## No More Excuses

**Luke 14:16-20** - The Parable of the Great Feast - *"Then He said to him, 'A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, 'Come, for all things are now ready.' But they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.' Still another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.'"*

Jesus illustrates that the Kingdom of God is an invitation to a great feast that will be filled by those who accept it, even when the original invitees refuse due to flimsy excuses. In context, Jesus tells this parable while dining with a Pharisee, and its meaning points to the Jewish people's rejection of the Gospel, which then leads to it being extended to the Gentiles. The parable serves as a warning against neglecting God's invitation for trivial reasons and highlights the urgency of accepting His grace.

*Question:* What is the real issue with the excuses?

Jesus' parable of the Great Banquet confronts a heart issue. Excuses that keep us from responding to God. God invites us to His Kingdom, His Word, and His will but people often allow lesser things to crowd out the most important thing. The things of God seem to become overshadowed by our own desires.

1. The Invitation Is Open, but Participants Must Respond.

The banquet represents God's invitation to Salvation, discipleship, and eternal life.

*Question:* Why do you think Jesus uses the picture of a "banquet" to describe God's Kingdom?

I would like to look at the scriptural connectivity between the parable of the Great Feast in **Luke 14:16-20** and the reality of the marriage supper of the Lamb out of **Revelation 19:6-9**.

**Revelation 19:6-9** - *"And I heard, as it were, the voice of a great multitude, as the sound of many waters and as the sound of mighty thunderings, saying, 'Alleluia! For the Lord God Omnipotent reigns! Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready.' And to her it was granted to be arrayed in fine linen, clean and bright, for the fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints. Then he said to me, 'Write: "Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!"' And he said to me, 'These are the true sayings of God.'"*

**Luke 14:16-20** - The Parable of the Great Banquet

The Feast: A man prepares a great feast and sends out invitations to a wedding banquet.

The Invitation: The invitation represents God's offer of Salvation and His Kingdom. God is always the One who initiates, He draws men, calls us, and invites us by His Holy Spirit.

**Revelation 19:6-9** - The Marriage Supper of the Lamb

The Feast: This is not a parable but the final, literal banquet where Christ is the host, and the guests are the Church, referred to as the Bride of Christ. It is the celebration of the marriage of the Lamb to His Bride.

The Guests: The guests are those who are invited to celebrate this union with Christ. The angel specifically calls them "blessed". These are those who responded to the invitation.

The Scriptural Connectivity ... Foreshadowing and Fulfillment

Foreshadowing: Luke's parable foreshadows the reality of the feast described in **Revelation 19**.

Fulfillment: The parable depicts the invitation and the feast, while **Revelation 19** depicts the actual fulfillment of the Marriage Supper of the Lamb.

**Isaiah 55:1-3** - *"Ho! Everyone who thirsts, Come to the waters; And you who have no money, Come,*

**buy and eat. Yes, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend money for what is not bread, And your wages for what does not satisfy? Listen carefully to Me, and eat what is good, And let your soul delight itself in abundance. Incline your ear, and come to Me. Hear, and your soul shall live; And I will make an everlasting covenant with you the sure mercies of David."**

**Question:** What does God's open invitation show us about His character?

**Isaiah 55:1-3** is a powerful invitation from God, through the prophet, calling everyone who is spiritually thirsty to come to Him for satisfaction, which is a free gift. It urges people to abandon their worthless pursuits for what they cannot buy with money and to listen to God's Word, which is presented as water, wine, and bread. This message was first for the exiles in Babylon, but its theme extends to all people today, offering the promise of spiritual life and fulfillment through God's grace. I think God's character is greatly expressed here in that it shows that God will gladly receive you in your brokenness, and exchange even a broken and shattered life and hopelessness for life and life more abundantly. The scripture says for God so loved His creation that He gave His only begotten Son so that whosoever shall accept His invitation will have everlasting life. Forgive me for paraphrasing.

**Summary Thought:** God's invitation is generous, sincere, and available, but it requires that we accept God's call and respond in complete surrender to God's Word, God's will, and God's ways.

## 2. Excuses Expose Misplaced Priorities

Each excuse in **Luke 14** is not a sinful act, but it becomes sin when it takes priority over God.

**Question:** Why do good things (work, family, responsibilities) often become excuses?

From my own experience I think it's safe to say; Good things like work and family become excuses to avoid difficult or uncomfortable situations because they're easily understood and they seem to be acceptable and reasonable. Often, we'll use excuses to shield ourselves from fear of failure, judgment, or even the discomfort of change. I've said it many times, if you are going to follow Jesus, truly follow Jesus, it's going to cost you your life. Dead men don't make excuses.

**Luke 14:16-20** - The Parable of the Great Feast - *"Then He said to him, 'A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, 'Come, for all things are now ready.' But they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.' Still another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.'"*

The Excuses in the Parable:

- "I bought a field." (Work / possessions)
- "I bought oxen." (Business / responsibilities)
- "I just got married." (Relationships / commitments)

**Question:** How is it that seemingly innocent things such as property, business, or relationships prove to be hindrances to accepting God's invitation?

Excuses are often justified distractions, not necessarily evil things but they become idols when they replace or come before God in our lives.

**Question:** How does Jesus challenge our priorities scripturally?

**Matthew 16:24-26** - *"Then Jesus said to His disciples, 'If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?'"*

God is faithful (reliable, trustworthy, and therefore ever true to His promise, and He can be depended on); by Him you were called into companionship and participation with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."* (1 Corinthians 1:4-9 AMP CLASSIC)

*"Now may the Lord make you to increase and excel and overflow in love for one another and for all people, just as we also do for you, So that He may strengthen and confirm and establish your hearts faultlessly pure and unblamable in holiness in the sight of our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (the Messiah) with all His saints (the holy and glorified people of God)! Amen, (so be it)!"* (1 Thessalonians 3:12-13 AMP CLASSIC)

I found that my attitude towards unpleasant things is an important part of going through them successfully. But it's hard to do when it comes to the ones you love. We've all responded to the invitation. We all raised our hand and said here am I Lord send me. If you said it, and you meant it, you have to show up to represent it. No more excuses.

