ARC Director of Operations Report

September 2, 2021

1. Members are getting better about mask wearing but staff are constantly reminding some to wear their mask over their nose. No one has been asked to leave in more than a month but warnings have been made to a few. Kudos to Jan Handel for volunteering in the Café and her fearlessness for confronting members if they enter without a mask.
2. David Hopper at McLean County Department of Health replied to my overtures to host vaccine booster clinics. He is interested in using ARC and we are willing to host on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays in the Rec Room and staging in the Dining Room and Kitchen. He has invited us to meet and discuss their plans and we would have to draft a Memorandum of Understanding outlining the use of the facility. They have tentatively reserved October 28, 2021 and January 12, 2022 for booster clinics due to Grossinger Arena being unavailable.
3. The ARC shuttle van has resumed transporting members and we are seeing an increase in ridership now that Bingo has returned. We will need to continue to monitor usage and encourage the members who use it to be flexible in the times they want to come to ARC.
4. My work with ECIAAA allows me a chance to have ongoing contact with a small group of ARC members to assess the degree of social isolation among the group using the UCLA Loneliness Scale. I'm pleased with the conversations I am having and hearing that isolation is minimal considering the impact of the pandemic. Illinois Assistive Technology Program (ITAP) released a report on the outcomes of the iPad program we participated in. Anyone interested in this can let me know and I can forward an electronic copy.
5. The 50+ News and Views September 2021 features an article on ARC, our Grand Reopening, capital campaign launch, and National Senior Center Month. Sammi Scott did a wonderful job capturing each of these elements in a two-page spread on pages 8-9 along with a banner of photos highlighting ARC programs.
6. Planning is beginning for our Annual Veteran's Day Recognition and Wall Dedication program. I will be meeting with ARC member Colonel Terrinoni, American Legion Post representative Butch Ekstam and the planning group on September 8 to discuss preliminary plans for the program and Veteran's Wall Dedication.
7. The ECIAAA held their monthly Advisory Board meeting on September 1. I reported on the happenings in McLean County with an emphasis on COVID positivity rates (4.4% as of August 24); plans for booster clinics in the county; and operations at ARC. ECIAAA will also host their strategic planning meeting on September 15 at the ISU Alumni Center. I will be attending in my capacity as an advisory board member.
8. On September 15 (time TBD) Paula Basta, Director for the Illinois Department on Aging will be attending the luncheon at the strategic planning meeting for the ECIAAA. After lunch, Paula has asked to visit ARC to tour the facility and learn about our facility, programs and services. I will be escorting Paula from the luncheon and welcoming her to ARC. We will have an opportunity to showcase ARC and increase our visibility to the senior network.

Meeting called to order by Chair Kossman at 9:30 AM

Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the minutes of the July 1st, 2021 meeting made by Deborah Shaw and seconded by Carol Plotkin. Motion passed.

Report from Chair

Chair Kossman shared what he had been hearing from some ARC members from Lexington who were unhappy about not being refunded their \$30 membership cost last year. ARC did offer refunds last year for those who requested them, but the time has passed to receive a refund now that ARC is open.

Member Updates & Committee Reports

Uday Deoskar, Health & Wellness – No report

Rich Farr, Fundraising – Living Memorial Fund total as of the end of July is \$91,579. The foundation also tracks green space and building fund donations. The 2019 campaign raised \$31,797. 2020 raised \$9,192, and 2021 raised \$7,832 to date. The quilt raffle also raised \$2,649. Campaign totals over 3 years - \$51,470. The Living Memorial Fund will have \$40,108 after subtracting what was raised for Build the ARC Campaign projects.

Margaret Ann Hayden, Welcoming Committee – Next Member Orientation event scheduled for August 31st at 2 PM.

Carol Plotkin, Blood Drive Updates – The drive on July 21st collected 37 units. The upcoming blood drive on August 19th for Bloomington Normal police and firefighters runs from 8 AM to 6

PM and will have 2 volunteer shifts. Summer is a tight time for blood donations, but the blood bank is not as low it once was.

Leonard Ross – Questioned if ARC had a Twitter presence, and if not, why. Supervisor Grammer explained that social media takes a lot of time to update and monitor, and with the many record keeping rules that government bodies must follow, it becomes even more complicated, so the township has focused solely on Facebook for social media at this time. Even with all the staff efforts on Facebook, only about a quarter of members follow ARC there. The center still relies heavily on email, postal mail, and phone calls to connect with members.

Leonard reported he is currently dropping newsletters off at 6 doctor's office in the area.

Faye Sanders – No report

Deborah Shaw – Peace Meal is still making home deliveries and are in need of volunteer drivers. Deb is doing 38 meal deliveries herself. Peace Meal was originally going to return to ARC in August, but due to the mask requirement now in place, they decided to wait a little longer. The township is continuing discussions with OSF on the return of the congregate meal site.

