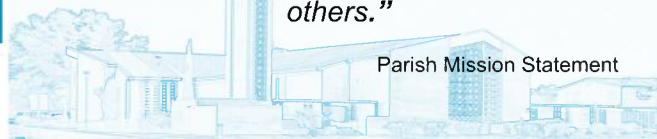

Baptisms—Baptismal arrangements must be made by the PARENTS of the child at the Parish Office. Parents and godparents *must* attend a baptismal preparation class before the baptism. Other requirements will be discussed at the initial interview.

Matrimony—Weddings are celebrated throughout the year. In accord with Church Law, at least one of the parties to be married must be a member of St. Joseph, otherwise special permissions are needed. Marriage preparation is to begin at least 6 months prior to the wedding. It is strongly recommended that a couple planning to be married at St. Joseph contact the Parish before making any contractual arrangements with a facility for their reception. During the initial interview with the priest of the Parish, the couple will be provided with all the necessary information needed for their preparation experience.

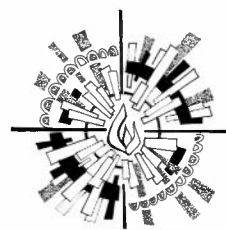

Are we a blessing to others? When I was in the seminary, oftentimes, I would be asked to work during conferences to set up cocktails, tend bar and serve food. As the guests arrive, they would all be totally engaged in their conversations that no one would notice how much preparation was made. As would I go around passing food, they would just take them without as much as a 'thank you'. After the event, I would have to clean up, wash the plates and wine glasses and put everything away. My satisfaction would be to know that it went well and the guests enjoyed themselves. Thankfully, I realized that it was my service - the "unknown and unacknowledged factor" - that led to their enjoyment.

Our Gospel this week speaks about us being the "salt of the earth and the light of the world". It is a great reminder that salt enhances the flavor of the food we so thoroughly enjoy without being visible at all. At times, its presence is taken for granted, but when absent, it is greatly missed.

Let our lives "enhance" those of others – most especially the people we love. We should not count the costs nor expect rewards. However, it should be incumbent upon the recipients of our loyalty and affection to acknowledge with gratitude that which they already enjoy.

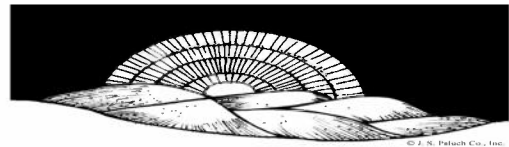
