

## FIRE CHARGES FOR CALL OUTS

As per our bylaw for fire call outs, the Village of B-Say-Tah will cover the first \$1000.00 of the call should you require the Fort Qu'Appelle fire department's assistance. You will be responsible for the remainder of the costs if any. A minimum of \$600.00 fee for the fire department to attend for the first hour, plus a \$200 fee per every hour after. Refer to our bylaws posted on the village website, and keep your insurance provider informed.

## YARD DEBRIS AND WASTE COLLECTION

Yard debris will be collected every Monday for the months of September and October to assist you with your yard clean up. Please have your debris bagged and out by 7am sharp to ensure pick up. Waste collection is every Tuesday at 7am sharp to ensure pick up.

Please have waste bagged and in a secure bin with secure lid to keep wildlife out.

# PREVENTION OF UNWANTED RODENTS

Recently, there has been a few reports of rats sited in the village. Our pest control officer has been working diligently to prevent/ eradicate any future problems. Rat colonies will send out "scouts" this time of year and in the spring to look for new harborage. If they find food source and harborage they go back to colony to collect a harem start their new colony. A colony can swell up to over 1000 in one year. If you see one you may have a problem, they can live anywhere as long as you provide shelter and food. Please read the following tips to prevent a potential problem:

- Get rid of rubbish piles and old buildings.
- Eliminate food like bird seed/grain/garbage and water sources.
- Cut grass around buildings.
- Use Peppermint essential oil, citronella, and caster oil to keep rats/mice away
- Eliminate any holes or openings on buildings, even as small as a loonie
- Skirting around any sheds, preferably metal
- Rodent repellant spray
- Traps along walls of buildings

• Put out bate boxes on property to bate/kill any scouts that initially come into your yard to prevent a potential problem

- Call village office immediately if you think you may have a problem
- Own a cat or dog if possible