Barbara Singer - No report

Report from Township Supervisor Sarah Grammer

The Normal Township Board held a special meeting in July to discuss the green space project cost estimate from Farnsworth Group. Cathy Bilow had recommended using crushed granite for the walkways, but it is now very expensive, and with the binder required to keep the product in place, may no longer be permeable. They now recommend a permeable paver. The township has requested to remove the water feature from the plans for a \$12,000 savings and move forward with the plan using permeable pavers. Cost estimate is now expected to be around \$150,000. A bid announcement is scheduled to be issued on 8/17/21 with the pre-bid process on 8/24/21 and bids due 9/13/21 if plans continue on schedule. The township hopes for competitive bids to come in from several local companies.

Chair Kossman's wife and other master naturalists have said they would be interested in volunteering to help with upkeep of the green space. Linda Woith began volunteering to help with the landscaping around the building again after Rick placed the new mulch in the beds.

We are requiring masking at ARC again in an effort to do whatever is necessary to keep the center open.

The August Township Board meeting will include a presentation of the fiscal year 2021 audit. The public may join in person or on Zoom. Grant applicants will also be looked at during this meeting.

Sarah announced Director of Operations Rick Lewis' upcoming retirement after his 3-year anniversary in January. He would like to retire no later than March. The Township Board will discuss the hiring process and will hopefully to begin the hiring process in January. It has been exciting to have a Director who is a senior, an ARC member, and a former ARC volunteer leading the center through many big events over the past three years, including the pandemic and the vaccine clinics.

ARC Staff Reports

Molly Camper, Program Highlights - Report attached. August brings two new exercise classes that are focused on cardio and strength training. There will be a morning and evening class. Programs that have returned include Books on the Go with the Normal Public Library, Rita Meland's Music Enrichment Series, and the Caregiver Support Group with Sugar Creek and CCSI. Lucy will be adding back her Fit & Fabulous class when masks are no longer required. Collette Vacations will be doing a travel presentation on the trip to Iceland that is now scheduled for next February.

130 people attended the outdoor concert in July. The Curbside Grillin food truck was well-attended and did better than they estimated they would. They would be happy to return for future events.

Instructors were able to choose if they wanted to continue with August classes with masks or postpone. Lucy, Cecile and Ada chose to postpone. The classes that returned with masks are going well. Food will be eliminated from any programs for the time being.

Rick Lewis, Director of Operations Report - Report attached. Thanked Sarah and Steve for their confidence in him. Will be around in the fitness center and assisting with the transition when he retires. Masks being reinstated has led to challenges as there have been many members resistant to masks. Escorted one member out for refusal to wear a mask, but hopes to be able to welcome them back in the future.

The September issue of 50+ News & Views will feature an article on ARC's accomplishments over the last year as well as information on the September campaign and programming.

There are concerns about members moving around chairs as it is a risk for injury and a nuisance when members don't put chairs back where they were found. Rick asked that no members move chairs but rather speak with staff if they need a more accommodating seat.

ECIAAA requires assessments every 2 months with the UCLA Loneliness Scale done by phone or in person for those who scored high in loneliness and isolation on ARC's previous survey. Most scores are still falling in the mid-range with these members still feeling left out. Follow up calls continue.

Elicssha Sanders, Member Services - Report attached. Memberships remain steady especially considering the mask requirement. Members would rather wear a mask and be at the center than not be at the center. Memberships continue to increase, just not as quickly as they had been prior

to the mask requirement. The number of visits has been between 180 and 250 Monday through Thursday and 100-120 on Saturdays with 10-20 arriving between 6:30 AM and 8 AM and similar numbers in the evening. Those who attend early morning or in the evening are often those who still work during the day. Offering programming during these hours helps bring people in at these times.

Samantha Scott, Communications and Fundraising Update - Report attached. Gave update on bingo and coffee sponsorships. There are 19 bingo dates left to fill for 2022 and 6 months in 2022 to fill for coffee sponsorships. September 2021 through January 2022 and May of 2022 are filled for coffee sponsorships. The next dine and donate will be at Portillo's on September 30th from 4 – 8 PM.

New Business

- A. **Discussion of ARC operations:** McLean County is now considered to be a high transmission area with over 100 new cases of COVID-19 per day. This means masks are required indoors at ARC. Many cases are now in younger people, so thank you to those at ARC who got vaccinated and are doing what they can to keep others safe. An impact to some has potential to be an impact to all. Would be willing to use ARC to administer booster shots if asked to do so.

