



2021 SE Spokane County Fair Cancelled

The Southeast Spokane County Fair board members voted unanimously to cancel the 77th annual fair, scheduled for September 24th-26th, 2021.

Despite thorough planning for this year’s fair, the SESCOF board determined that to hold a successful, safe, and traditional event is impossible, given expected state and county requirements.

In addition, our organization is experiencing a lower volunteer count than years past. A few of our larger events were already cancelled prior to this final decision. An event of this size requires many hours of planning and a significant number of behind the scenes help.

Most importantly, we want to ensure the safety of our volunteers and our community at-large.

With the rise in COVID cases and impact on our hospital systems, we felt it was best to delay our event another year.

This was an extremely difficult decision to make, and in fact we had gone forward with plans for the fair until this recent change in mandates. The board is again devastated by this determination, but is confident it was made with complete and thoughtful consideration of all options.
