Blackjack dealer questions

receive many questions from blackjack players; some involve interactions with blackjack dealers. Here are a few that you might find interesting and educational.

Should you tip a blackjack dealer, and if so, how much?

There isn't any rule that says you must tip a blackjack dealer, just like there are no rules that say you must tip a waiter or taxi driver. However, let's be realistic, we all know that many hard-working folks who work in the service industry have a low base salary and that they depend upon tips from customers to make ends meet. When I go to a restaurant, whether I tip my server and how much depends upon the service I get. It should be the same for blackjack dealers.

Unfortunately, I've run into some surly blackjack dealers over my 40year playing career. You know the type...gruff, disagreeable, irritable, grumpy, unhelpful, never smiling, and making you feel uncomfortable when you play. My tip for them is nada. I have even been known to tell them specifically what they are doing wrong and to correct it. If a dealer is extremely obnoxious (I've actually had one call me an asshole for not leaving a tip), then I will seek out the pit boss and tell them about the discourteous dealer. On the other hand, if a dealer has been friendly, courteous, and helpful, I will leave a tip. How much? Because I play with an advantage, I know how much my theoretical hourly profit is and I usually tip no more than 25% of this. (I also wait until the count is in my favor before making a bet for the dealer.) If you are a basic strategy player and you want to tip a friendly dealer, my recommendation is to tip a few dollars if you are a \$5 or \$10 bettor, and tip \$5 if you are a \$25 bettor. (See next question.)

Does it make a difference how you tip the dealer? I'm asking because sometimes I see players make a tip for the dealer on their hand while others just leave some chips for the dealer after they are done playing. I think it's important that you let the dealer know early in your session that if they are friendly and helpful that you will be tipping them. Therefore, if they're friendly from the get-go, I'd make a bet for them on your hand (now they know that if they continue the behavior you expect, they will probably be rewarded with more tips). However, I don't recommend that you place the chip(s) you want to bet for the dealer on the outside of your betting spot (most players do this). Instead, you should place the chip(s) you want to bet for the dealer on top of your chips and inside the betting circle. The reason is if you place the chip(s) outside of the betting circle, you have no control over them. If the hand wins, the dealer will keep the



chip(s) you bet for her plus the corresponding winning chips. If you place the chip(s) on top of your chips inside the betting circle, you still own them, meaning the dealer only gets to keep the winning chip(s) or whatever you choose to give to them. Usually, I let the chip(s) that I bet for the dealer ride on the next hand. If I win a few hands in a row, it gives the perception that I'm a big tipper. In addition, by placing the chip(s) you bet for the dealer on top of your wagered chip(s), the additional amount will count toward your rating.

"The dealer made a dealing mistake, which caused me to lose. Their supervisor wouldn't correct the mistake. I felt cheated and I'll never play at that casino again."

Normally, if a dealer makes an error in dealing the cards or in a payoff, they are supposed to bring it to the attention of their supervisor. The floor supervisor has the responsibility to correct the mistake. In most cases, the supervisor will give the benefit to the players because they want to maintain them as customers. However, if you believe that the supervisor hasn't corrected the mistake to your satisfaction, you should tell the supervisor that you would like to speak to the pit (or shift) boss. I would plead your case at this level, including asking the pit or shift supervisors to review the tapes of the table so they can see the mistake made by the dealer.

Big bad-beat jackpot

According to PokerNews.com, the second largest bad-beat jackpot in history was triggered at the Casino du Lac-Leamy in Quebec in April. The pot was for C\$2.5 million (approximately US\$1.81 million) and fell just shy of the record jackpot, also hit in Quebec, of C\$2.6 million (US\$1.87 million), at Playground Casino in August 2023. According to the rules at Lac-Leamy, quad 10s or better must lose the hand, with both the players' down cards involved. The board showed the 9 and 10 of spades and the 10, J, and K of hearts. One player held a pair of 10s for 4-of-a-kind, the other the 9 and Q of hearts for the straight flush. As for the split, 40% of the jackpot (C\$1,005,421/US\$726,000) went to loser of the hand (quad 10s), 20% (C\$502,711, US\$363,000) to the winner, 20% (C\$84,000/US \$60,000) evenly split among the other players at the table, and the remaining 20% (C\$13,000/US\$9,400) among everyone else seated in a

poker game at the time. A total of 46 players at five tables participated in the jackpot and one, who posted a few photos on Reddit, had sat down at his table less than a minute earlier.



