge, and sons moved to Ubly in 1978. Marge enjoyed bottle feeding and caring for newborn calves, mowing the lawn, feeding and watching birds. She owned and operated "Marge's Country Cookery" for several years, making tons of fudges, chocolates and other delicious candies. She also enjoyed going to the winter farm meetings and Holstein picnics, 4-H Fairs and cow shows. She was an active member of the Huron County Dairy Diplomats and always found a way to promote dairy products. She was a devoted member of Ubly United Methodist Church and studied scripture every morning. Marge always stopped and took the time to listen, ponder and offer thoughtful, sage advice, whether it was what you wanted to hear or not.
