EFFECTIVE DATE: Immediately

All Prehospital Emergency Medical Service Agencies licensed in Kittitas County are required to carry the medications or substances identified per level of agency licensure on their aid and ambulance units in order for the EMS providers to meet the standard of care for which they are trained and directed to provide through local protocol.

Basic Life Support – Emergency Medical Technician

- ACTIVATED CHARCOAL
- ASPIRIN
- EPINEPHRINE AUTO INJECTOR (adult and pediatric)
- ORAL GLUCOSE
- OXYGEN (the only requirement for First Responder level)

Intermediate Life Support – IV Technician

- BLS REQUIRED MEDICATIONS AND SUBSTANCES

Advanced Life Support – Paramedics

- See ALS - Prehospital Medication List

Note: Licensed ALS Ambulance services with fire apparatus licensed as aid units are not required to carry ALS medications on non transporting units.