Announced last year, Mega Millions ticket prices have more than doubled, from \$2 to \$5. It's only the second time the big interstate lottery, available in 45 states, Washington, D.C., and the U.S. Virgin Islands, has raised the ticket price (it doubled in 2017 to \$2). The lottery claims that the higher price "will result in larger starting jackpots and faster-growing prizes." Indeed, the lottery projects the average jackpot to be more than \$800 million, nearly double the current average of \$450 million. The game itself is also changing. The gold Mega Ball has been removed, which drops the chances of winning something from 1 in 24 to 1 in 23. The odds of hitting the 6-number jackpot are also better, going from 1 in 302.6 million, to 1 in 290.5 million.

Cops caught playing "Crime Bingo"

When someone is pulled over by law enforcement or engaged somehow by officers, the experience often comes with a surge of adrenaline, even fear, as worry about criminal charges or a mention in the newspaper sets in. Now there's a new concern: Am I being targeted in some sort of inside game the officers are playing? That's what happened in Bozeman, Montana recently where "Crime Bingo" had officers trying to mark off spots on their cards with things like "ARREST 3 PEOPLE OUT OF ONE CAR," and simply "BUTT-ASS NAKED," which was left open to interpretation by players. Thirteen officers, including two sergeants, marked off squares apparently generated by one of several online services catering to the current customized bingo craze, according to the Bozeman Police Department. The secret game came to light and Bozeman Police Chief Jim Veltkamp held a press conference to reveal details about the game, and insisted the rights of those stopped by BPD were not violated as part of the game and added that the game went on for 12 days until someone alerted command staff, who shut down the game. BPD offered no details about whether money was involved, who specifically originated the game or how individual officers were disciplined. The Gallatin County Attorney's Office, the Bozeman City Attorney's Office and the BPD each reportedly conducted internal investigations.

After three rounds, the player with the highest score advances to the fast-action Blitz round, where making a bingo in 60 seconds or less wins them \$10,000. The game itself-Bingo Blitz-has been around for more than a decade on Facebook and as a downloadable app on smartphones. Bingo Blitz airs weeknights at 7:30 p.m. ET on Game Show Network.


Hi Guy,

I would consider a heavy hors d'oeuvre to be one that is filling. I would include "Sweet and Sour Meatballs" and "Spinach Balls" as examples. At the same party I would also include some light bites for those guests who prefer lighter snacks. Try "Drew's Bruschetta" or a condiment plate of sliced peppers, celery, carrots and cucumbers served with a dish of blue cheese or ranch dressing. Here are a few of the recipes. -Annie

SWEET AND SOUR MEATBALLS

1 bottle chili sauce (Heinz or similar) 1 large can whole cranberry sauce 2-3 tablespoons brown sugar 1/2 lemon, juiced

1/2 large package frozen Armor Original Meatballs



Then there are the undeclared allergens, like the milk that was in tortilla chips and chicken salad, which can affect people who have a dairy allergy.

And we have the hot sauce with undeclared sulfites, which can seriously affect people who have an allergy to sulfites.

Then, in a potentially very dangerous mistake for those with heart and blood pressure problems, ground coffee was labeled as decaffeinated when it actually had caffeine.

And when you thought you'd recover from an illness with some over-the-counter help, we had a cough and cold medication recalled for being contaminated.

Signing up for email notifications is the best thing we can do right now, especially with the increase in the number of recalls. Go to <u>www.recalls.</u> <u>gov/food.html</u>, <u>www.fsis.usda.gov/</u> <u>recalls</u> and <u>www.foodsafety.gov</u> to sign up for email alerts. Or if you really don't want extra emails in your inbox, make a point of going to those sites once a week and scrolling through the list of new recalls.

Even if you think you probably don't have a recalled item, if you've ever bought it in the past, check your freezer and cabinets. That item might still be there.

"You ask the senior question, we find the savvy answer!"

Protect yourself from identity theft

Dear Savvy Senior,

I am very concerned about Elon Musk and the so-called DOGE team getting access to my Social Security number and personal financial information through their government office raids. What can I personally do to help protect myself from this identity theft mess? —*Worried Senior*

Dear Worried,

It's a great question! I've been hearing from many older readers around the country that are deeply troubled by the news that the Elon Musk-led Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) has been granted access to millions of Americans' Social Security records that include highly sensitive personal information.

