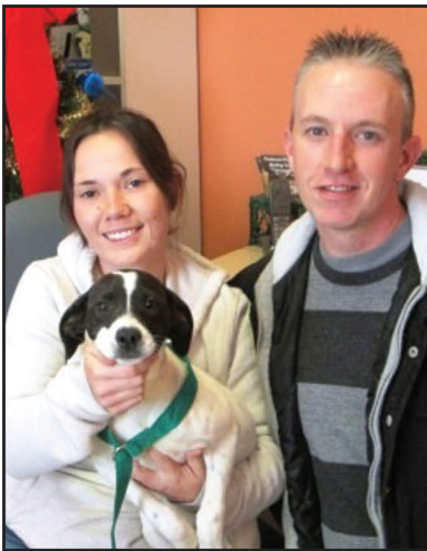
Animal shelter finds families for 29 residents during Christmas Giveaway