Update from Chair Kossman on what he is hearing from his doctors: number of people hospitalized is going up precipitously, and 25% of those cases are in breakthrough cases. Haven't seen deaths in breakthrough cases.

ARC's Grand re-opening event will be held Saturday, September 18th from 10 AM – 12 PM. The advisory committee members are encouraged to attend and bring others and to help give tours at the event.

- B. **Discussion of fundraising:** September is National Senior Center Month and the month of ARC's big fundraising effort. In years past, we have asked for members to consider donating \$30 sometime in the 30 days of September in order to help keep building ARC. Money raised this year will again go towards the new outdoor patio and greenspace renovations.

Discussion of whether there was still a need for a separate foundation (ARC Living Memorial Fund). Points made include:

Confusion from members about where / to which entity their donations are going.

Should make it as easy as possible for people to give and for staff to handle donations.

Some people may not want to donate money to a government entity.

Donations to directly to the ARC via the Township are tax deductible, in the same way donations to the 501(c)3 are.

Donations have gone from just a couple thousand dollars raised prior to ARC opening and the forming of the LMF to over \$91,000 in just under 6 years, but this is due to ARC staff developing and running large fundraisers to help ARC.

Is it possible for the Living Memorial Fund to set up a merchant account so that credit card gifts can be taken at ARC for the LMF. (Concerns with losing donations possibly when having to send people home to make the donation through the website if they wanted to give to the LMF with a credit card and don't have the cash on hand to make donation that way.)

What is most important is to give people confidence in donating in support of ARC, ensuring they know what entity they are donating to, who is responsible for the money, and how decisions are made about its use.

Discussed leaf and brick options for donations: Sarah is working on finding a brick mason to provide insight on how to construct the Brick by Brick Memorial Wall so that it is structurally sound.

The LMF needs to consider increasing the donation amount for a brick as prices for engraving have increased over time. Considering \$150 contribution for a brick.

Have not been charged for Giving Tree leaf engraving since the tree was installed but will likely have to pay a fee in the future when Randy Reid from ISU is no longer doing the engraving. Should be a small cost overall. The Giving Tree is a strong fundraising opportunity.

Other ideas for fundraising opportunities mentioned were gifts in wills and engraving plaques on the auditorium chairs. To date, the Living Memorial Fund has not received any gifts by way of a person's will.

Sammi requested advisory committee members help in securing raffle items for the grand re-opening event on September 18th.

**ARC Director of Operations Report by Rick Lewis
August 5, 2021**

1. Attendance continues to increase over the month and revenue from membership renewals, new members, and paid activities continue to come in. Saturdays are picking up with this past July 24 and noted more than 200 members attended. Coffee service and the Peace Meal program was scheduled to return in August but the changes in McLean County mitigation is making this a challenge to predict when these will return.
2. Managers have begun planning September programming to celebrate National Senior Center Month and kick off the capital campaign. ARC member Faye Andris approached us about submitting an article in the 50 Plus News and Views magazine to highlight ARC and our contributions to healthy aging and accomplishments over the year to help with attracting new members and encourage renewals. The magazine is doing direct mailing and will target an audience we don't typically reach. Sammi has written an article for ARC and submitted along with an ad.
3. The ARC shuttle van has resumed transporting members and ARC volunteer George Wilson has been hired to drive. Four members have been riding. We'll have to monitor the service when ridership increases and riders are spread out in the community. I was able to drive the van for riders on Thursday, July 8 to get a sense for what the route and experience is like for the driver and riders. New guidelines were distributed to reflect the changes in this operation.
4. Mulching around the ARC is almost complete thanks to ARC member Bob Hannah, Sarah and her two children. We are happy to see Linda Woith has returned to help with weeds and trimming. There are a few areas that need significant weeding before mulching and I will coordinate this as soon as my schedule allows.
5. SHIP counselors are prepared for walk-in appointments for Medicare counseling. None has occurred. Paul reported he had a total of 42 calls/contacts between June 1 – July 20. Of these, 25 were referred to counselors. The group is also preparing presentations for Medicare for August 14 at 10am in the auditorium. The August newsletter lists two additional presentations: September 7 at 1:00pm on Medicare Advantage and September 23 at 10:00am on Prescription Drugs.
6. The State of Illinois requires employees and volunteers to participate in annual Sexual Harassment training. ARC staff and Township employees and trustees, and SHIP counselors have completed training.
7. George Wiman and I have nearly completed training for all participants in the Echo Show device program. Next steps are ongoing one on one training on tips for using the devices. George is volunteering to come to ARC once a week to meet with members as needed. He hopes to be more involved as he gets closer to his retirement.
8. I am continuing to reach out to our senior network to identify a trainer for staff to participate in Mental Health Issues for Seniors due to pandemic.
