Our neighborhood remains relatively quiet. Current issues:

- Nuisance properties – report suspicious activities such as many people coming and going all times of the day, to non-emergency number. North Pop will monitor situation
- Vehicle burglaries – Deputy handed out flyers with recommendations to: not leave valuables in car, lock doors, do not keep garage door opener in vehicle if parked in driveway.

- Increased patrol and enforcement on Garfield issued speed, stop citations
- Parking near Yellow Pine – Vehicles parked along Garfield blocked view of vehicles attempting to enter Garfield from Yellow Pine. County installed No Parking signs along Garfield to improve visibility. Community members showed appreciation.
- Vehicles parked on street for extended times. Vehicles must be moved every 72 hours.
- Vehicles running stop signs in community – provide typical time of day and number of vehicles violating

Sound Wall Update (Sacramento County):

New Projected Start of Project: April 2019

Contract: Currently out to bid

Funding: Currently have \$1M funding available in Community Improvement Fund

Sound wall runs approximately ½ mile from Walerga Park to the start of Walnut and Verner. As funding may be tight for entire wall, the sound wall at Walerga Park is included - if funding allows. There are 29 property owners along the proposed wall. Owners must grant easement for the County to access their property. Currently the County has received signed easements from 17 property homeowners.