The major concern among data privacy experts is what could happen if your Social Security number, bank account information or tax records somehow gets leaked or breeched in all the data shuffling. If your information gets in the wrong hands it could lead to identity theft, which means scammers could use your personal information to open credit card accounts, bank accounts, telephone service accounts, and make major purchases–all in your name.

If you're concerned about the privacy of your personal information, the best way to protect yourself is to put a "fraud alert," or better yet a "credit freeze" on your credit file.

A fraud alert is a notification placed on your credit report that signals to potential creditors to take extra steps to verify your identity before extending credit in your name. While a credit freeze completely restricts access to your credit report, essentially preventing anyone from opening new accounts in your name without your explicit authorization.

A credit freeze provides much stronger protection than a fraud alert, but there is a drawback. When you freeze your credit, you won't be able to open new credit cards or get a new loan while the freeze in place. It does not, however, prevent you from using the credit cards you already have open.

If you do need to get a new credit card or some type of loan, you can always lift the freeze on your account until you get the card or loan approved, and then refreeze it.

You'll also be happy to know that a credit freeze is completely free to put in place and lift, as are fraud alerts. And neither action will affect your credit score.

FRAUD ALERT SET-UP

To set up a fraud alert, you'll need to contact one of the three major credit reporting bureaus – Equifax, Experian and TransUnion – either by phone, online or by mail. You only need to contact one of these agencies, and they will notify the other two. Here's the phone and website contact information for each of the three bureaus. * Equifax: 800-685-1111 or <u>Equi-</u> <u>fax.com/personal/credit-report-ser-</u> <u>vices</u>

* Experian: 888-397-3742 or <u>Expe</u>rian.com/help

* TransUnion: 888-909-8872 or <u>TransUnion.com/credit-help</u>

If you haven't been a victim of identity theft, you'll need to set up an "initial fraud alert," which lasts for one year, although you can renew it for additional one-year periods.

CREDIT FREEZE SET-UP


To set up a credit freeze you'll need to contact each of the three previously listed credit reporting bureaus – Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. A credit freeze lasts until you unfreeze it.

But remember, before you apply for new credit card or loan, you'll need to temporarily lift the security freeze by following the procedures from each of the credit reporting bureaus where you placed the freeze.

If, however, you don't want to set up a fraud alert or credit freeze, you can still keep an eye on your credit file by reviewing your credit report regularly. You can get a free credit report each week from Equifax, Experian and TransUnion by going to <u>AnnualCredit-Report.com</u>.





A costly poker mistake

As I was watched the final table of the \$10,000 buy-in World Series of Poker (WSOP) Main Event, I noticed that many of the players had a clear, easily fixable, leak in their strategy that will make it difficult for them to succeed in the long run. Their mistake is that they raise with far too many hands from early position!

Within the first few hands at the WSOP final table, three different players raised with trashy hands from early position, the worst being with the 10c9h. It may be fun and make you feel powerful to raise with two somewhat reasonable cards from early position, but you must realize that you are taking your hand and playing it from out of position against the best of the remaining hands at the table.

If you think about this logically, each player yet to act will have a premium top 10% hand 10% of the time. This means that if you are raising into six players, they will each not have a premium hand 90% of the time. You then multiply .90 x .90 five times to see how often someone yet to act will have a premium hand. So, 53% of the time someone will not have a premi-

um hand, which means 47% of the time, someone will have a premium hand, putting the junky initial raising hand in awful shape.

While this may not seem too bad, the cutoff and button can play more than only premium hands due to their positional advantage. The big blind also gets to play a wider range profitably due to getting excellent pot odds.

When you work this math out, the preflop raise from early position may only steal the blinds 15% of the time, which is not often at all. Do you think that you can profitably play a marginal hand from out of position when you are in rough shape when you get called?

To make matters even worse, at the WSOP final table, some players have a shallow stack. On the first hand at the final table, a player raised the Kd6d and was pushed all in by the small blind's 8s8c. The King-Six then folded, which may not seem too costly, but if you consistently bleed off a few big blinds due to raising with marginal junk from early position, you will have a difficult time accumulating a large chip stack unless your opponents are especially tight and passive, which is rarely the case in today's poker games.

With \$10,000,000 up top, which is what last year's winner was slated to win, small mistakes can potentially cost you thousands, if not millions, of dollars.






