#### WHAT A GREAT PROBLEM TO HAVE!

THE ALEDO UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

In the July Parish Visitor, I shared the vision that God had laid heavily on my heart during my surgical recovery. At the end of that article, I invited you to do two things over the rest of this summer:

- 1. pray about what God is calling us to and
- 2. buckle up and hang on- it's going to be a GREAT ride!

Well, we are racing ever closer to autumn and a new season in the church. Traditionally, Fall- beginning after Labor Day- is when the Church "gets back to business"- vacations are over, school has started and it's time to fall back into the "school year schedule".

But a unique and marvelous thing has happened this summer. Usually, church attendance drops over the summer. (I mean, you can't get BACK to church if you haven't LEFT church, right?!) But this summer, Sunday morning attendance has been amazing. Over the nine Sundays of June and July, 6 of them saw attendance over 200. We have had MARVELOUS worship services and MARVELOUS attendance this summer. It is SO exciting.

Another consideration is that traditionally, attendance rises in the fall. So if we are seeing 220 folks a week worshipping together on Sundays in July, what will we see in September, October and beyond, after attendance has grown and after the new Sunday evening service launches? (See accompanying article.) Again, it is SO exciting!

Attendance growth just for the sake of attendance growth is not a healthy thing. The emphasis shifts to nothing more than numbers and the true reason for the whole venture- to connect people to Jesus Christ- gets lost in the shuffle. But if attendance growth is tied DIRECTLY to the vision of connecting people to Jesus Christ, then it is a GREAT thing! If connecting 200 people/ week to Jesus Christ is a good thing (and it is!), then connecting 300/week is 50% better!

The truth is that there are a LOT of congregations who would love to have these kinds of problems. We are blessed to be wrestling with issues of growth. When we are faithful in a few things, God gives us more. And He appears to be doing just that! WE have been faithful in that to which God has called us thus far. And so...He is calling us to more. I personally can't think of a better place to be. What about you? Are you ready to see what God has in store for The Aledo United Methodist Church?

#### **CURRENT SERMON SERIES**

On Sunday, June 22, we began a new sermon series- my FIRST since returning! The series is called <u>The Psizzlin' Psummer Psalm Psermon Pseries</u>. Psalms are religious poems or songs, designed to be set to music. Some are hymns to be sung by a congregation. Some are private prayers. Some are lyrical devices for remembering major events in Israel's history. The Book contains 150 psalms, making it the longest book in the Bible, based on number of chapters. Every human emotion, every circumstance of daily life are captured in these 150 chapters.

This 11-week series will carry us through the rest of the summer...AND through the trials and tribulations, the highs and lows of life. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

- Sunday, August 3, 2014- Thank You! (Psalm 100) Shout for joy- the Lord is good! (1Chronicles 16:31-35, Hebrews 12:28)
- Sunday, August 10, 2014- <u>Surely the Presence</u> (Psalm 121) God is our source of help. (Jeremiah 31:10-12, Philippians 4:4-7)
- Sunday, August 17, 2014- <u>Faith Like a Child</u> (Psalm 131) We are called to be child-like, but not childish. (Hosea 11:1-4, Romans 8:12-17)
- Sunday, August 24, 2014- The Cave (Psalm 142)
  A Place to hide...or a hiding place? (Isaiah 2:19-21, 2Corinthians 4:1-3)
- Sunday, August 31, 2014- Better Than a Hallelujah! (Psalm 150)
  Praise God in every situation. (Isaiah 43:16-21, 1Peter 2:9-10)
  Join me every Sunday as we walk through the Book of Psalms...AND our lives!



#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

Summer is an interesting time in the life of a church. Folks go on vacation and are gone from Sunday morning worship. And when we miss Sunday morning worship...we often miss giving to the church that week. So offerings drop in the summer...but the bills do NOT! But did you know that most banks offer a "bill pay" feature that makes it easy to set up your regular church giving? You simply go to your bank's website, set up online banking and then set up a regular "bill pay" to the church. It's how my family makes our regular tithe and it is SO easy! I never have to worry about whether I brought the check book or not! It happens automatically...exactly the way I set it up to work!

What are your favorite things about your church? Is it the music? The worship services? The Sunday School program? The Bible studies? The Youth and Children's ministries? The Nursery? The prayer focus? The missional focus? What would you most like to see from your church? Increased outreach? More parking? Increased facilities? More music in the services?

However you answered these questions, those answers all take two things to make them happen: 1. Committed people willing to roll up their sleeves and do God's work, and 2. committed financial giving. Giving to your church is so much more than simply keeping the lights on and the doors open- it's an investment in God's ministries. Will you help your church reach out to more people; carry out more and greater ministries? Your faithful tithing can go a long way toward that goal. Please pray about how God is calling you to support your church financially. Consistent, generous giving enables your church to continue to provide the wide variety of ministries currently offered, as well as continue to expand our mission field.

