Don't Sell Yourself Short . . .

Luke 16:10

"He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful also in much; and he who is unrighteous in a very little thing is unrighteous also in much."

It has been ten years since I wrote my first devotion. In all those years, I rarely missed a week of writing one. Writing devotions has been one of the most precious times for me because it helps deepen my prayer and meditation on the Scripture in a practical setting. During this time of writing, I often sense a subtleness of God's guidance that might not normally grab my attention.

However, the way I began writing devotions was quite simple, humble and unexpected. I would never have imagined it to linger for this long.

It was the year 2007, and I had started a young adult's ministry in Los Angeles. I sent out one simple e-mail. The following was the first devotion I wrote:

"Hi, Kenosis People,

We will commence our meeting this Sunday at the old sanctuary at 12:30. Please join us for fellowship and learning. Lunch will be provided for \$5. Hope to see you there."

Psalm 28 "The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing."

Why did I use the Scripture? Actually, I just simply added it to fill up space not really knowing that it would save a person's life. A few weeks later, I received an e-mail from a guy who wanted to meet me for coffee. When I met him, he said that my e-mail saved him from committing suicide. He and his fiancé came from New York, three years before that, and opened a pizza restaurant with an ambition for their future. However, the business wasn't successful and it cause him to file for bankruptcy. After that, his fiancé left him and went back to New York. He lost everything. Before taking his life, he was going to send out an e-mail to his family and friends but then he happened to read the Scripture in my simple e-mail..... "The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing."

I felt ashamed because my only motivation for the Scripture was nothing more than just filling up empty space. But mysteriously, it was a life-saving Scripture to someone else. Ever since that time, I have added a different Scripture every Wednesday, as well as adding a few comments on the Scripture.

Something so insignificant by our standards may be substantial to God's standards. You might consider what you do now as inconsequential, so therefore you don't put any value on it. This could be where you stifle God's great plan. It is your own self-judgment to think of yourself with this low self-esteem. Our Lord always does His great works regardless of any human measure of what they can do. In your life time, there might be a person whose life is tremendously transformed by your humble advice.

Don't sell yourself short. What you do now is the work of the Lord.

Stewardship Corner - What Is Your Standard of Measure?

Following is a wonderful story of God's blessing of an unselfish act. <u>Thank you</u> for <u>your</u> unselfishness in giving your tithes and offerings to support the life of this church. God challenges us to test Him through our giving..."Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, *and* running over. For by <u>your</u> standard of measure it will be measured to <u>you</u> in return." *What is <u>your</u> standard of measure*? Something to ponder as we return to God a portion of what already belongs to Him...

One day in 2014, Myles Eckert, age 8, found \$20 in the parking lot of a Cracker Barrel restaurant in Maumee, Ohio. He thought about buying a video game, but once inside the restaurant, he decided to give the \$20 to Lt. Col. Frank Daily, a soldier who was dining there with his family. Myles walked up to the man and gave him the money, along with a Post–It Note that said, "Dear Soldier — my dad was a soldier. He's in heaven now. I found this 20 dollars in the parking lot when we got here. We like to pay it forward in my family. It's your lucky day! Thank you for your service. Myles Eckert, a gold star kid." Needless to say, the soldier was stunned and, of course, gave the money away.

But since the story (and several follow–ups) aired on CBS, the small act of kindness by an 8–year–old boy has prompted an outpouring of goodwill and money to Snowball Express, a nonprofit that benefits children of U.S. soldiers killed in active duty. From individual gifts of a few dollars to entertainers' gifts in huge amounts (Gary Sinise gave \$75,000) also prompted Highland Capital Management in Texas to set up a matching grant program for Snowball Express. They pledged to match up to a total \$1 million every donation made in Eckert's name during a two–month period last spring.

Myles Eckert never imagined having \$1 million to help other kids. But he had \$20, and he gave what he had. (Steve Hartman, "Ohio 8–year–old turns \$20 into priceless gift," CBS News, February 28, 2014)



Thoughts for the Journey—An Easter Excerpt from Tim Keller...

The celebration of Easter is not just about looking forward to an eternity with Christ (although that's certainly an important part of it!). As testimonies of those who have accepted Christ into their hearts demonstrates, the power of resurrection is ours right now, in our lives, in our families. Tim Keller sums it up so well:

The difference between knowing Christ and knowing the power of His resurrection is the difference between knowing a person and resembling a person. . .It is not about relationship but about supernatural character growth. When Paul says, "I want to know Him," it means, "I want to be with Him," but when he says, "I want to know the power of His resurrection," it means, "I want to be just like Him." Look at the deadness in your life. Look at the anger. How is that going to be turned into forgiveness? Look at the insecurity. How is that going to be turned into confidence? Look at the self-centeredness. How is that going to be turned into compassion and generosity? How? The answer is that the dead stuff gets taken over by the Spirit of God . . .The minute you decide to receive Jesus as Savior and Lord, the power of the Holy Spirit comes into your life. It's the power of the resurrection—the same thing that raised Jesus from the dead.
