### Leadership Team Report

The August Team meeting devotional began with a consideration of the word "epitaphs". It was pointed out that the epitaphs of many famous figures are gathered on one web site, and that besides making interesting, even amusing, reading, they often provide good food for thought. Parallel with that is the notion of the "dash" that will eventually appear between the birth and death dates on our grave markers. Through that, we conjure the guestion "What will we have done with the time on earth that our dash represents?" I was reminded of Dave Gehrum's sermon at Bethany a couple of years ago, the title of which was, in printed form, simply "—". Same idea, and we're urged to think about it. Life has been called a rat race, a feast, and a predicament, among other things. But let's remember that it's a priceless gift from God. How will we be remembered after we're gone? Well, for starters – and even mainly - by our deeds and words today. We consider those who have gone before us, folks who have influenced us positively. And very memorably. We can easily realize that their contributions to those around them were the ways they made their "dashes" worthwhile - and not that they much thought about it at the time. And then the UMC Board of Church and Location will come to talk with us about the financial as well as the logistical aspects of our restoration. All of this is rapid and very welcome progress as we commence to remake Bethany.

### From Pastor Bill's Study

#### Trustees Report...

Finally it feels like we are making progress toward the rebuilding of Bethany. During the past month the Leadership Team has:

- Reviewed the various options for the building layout presented by Hemmler and Camayd Architects. Of the options presented the Leadership Team recommended Option 3A, which keeps the sanctuary in the previous location but reorients it with the altar in what was previously the back of the sanctuary. With this orientation the congregation will be looking toward the beautiful stained glass on the Front Street wall. Where the organ and altar used to be will be a nursery and handicapped accessible restrooms. The Large Sunday School room will be the Fellowship Hall and the Elm Street Lounge will be converted to a kitchen. The recommendation of the Leadership Team will be presented to the congregation to approve during a special Church Conference Meeting on Monday, August 31 at 6:30 PM at West Milton UMC.
- Reviewed five proposals from potential Construction Managers for the rebuilding project. Of the
  five, Poole Anderson, with offices in State College and Harrisburg, was the low bidder at \$369,690.
  A meeting was held with representatives from Poole Anderson where they reviewed their proposal
  and answered questions. The Leadership Team members in attendance were impressed with
  their presentation and voted to contract with Poole Anderson to become the Construction
  Manager. A 'kick off' meeting with them has been scheduled for Thursday, August 20 at 10:00 AM
  at West Milton UMC.
- Reviewed the proposed layout for the new kitchen and made some decisions about the equipment that will be included. The plan incorporates the furnishings and equipment from the kitchen in the basement. Thanks to Bob Fitch for his work on pulling the information together.

"Share the Warmth" Coat Giveaway for October 2020: Since the fire we have lost most of our inventory of coats and winter items, which now we are in great need of them.



Milton Ministerium presents: "Milton Bridge Walk in the Spirit"




