From the Pastor's Desk...

I recently had the opportunity to visit and speak at El Camino Pines Camp in Frazier Park. I had never been to this camp before and was excited to have this opportunity to participate in their annual Family Winterfest. My arrival day started off by me leaving 40 minutes later than I had originally intended and then about an hour+ away from the camp, the roadway signs began to indicate an upcoming accident with the right 2 lanes in I-5 being closed. Then a few miles beyond that initial road sign, another sign said to expect a 1 hour delay. I quickly tried to see if there was an alternative route that I could off of I-5 and use some backroads to get to the camp but there were no alternatives. So, I along with countless others, crept along, slowly on I-5 and because I was on the mountain pass, I ended up not having any cell phone, so I couldn't make some phone calls to help pass the time (to clarify, my vehicle has the capability for hands-free phone calls). I finally made it to the road the camp was located on, except I missed the final turn and realized it about 1 mile later (as I had passed a snow gate, and there was snow up there, along with a lot of people sledding), so I was delayed even a bit more. I ended up arriving close to 2 hours later than I had originally intended yet still had a few hours before participants arrived.

Running late and unintentional delays...these are not unusual parts of our everyday lives, for some of us, they may be more frequently experienced than others but there are some things that we simply can't control and/or avoid (like slow traffic because of an accident up ahead). I share this recent experience because upon reflecting on it. I was struck by the immense difference between what I had experienced on the trip to the camp and my arrival at the camp. As soon as I stepped out of my vehicle and took a deep breath, I noticed the stillness and the beautiful scent of pine trees... I was truly in a different place. From the hundreds of vehicles on the busy interstate to the quietness of the slightly snow-covered ground of the camp. Such...A...Difference! What differences have you experienced lately? Were these differences welcomed or an intrusion? Were they planned or were they unexpected? God, through Jesus, makes a difference...to us, to the world. In this season of Epiphany, we hear stories in scripture of how Jesus came to be realized, made manifest, in the differences he makes to those he encounters. These differences that Jesus was making were both viewed as welcome and intrusion, as planned and unexpected...yet Jesus was not deterred. As we journey deeper into this season of Light, may our hearts, minds, ears, and eyes be opened to the differences that Jesus still makes in our lives and our world.