***Proverbs 24:12 - "If you say, 'Surely we did not know this,' Does not He who weighs the hearts consider it? He who keeps your soul, does He not know it? And will He not render to each man according to his deeds?"***

This portion of scripture emphasizes that God will hold each person accountable for their actions and inactions. The verse is a sober warning that excuses are ineffective against God's judgment. This verse encourages that we should examine our own hearts and actions, recognizing that God sees and judges our true intentions and motivates. The scripture says that God weighs the hearts, this is to say that our feeble excuses will not hold water. From my own experience and personal observation, here are a few common scriptural reasons men make excuses.

**Lack of faith:** Sometimes we won't trust God, and we won't believe something unless we see it, and that because our faith is lacking.

***John 20:29 - "Jesus said to him, "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."***

Lack of faith is an invalid excuse. The scripture says faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God. Each and every one of us has daily access to the Word of God. We are without excuse.

**Unwillingness and self-doubt:** Many will make excuses because we are unwilling and feel unqualified or not good enough to fulfill the calling of God in our lives.

***1 Corinthians 1:26-27 - "For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called. But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty."***

One man once said, "God does not choose the qualified, but rather qualifies the chosen." If you will answer the invitation to the call of God in your life, I can assure you through the scripture and personal experience that in assignment provision is a given. God has got you. No more excuses.

**Preoccupation with worldly things:** Like in our foundational text many people will make excuses because they are preoccupied with worldly matters. Business, possessions, or family relationships. The danger in this is when we value those things over God's invitation.

***1 John 2:15 - "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him."***

***Matthew 19:29 - "And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life."***

Jim Elliott a missionary in South America who gave his life for the purpose of the Gospel made this statement, "He is no fool who gives up what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose." Jim Elliot was killed in the jungles of South America on the banks of a very remote river and gladly laid down his life in accepting the invitation of God to serve so that others might be saved.

**Question:** What is an "excuse" you personally struggle with when it comes to seeking God?

**Summary thought:** It is vital that we build our faith so that it overshadow the excuses that hinder us from walking into the fullness of our God-given destiny.

### **3. Excuses Close Doors ... Obedience Opens Them**

***Luke 14:16-24 - "Then He said to him, 'A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, "Come, for all things are now ready." But***

they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, "I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused." And another said, "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused." Still another said, "I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come." So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, "Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor and the maimed and the lame and the blind." And the servant said, "Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room." Then the master said to the servant, "Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. For I say to you that none of these men who were invited shall taste my supper."<sup>100</sup>


Those who rejected the invitation lost their seat at the banquet. Excuses carry consequences. Obedience, however, leads to blessing and deeper relationship with God.

*Question:* What might happen spiritually if a person continually ignores God's invitations?

**Hebrews 3:8** – "Do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, in the day of trial in the wilderness."

Paul quotes the psalmist in *Psalms 95* referring to the rebellion of the Israelites in *Exodus 17* and again in *Numbers 13* and *14*. The people convinced themselves that God could not deliver them from their enemies and bring them into the promised land. They simply gave up. They gave up on believing in God. People with hardened hearts stay so stubbornly set in their ways that they cannot even turn to God. God's voice becomes clouded to them. This does not happen overnight. This is the result of a series of choices to disregard God's will. Each day we should pray for God to soften our hearts so we can hear Him speak to us. When God reveals Himself to us it provides us opportunity to accept His invitation to obey God and walk in a greater revelation so that He might be revealed in and through our lives to others.

*Final thought:* The kingdom is filled with those who responded, not those who intended to respond. No more excuses.



# Foot's Bible Study

## Zachariah 2:1-3:10

Believers are precious to God. *Psalm 116:15* – “The Lord cares deeply when His loved ones die.”

They are His own children. *Psalm 103:13* – “The Lord is like a father to His children, tender and compassionate to those who fear him.”

Treating any believers unkindly is the same as treating God that way. As Jesus told His disciples, when we help others, we are helping Him. When we neglect or abuse them, we are neglecting or abusing Him (*Matthew 25:34-46*). Be careful, therefore, how you treat fellow believers – that is the way you are treating God. (*2:8*)

Zechariah's vision graphically portrays how we receive God's mercy. We do nothing ourselves. God removes our filthy clothes (sins), then provides us with fine, new clothes (the righteousness and holiness of God – *2 Corinthians 5:21, Ephesians 4:24, Revelation 19:9*). All we need to do is repent and ask God to forgive us. When satan tries to make you feel dirty and unworthy, remember that the clean clothes of Christ's righteousness make you worthy to draw near to God. (*3:2-4*)

## Revelation 12:18-13:18

The times of great persecution that John saw will provide an opportunity for believers to exercise patient endurance and faithfulness. The tough times we face right now are also opportunities for spiritual growth. Don't fall into satan's trap and turn away from God when hard times come. Instead, use these tough times as opportunities for growth. (*13:10*)

## Psalms 141:1-10

Evil acts begin with evil desires. It isn't enough to ask God to keep you away from temptation, make you stronger, or change your circumstances. You must ask Him to change you on the inside, at the level of your desires. (*141:4*)

## Proverbs 30:18-20

Here is a very small list of things from an endless list of things that we should all be doing. The saying “Three things, no four,” is a poetic way of showing that the list is not complete. (*30:18-19*)
