Maifest, Your Fest, Our Fest Perfect Weather Predicted

It's going to be a perfect weekend to celebrate in the Colonies, so call your friends and head to Amana for all the festivities.

Here are some highlights: The Amana Maipole dancers will be performing traditional German spring dances and songs 7 p.m. Friday at Millstream Brewing. Co and Saturday and Sunday. Friday we should note the brewery is hosting a community party to kick off the even with Rock108 as they introduce their Maifest Maibock. Pilsner glasses celebrating this event will be available. Auntie Anne's pretzel truck will be there.

Saturday the Maipole dancers perform: 11a.m. after the parade outside the Festhalle; 11:45 at the Amana Heritage Museum; 12:15 in front of the Amana General Store; 2 p.m. outside the Festhalle; 2:30 in front of the Amana Meat Shop and Smokehouse; 3:15 final performance outside the Brau Haus.

Sunday they dance at 11 a.m. in front of the Amana Meat Shop and Smokehouse; 12:30 in front of the Amana General Store; 1:15 p.m. in front of the Festhalle; 2 p.m. by the Blumen Haus – Brau Haus. Should it rain all dances are in the Festhalle.

Once again this year volunteers for the Amana Heritage Society will be serving up hot, fresh potato pancakes (with a side of apple sauce) and traditional Obstkuchen at the Festhalle after the parade and Saturday till 4 p.m. All four of the Amana Heritage sites will be open on Saturday – including the new Homestead Folk Art site, so take your friends to see our sites.

Stop by the Ox Yoke Inn's front lawn for an eye-opening or virgin bloody mary or mimosa as you watch the parade. Can you Obst the Kuchen?

Obstkuchen is an old communal Amana kitchen house treat as it was an easy pie to whip up for 40 people with canned fruits from the cellar. Usually each person received one-half a pie so yes, for a kitchen serving 40 diners they made 20 pies.

There are a number of recipes in the community that folks favor, but here is the one that I have used from Wilma Rettig.

Mürbeteig (Tender crust fruit pie)

- 2 cups flour
- 1 envelope yeast (rapid rise is best. This would be 2 and ¼ teaspoons)
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- ¼ cup vegetable shortening (Crisco - do not use oil)
- ¾ cup milk, warmed

Combine flour, yeast, salt, baking powder and sugar. Cut in the shortening till pea-sized or so. Stir in warm (not hot) milk. Knead a bit with your hands. Divide dough into 2 equal parts. Grease bottom and sides of two pie pans. Using well-floured hands press dough into bottom and up sides of pie pan. Cover well and place overnight in refrigerator.

For filling:

3 cups fresh, frozen or canned fruit. If using frozen, allow to defrost and pat fruit till mostly dry. If using canned, drain well and pat fruit mostly dry.

1 cup granulated sugar (unless using canned fruit – that is usually sweet enough)

- 1 cup whole milk
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 medium to large-sized eggs, beaten

Remove crusts from refrigerator and allow to come to room temperature. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

Beat together all ingredients - except fruit. Arrange fruit in pie crusts. Pour custard over top. Do not overfill.

Bake pies for 10 minutes. Turn down the heat to 350 and bake 35 – 40 more minutes. Some fruits – like plums – seem to take a little longer, I've noticed. Custard should be firmly set and crust should be golden brown or slightly browned.

Cool before sprinkling top with powdered sugar. Recipe from Wilma Rettig and her Mom.
