The School Board adopted the draft of the 2017-18 School Budget on April 6th. The budget maintains all programs with minor faculty changes. The Association will be actively supporting this year's budget. There are two seats open for this year's Board of Education election. Only one candidate reached out the Teachers Association for an endorsement and after a thorough interview I am pleased to announce the endorsement of Lori Montgomery for School Board Trustee.



In an era of constant attacks on public education it is important that we speak with one voice to support our communities. The LBPAC will be sending out a list of all the school board candidates in Nassau and Suffolk that have been endorsed by NYSUT locals. Individual locals often stick their necks out to endorse particular candidates for very real reasons. On May 16th, I urge each of you, your families and your friends to go to the polls and vote "yes" on your school district's budget and for "pro-education" candidates for school boards.

G. Pay Options

Each year you have three pay options:

- 21 equal bi-weekly payments (September through June),
- 25 payments; 21 payments (September through June) + 4 payments on the last day of school
- 26 payments; you will receive 1/26 of your annual salary every two weeks from the first pay date in September through the last pay date in June when you will receive the remaining paychecks as separate checks, all dated June 30, which you may deposit at any time from June to August. Direct deposit will not be available for the last six paychecks. All deductions will be spread out over the 26 pay checks.

To elect an option other than the one you currently have; you must enroll prior to June 30 and the new option may not be changed until the start of the following school year. The form is available online at: [Pay Options](#)

H. Annual Turn-In of Sick Days

If you have accumulated at least 75 sick days and wish to exercise your option of selling back unused sick days earned this year (up to 12 or 14 if you worked at Summer School) you must submit a “[Request for Payment in Exchange For Accumulated Unused Sick Days](#)” form to Dr. Natali’s office. The rate is \$94.22 per day. Please be aware that you can accumulate up to 200 days in your sick day bank. Any days in excess of 200 should be sold back to the district.

I. Packing and Unpacking

If you are directed to pack up your room in anticipation of construction, summer school or summer camp you are entitled to be compensated for your efforts. The rate is \$25.14 per hour. However, your claim cannot exceed \$100. The work must be done outside of the school day and a record kept of the dates and times you worked.

J. Summer Study Money

There is one more opportunity to participate in the Study Program, Summer- May 12, 2017. Members with permanent or professional certification may apply for up to \$1,750 in study money per semester. Request for [Participation in Study Program Group A](#)

K. Continuing Teacher and Leader Education (CTLE) Registration

All members who hold a permanent or professional certificate in classroom teaching, educational leadership service or a Level III Teaching Assistant certificate must apply for initial registration during the 2016-2017 school year during his/her month of birth and must renew every five years through the [TEACH](#) system.

H. Teacher Center—John Marr

1. NYS has released funding letters to the LEA and I am proud to announce that the Long Beach Teacher Center grant has been raised from \$28,000 to \$39,078. As a result the LBTC will be able to expand its course offerings and address teacher needs.
2. Thank you for everyone who responded to my request for course proposals for next year. At this point the Center has numerous classes that will be set up for a late September start. We will be providing staff with a calendar of course offerings on the first day of school next year.
3. There will be a virtual open house at the Middle School on Tuesday, May 16 at 4:00pm for those interested in starting a new Stony Brook Google Apps three-class cluster. These are nonmatriculated graduate classes that focus on becoming a Certified Teacher and Trainer for Google.

III. Executive Vice President's Report—Karen Bloom

A. APPR

1. It has been reported to me that many teachers at the high school are not receiving timely feedback, if at all. Remember, there are timelines for administrators. If you do not receive your feedback within the time required and your feedback is negative, we can discuss having that observation removed.
2. As we approach the end of the year, be sure that your supervisor has made it clear how your APPR score will be calculated.

4. Feel free to contact me if you have specific concerns regarding APPR.

B. Health & Safety Committee

1. ESCO Status
 - a) Honeywell is gathering data and doing performance tests to see what reduction in energy costs they could provide.
 - b) BOE will decide if they are going to move forward with this plan. These savings may be able to fund other projects that need to be completed.
2. HVAC
 - a) The Band room unit at the HS was installed, air testing was done, ceiling tiles were replaced and cabinets were installed. The school district will get some aid next year, since this was an emergency project
 - b) We have a contract with Cunningham to service our air handling units. The remaining units will be cleaned and Mr. DeVito is getting estimates for cleaning of the ducts. We sincerely hope that the district will choose to clean these very important ducts that lead into classrooms, offices and other spaces that students and teachers spend time in.
 - c) We are also awaiting the balance report which will show how well our air is circulating.

3. Windows (Lindell and East)
 - a) There is still an issue with litigation regarding the windows. Mr. DeVito said that he will devote some time to this to try to close the issue. He promised that if it was not addressed by the summer, the district will take the money and do it regardless of the litigation.
 - b) In addition, door chucks are no longer allowed to be used. Doors must remain closed.
 - c) Mr. DeVito said that to help combat the heat and stagnant air, he would assist in the purchasing of fans. Please put requests into your building principals ASAP.
4. Traffic Patterns
 - a) HS/Lido Complex-We have no date as of yet, but were told that the studies will be done in May.
5. If you have any Health and Safety issues that you are unable to resolve at the building level, please email me at kbloom@lbeach.org.

C. District Safety Team

1. High School
 - a) Lockdowns-After much discussion, it was decided that someone must come to your door to release you, rather than using the announcements and an “all clear”.
 - b) Cafeteria-Mr. Irwin was asked to bring back information to the administrative team to discuss putting a sample of bullet resistant film on one of the windows to see if that would be acceptable.
2. Active Shooters Drill
 - a) After completing the drill at Lindell, it was confirmed that a lockdown is the best and safest bet. Even if you think that you can run out and escape, don't! Stay in the room until you are released.
 - b) All building staff should be involved in all drills and trainings. The district plans to attempt to hold these drills in each building.
 - c) The transportation department will need to develop a separate plan.
3. Keys
 - a) The district got a quote of \$375,000 to make all locks and doors the same throughout the district.
 - b) This information will be forwarded to the BOE to determine whether or not they will move forward.
4. Security Booths
 - a) East-The vestibule is in progress and they are hoping to be finished shortly.
 - b) HS-Mr. Grillo is working on the drawings. Mr. DeVito gave approval in February so he will follow up to check on progress.
5. Other
 - a) It was discussed that administration at Lindell would like to have a single point of entry during school hours due to the large amount of traffic in and out of the building.
 - b) The leaks at West will be reviewed by the BOE as well to see if they will be part of the capital projects. We truly hope that these will be addressed, as every time it rains, many classrooms are affected.
 - c) All staff was reminded to wear ID's.
 - d) If you have any Safety issues that you are unable to resolve at the building level, please email me at kbloom@lbeach.org.
