Though nearing the end of the season, the hydrangeas on Sao Miguel Island in the Azores are still blooming here and there. Planted by hand, they flank the roads as well as delineate borders throughout the vineyards. In the parks, their vibrant blue and enormous blossoms extend an invitation to pause for a moment, rest and take it all in. During a visit at "The Bay of Silence" I did just that; pausing to rest for a moment while taking in the beautiful surroundings.





"I can no longer condemn or hate a brother for whom I pray, no matter how much trouble he causes me. His face, that hitherto may have been strange and intolerable to me, is transformed in intercession into the countenance of a brother." Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Life Together

Theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a staunch opponent of the Nazi regime and a resistance member leading up to and during WWII. He was imprisoned and executed in 1945 as he fearlessly spoke for peace and called out the atrocities of war. Life together is difficult, especially in our diverse global village. If we're not to harm one another, it will take constant work for the maintenance peace, and intentional nurturing of relationships between all tribes. Peace and justice require flexibility and the willingness to think and care beyond ourselves.

Poet Gwendolyn Brooks said, "We are each other's harvest; we are each other's business; we are each other's magnitude and bond." In the end, we may reap a harvest of peace and harmony when the equity of love matches the fervor of our prayers. Whether in the quiet of our private moments or the collective expressions of our assemblies, let us pray for one another. Let us pray that love will overcome hatred. Let us pray, whatever prayer looks like for each of us, for our brothers and sisters facing the scourge of war and violence today; for our brothers and sisters who redefine courage as they place their lives, livelihoods, on the line to speak the truth and for justice in our world. Let us pray that true leaders may hold sway, and demagogues may fade away. Let us pray for our adversaries so that they may experience and learn about grace and love, that evil may be eradicated, and peace may prevail. Let us pray and match action to our words so that in the end, love may win. Amen.
