### Trumpeter Comeback A Thing of Beauty

Iowa's trumpeter swan population has rebounded with gusto since the Iowa Department of Natural Resources initiated a restoration program in 1993.

This week the Iowa DNR released data about the trumpeter swan. According to the Iowa DNR, 158 active trumpeter nests have been spotted in the state - that's a 17 percent increase since 2022. The active nest count is from the most recent state-wide data collection period April through December, 2025.

The DNR has recorded more than 4,700 swans in the state of Iowa.

As Amana Colony residents can attest there have been between 150 and 300 trumpeter swans moving through or in residence here these past three years. That's huge since at one point in the 1930s there were fewer than 69 trumpeter swans in the entire continental United States. All of those swans were located in the Red Rocks National Wildlife Refuge in southwest Montana and there were no trumpeter swans in Iowa, though at one time they were native to Iowa.

Amana residents may recall 1993 – 1997 when the swam enclosure was built east of High Amana and amated pair of swans was brought to the enclosure to be fed and monitored by local volunteers working with Amana Society Forester Larry Gnewikow, the Amana Farms and the local DNR agents. The initial goal was to establish 15 nesting pairs in the state by 2003. Hatched cygnets from the nesting pairs in several enclosures around the state – including ours – were raised and then released.

At its height there were 50 enclosures located in the state where trumpeter swans were pair bonded and raising young. The program was paid for by Iowa's Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund, managed by the Iowa DNR.

Between 1995 and 2022 the Iowa DNR released over 1,218 swans in over 80 locations in the state. What's been remarkable is the number of swans who were born here in the Colonies, imprinted here, and made this area their home, returning season after season or staying here permanently. Swans do migrate but it appears that some stay here year-round while others return seasonally.

Taylor Ballard, wildlife research technician at the Iowa DNR's Clear Lake office, reported on the Iowa DNR website that the DNR asks its staff to observe

and record any trumpeter nests they see. Active nests, he said, average about 4 cygnets swans each nesting season. Of the 158 known nests, 98 successfully raised cygnets to adulthood.

More than 70 percent of the cygnets that reach their first adult autumn will survive until March, Ballard noted.

Trumpeter swans are North America's largest heaviest native bird weighing between 15 and 30 pounds; and its largest species of waterfowl with a wingspan of six feet to ten feet 2 inches.

### Beat the Brrrr Winterfest is Saturday Jan. 24

Winter comes alive Saturday, January 24, 2026, as the community hosts the 22nd Annual Amana Colonies Winterfest.

The day begins Saturday with the Amana Freezer 5K Run/Walk, starting gun at 10 a.m. on 48th Ave. in front of Hotel Millwright's Carding Studio. Race-day sign-ups and packet (t-shirt) pick up take place from 8:30–9:30 a.m. Please go to the Amana Winterfest website to sign up. This event is hosted as a fund raiser for the ongoing maintenance of the Amana Kolonieweg bike trail.

From 10 a.m.–4 p.m., visitors can enjoy free admission to the Amana Heritage Museum. Attend a special author talk and Q&A beginning at 1 p.m., featuring local authors R.C. Eichacker, author of Marriage by Committee: Marriage Customs of Early Amana and Melinda Wichman, author of How to Live with a Ghost. Books will be available for purchase and signing.

Also beginning at 10 a.m., adults 21+ can participate in the popular Amana Colonies Winterfest Wine & Beer Walk from 10 a.m.–4 p.m., sampling beverages at Ackerman Winery, Fireside in the Village, Millstream Brewing Co., Village Winery, and White Cross Cellars. Participants can pick up their \$5 Wine & Beer Walk Passport at any participating business, collect stamps at each stop, and return completed passports to the Amana Visitors Center by 5 p.m. to receive a commemorative Winterfest wine glass (limited to the first 275 participants) and be entered to win one of five \$25 gift certificates.

Market Barn becomes the heart of Winterfest activity with the chili feed and activities beginning at 11 a.m. The Amana Fire Department will serve open-fire chili, hot chocolate, and cider while supplies last, with proceeds benefiting the department. From 11 a.m.–2 p.m., guests can take part in classic Winterfest favorites, including the Great Amana Ham-Put, sponsored by the Amana Meat Shop, and the Wreath Toss, with winners announced following the Beard Contest. From 12–2 p.m., teams of two can compete—or participate for fun—in the Log Sawing Competition hosted by Amana Forestry, using an old-fashioned cross-cut saw. First-place plaques will be awarded in the Co-ed, Women, and Men categories. Throughout the afternoon, visitors can also watch chainsaw artist Bob Ward in action during the Colony Carvers demonstration and take home a one-of-a-kind carved piece.
