
Public Works

2018 Street Repairs:

Over the next few months the City of Summerset will being doing street repairs to minimize future repair costs and repair damaged streets.

The main areas of repair will be all of Telluride Street for resurfacing. There will also be various street repairs on Brighton St, Leisure Ln, Kingsbury Ct. and Bellingham Dr.

During this time please be cautious of construction workers and equipment and also remember to obey the posted speed limit.

Polaris of the Black Hills has broken ground on their new 18,000 square foot building that includes a showroom, shop and offices. Keep an eye out for updates as construction progresses.

O'Reilly Auto Parts has broken ground. The foundation and floor are poured. The building has been delivered and should be going up shortly. GM Northrup, general contractor, is a little behind with concrete work due to the rain but expects to be back on track soon.



Summerset Waste Water Treatment Plant filter and SBR cover project is right on schedule. RCS Construction has the metal building about wrapped up and the piping process has begun. The SBR cover foundation has been poured. This project will help to ensure that our plant is running at maximum efficiency and protecting the environment for generations to come.

Code Enforcement

We would like to thank everyone for their continued efforts keeping their yards in compliance with the City Ordinances. We understand that with the amount of rain we have received lately, it has been difficult to find a time to mow or spray weeds if necessary.

When the weather allows, here are some Ordinance Violations to be aware of to ensure your property is in compliance:

- No tall grass or noxious weeds should be growing in yards, boulevards, or gravel parking areas.
- If you live next to a drainage ditch, it is your responsibility to mow down to the center of the drainage.
- If you live along Sturgis Road and have a privacy fence, it is your responsibility to take care of grass or weeds in between the two fences.
- Grass is not an approved parking surface for vehicles, utility trailers, or RV's.

Our goal with Code Enforcement is to follow City Ordinances and keep Summerset looking pleasant. If we come to your door, or send a letter, it's just a friendly reminder that you might be in violation of a particular ordinance. We don't intend to make people upset or single anyone out. If you have questions, feel free to call and ask. As the 4th of July approaches, I thought it would be a good idea to include the city ordinance and the state statute concerning fireworks for our area.

Summerset City Ordinance:

11.01.010 Fireworks

"Fireworks" means a device consisting of a combination of explosives and combustibles, set off to generate colored lights, smoke, and noise for amusement.

11.02.010 Restrictions


- I. It shall be **UNLAWFUL** for any **INDIVIDUAL**, firm, partnership or corporation to sell, store, possess for sale, use, **DISCHARGE OR CAUSE TO BE DISCHARGED**, except as hereinafter permitted, any fireworks.
- 2. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prohibit a public display and discharge of fireworks, providing such *licensed* individual, firm, partnership or corporation planning to make a public display and discharge of fireworks, shall first secure a written permit from the City of Summerset and Chief of the Fire Department upon which jurisdiction falls.
- 3. This Ordinance extends to and shall cover all of the territory within the corporate limits of the City of Summerset and its one mile jurisdiction, County of Meade, State of South Dakota.
- 4. Any violator of this ordinance is guilty of a **Class II misdemeanor**.

South Dakota State Statute:

34-37-11. Sale or use prohibited in forests, parks and other specified areas--Exception--Violation as misdemeanor. **No person may sell or cause to be sold, discharge, or cause to be discharged**, any pyrotechnics of any description or any consumer fireworks within the exterior boundaries of the Black Hills Forest Fire Protection District, and no person may discharge or cause to be discharged any pyrotechnics or consumer fireworks within a zone that extends three hundred feet beyond the exterior boundaries of the Black Hills Forest Fire Protection District in this state. No person may sell or cause to be sold, discharge, or cause to be discharged, any pyrotechnics of any description or any consumer fireworks within any national forest, national park, state forest, or any land owned or leased by the Department of Game, Fish and Parks. However, the Department of Game, Fish and Parks may, by written authorization, permit the discharge of pyrotechnics or consumer fireworks, pyrotechnic displays, sales, or exhibits on land owned or leased by the department unless otherwise prohibited by statute. Any violation of this section which occurs on any land owned or leased by the Department of Game, Fish and Parks is a Class 2 misdemeanor. **Any subsequent violation of this Section is a Class 1 misdemeanor**.

Summer Reading 2018


Preschool Summer Reading Storytimes are available every Thursday at 10:00 AM.

Our finale party will be July 28th from 10:00 to 11:30 AM! Join us for fun games, prizes, and themed treats!


Yoga at the Library
