A call came in to the Hazard Fire Department about 5am Tuesday, September 1, 2015 that the Main Street Mall was on fire. Sadly this fire destroyed the Grand Hotel, and Pekings Restaurant, and over 30 families lost their homes. Little Flower Clinic acted quickly to make up bags of toiletries that might help these people in need. The Presbyterian Church housed the homeless until placement could be found.

Little Flower Clinic participated in the Grand Opening Ceremony at Hickory Hill Recovery Center. A very nice lunch was provided by the residents. A wide range of Community Supporters showed up for the event. We were in awe of the testimonies from the gentleman that had completed the program.

Recovery Kentucky is a program that helps Kentuckians recover from chronic substance abuse and addiction, and move toward a life of sobriety and productivity. It supplies supportive housing and a stable place to live, and a support system to help men and women recovering from substance abuse and addiction. Recovery Kentucky provides services to qualifying low income clients, regardless of an inability to pay.
