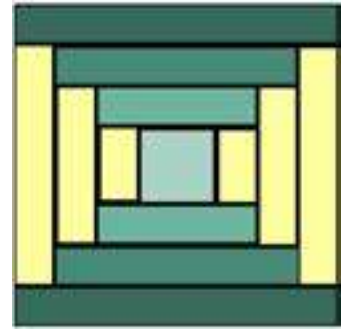

Kyona Nason is an award-winning quilter and pharmacist living in Southeastern Pennsylvania. Her work has been juried into QuiltCon, Pennsylvania National Quilt Extravaganza, Quiltfest Lancaster, and AQS Paducah. Her work is varied but primarily focuses on the interleaving technique and she has been teaching it since 2019.

In this class, you'll learn how to piece curvy designs with zero curved piecing. Kyona will teach you a quilt-as-you-go technique, so you'll leave with a nearly completed piece.

Interested in making a quilted jacket? Join Program as it hosts an open forum group whereby like-minded members will come together sharing tips and tricks on making a quilted jacket. The forum will consist of @ 5 sessions covering the following stages of construction.

- 1) Pattern, fabric and notions selection; Sizing; Lined vs No lined option.
- 2) Pattern layout - how to incorporate quilt blocks, pinning, marking, and cutting
- 3) Construction tips on lining, pockets, darts etc
- 4) Finishing with buttons, zippers, facing trim etc
- 5) Ta-da.... modeling our finished jackets

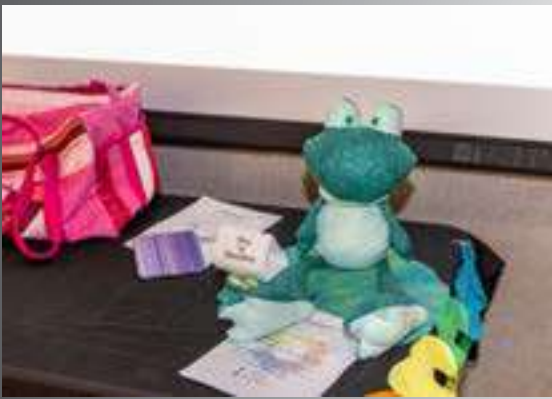

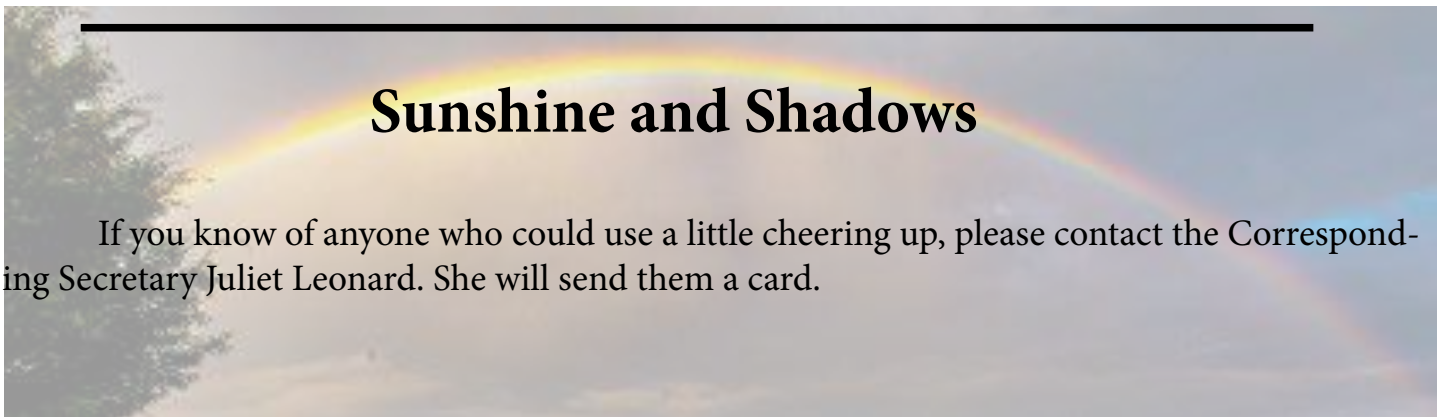

Charity committee analyzed the results and presented a report to the board. The guild will continue the program and expand to include lap quilts. Members can choose what parts they want to work on and a workshop will be provided. We will also explore options for electronic payment at the fair. CHQ Board Meeting Minutes April 14, 2023

Friday, April 14 · 7:00 – 8:38 PM ZOOM

In Attendance: Gina Krejsa, Anne Oswald, Kerry Cogan, Laura Kohl, Barbara Fusco, Lauren Lupica, Donna Slovak, Al Accettola, Dyan Rosario, Patty Gertz, Cass Garner (non voting) and Penny Armagost.