#### **NEW WORSHIP SERVICE- WHAT'S "THE POINT"?**

by Rev. Mark When I left Aledo on Tuesday, April 16<sup>th</sup> to travel to St. Louis for surgery, I left with a plan in place. Key people were identified and put in place to make sure that the ministries of The Aledo United Methodist Church would continue in my absence. A part of that plan included closing down the Sunday evening worship service. I had planned on shutting it down for the summer with the idea that it would be "re-tooled" and re-introduced in the fall. But with my surgery being moved up, the "shut-down" date got moved up as well. But now, as we move closer to the end of the summer and Labor Day, we also move closer to the re-boot of the Sunday evening worship service.

On Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup> at 6PM, **The Point** will debut. This new service is geared to be an alternative worship experience for folks IN our congregation who are gone for a weekend, work on Sunday morning or are simply looking for more opportunities to be involved in worship. It is also, however, aimed at folks within Mercer County who don't have a church home. We will regularly explore the question, "What's the point?" What's the point of faith, what's the point of a relationship with God, what's the point of life.

This new service will feature:

- a sermon that is DIFFERENT from Sunday morning-group discussion will be included
- weekly Communion
- shared leadership between myself and others who attend
- a "mission moment" as a weekly feature
- prayer time, include "thankful moments" and testimonies
- monthly sensory activities designed to involve more senses in faith development
- monthly "Take-Aways"- a rock, candle, pen, heart, hand, 3x5 card, etc. will be offered
- video clips

A postcard will be going out to everyone in the zip code later this month, letting them know about this and the other ministries of the church and inviting them to join us! What I invite YOU to do between now and then is this-spend August praying about the new service. Pray that it will help us connect more people to Jesus Christ. Also pray about YOUR involvement in the service. Is God calling you to be a part of the launch team? You could be involved in a) prayer support, b) worship design, c) logistics (parking, technology, set-up), d) child care, e) publicity/invitations and f) hospitality/discipleship of newcomers.

If you feel led to be a part of the launch team, just let me know. God is doing GREAT things- will you be a part of this newest addition?

#### ALEDO UMW FOOD PANTRY OPPORTUNITY

At the last Executive Board meeting of the UMW, there was a unanimous vote to have a "Christmas in August" food drive to support the Churches of Mercer County Food Pantry. We know when the women of this church get behind a project, amazing things happen.

Summer donations have been down at the Food Pantry, and usage is up. 240 family units used the Pantry in May, and 220 used it in June. Families may go only once a month to pick up their food.

At the present time, the following items are most greatly needed: brownie mixes, pears, mandarin oranges, chicken noodle soup, cream of mushroom/chicken soups, chunky soups, chili beans, green beans, whole kernel and cream style corn, canned potatoes, pork & beans, diced tomatoes.

Each Sunday in the month of August donations will be accepted at church. A case of one item would be wonderful. An assortment of items would be super. Only a few cans of some items would be greatly appreciated, too. Financial donations are also accepted.

This is an opportunity for our Aledo UMC to truly step up to help those in need. Let's all support this worthwhile project of "Christmas in August".

Just a scene from Snow White, right? Or perhaps there is a deeper connection to your life than you have previously considered?

Yes, I know that there are times when we all feel Bashful or Happy or even Grumpy, but our culture is consumed with mirrors and we desire that they tell us that we are indeed the "fairest of them all."

If this weren't the truth, then why, pray tell me, are we a nation way beyond obsession with body image? Billions of bucks on iron abs, makeup, hair styling, fad diets and our joy reduced to a daily assessment of how we're doing as we size each other up.

Face it, we are a culture that is a slave to the mirror, and anyone and everyone who is thinner, shapelier, more muscular, or "prettier" (whatever that means!) automatically becomes the object of our envy – our own personal "Snow White."

No, we don't hire a huntsman to make sure they are fallen and they can't get up, but we do allow the mirror to haunt our thoughts and steal the contentment that God intends for His sons and daughters.

And that's just it, isn't it? Apparently becoming a follower of Jesus does not automatically cure us of body image issues – otherwise the church wouldn't be as equally obsessed as our surrounding culture. (Newsflash: We Christians are just as obsessed – or perhaps even more!)

Yes, our body is the "temple of God," but we have turned the temple into an idol, and we have reduced the idea of being "fearfully and wonderfully made" to "skinniness and ripped achieved."

But God has a different plan for our lives. Jesus' death and resurrection broke the chains of body image, but you have to be willing to let go of them. Every magazine you read and Kardashian you admire is just another link in the chain that you are re-forging around your soul. So let these words soak into your psyche for a while:

So we do not set our sights on the things we can see with our eyes. All of that is fleeting; it will eventually fade away. Instead, we focus on the things we cannot see, which live on and on (2 Cor.\_4:18).


I believe the answer to our body image fixation has to do with our eyesight. We have been trained to "set our sights" on looking great and being the fairest of them all, but that is a trap from which there is no escape.

Instead, we should focus on the things that don't show up in the mirror, like godliness and becoming more like Jesus in our actions and attitudes. We need to shift our priorities away from sculpting and more towards sanctifying.

And perhaps most importantly, we need to internalize the truth that our "imperfections" are a part of God's design for getting our eyes off ourselves and on to the only Perfect One who gives our worth and value. The world is attracted to the Barbies and G.I. Joes, but that's the problem!
