RE: MEDICATIONS OR SUBSTANCES REQUIRED ON UNITS

**DATE:** April 12, 2004

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE: Immediately**

All Prehospital Emergency Medical Service Agencies licensed in Kittitas County are required to carry the medications or substances <u>identified per level of agency licensure</u> on their aid and ambulance units in order for the EMS providers to meet the standard of care for which they are trained and directed to provide through local protocol.

## **Basic Life Support – Emergency Medical Technician**

- ACTIVATED CHARCOAL
- ASPIRIN
- EPINEPHRINE AUTO INJECTOR (adult and pediatric)
- ORAL GLUCOSE
- OXYGEN (the only requirement for First Responder level)

### Intermediate Life Support – IV Technician

BLS REQUIRED MEDICATIONS AND SUBSTANCES

## **Advanced Life Support – Paramedics**

**Note:** Licensed ALS Ambulance services with fire apparatus licensed as aid units are not required to carry ALS medications on non transporting units.