Gina Krejsa called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

March Board Minutes: Kerry Cogan made a motion to approve the March minutes, Penny Armagost seconded the motion. Approved unanimously, eleven (11) board members present.

Old Business:

- Tabled for future discussion: a suggestion to implement an online membership level for non-local residents such as \$25 membership fee instead of \$50.
- Tabled for future discussion: a review of show functions from a strategy perspective

Board/Committee Status:

- **President:** Gina Krejsa
 - Provided a summary on the guild insurance policy: While waiting to resolve the issue regarding Abuse and Molestation (A&M) coverage which was not available through State Farm, the board requested quotes from other insurance providers. A committee was formed to address this issue, they reached out to two independent insurance agencies for quotes and surveyed other quilt guilds to see how they handle insurance coverage.
 - Four issues were identified: the address on the policy, coverage for the storage unit we currently use, coverage for Abuse and Molestation is not typical for our type of organization and we do not carry Directors and Officers insurance.
 - The first two issues are easily resolved by correcting the address and adding the storage unit to the existing policy. Remaining with State Farm will result in a \$239 increase on the annual premium we currently pay.
 - Only one of the independent agents found a company that would provide the A&M coverage. The increase in annual premium would be \$75 for the A&M coverage plus an additional \$62 for the change to the new insurance provider - USLI.
 - Some other guilds (though none in our survey) provide directors and officers (D&O) liability insurance which protects the officers from being sued personally. The cost of D&O coverage is significant with an

annual premium of \$689. The board discussed the need for appropriate coverage in today's climate.

- After comparing all the insurers and all of the coverage discussed, the Insurance Review Committee recommended purchasing insurance through USLI, the company that can provide Abuse and Molestation and D&O coverage. The budget for insurance will need to be increased by the board.

- Additionally the committee recommended an amendment to the standing rules to clarify if a member brings a child to a meeting the child must remain in the care of the parent at all times.

- Guild needs a Boutique chair, there are 3 committee members. We have gotten multiple bins of fabric donations. Members are holding items that can not fit in the storage unit. We are in a 10x10 unit. The cost is about \$40 per month to go to a 10x15 unit. Increase in fabric price could pay for the increased cost.

Gina Krejsa motion to increase the insurance budget to include Abuse and Molestation and D&O coverage and change the carrier to USLI, Al Accettola seconded and board approved unanimously.

Penny Armagost motion to increase the budget to obtain a 10x15 storage unit Al Accettola seconded and board approved unanimously.

- **Treasurer:** Kerry Cogan - Treasurer Report
 - Incoming: we got payments from the workshop and we paid for the mailbox so it is covered for next year. Also paid for the storage unit.
 - For the May auction we are giving the options for Cash, Check or PayPal.
- **1st Vice President/Program:** Anne Oswald - Program/Workshop Calendar
 - April is the Anniversary Party and we will be doing a charity event with Barbara making Pillow cases. The theme for the guild challenge is Color Collaboration and Donna will get a sheet cake.
 - May's meeting will be the UFO auction. We did not get a significant number of members signing up for Junk in the Trunk. Will ask at the April meeting and if we do not get at least 5 people we will cancel that portion of the event and concentrate on the UFO auction.
 - June workshop will be Kyona Nason who will do a trunk show in the evening.
 - People are signing up late so asking support to fill up the workshop early so we are within the 30 day cancellation window.

Invite everyone, especially board members, to look on the website at standing rules and bylaws and submit suggestions for changes to Patty and Cass. In May will present changes to the board for discussion. In June will present the final version for the board to approve. In July and August's newsletter will present the new proposed changes and in September the membership can vote. We need the majority of the total membership. We will provide information on Proxy voting.

 - Phase 1 of the historian project involves sorting through items and exploring how to digitize. Bulk of what we have are newsletters. Requesting money from the board for Phase 1 which is the estimated cost to scan a decades' worth of newsletters. Also looking into obtaining an external drive for storage. We need to decide if social photographs are considered historical information. Once the newsletters are digitized they will be shredded since they contain personal information. There is currently no budget for this project.

Gina Krejsa motion to approve the budget for Phase 1 of the historian project, Al Acettola seconded and the board unanimously approved.
