Annual Meeting

Please mark your calendars for March 5, 2018, the annual Oakmont II HOA meeting. We will be voting on several changes to our Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions. In order to approve any of the recommended changes it will take approval by 75% (85) of the HOA members voting either in person at the meeting or through proxy.

Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions recommended changes

A review of our documents shows that we as an Association are not in compliance with some the provisions of our governing HOA documents and are not in compliance with Tennessee State law or Collierville ordinances. There are also areas of non compliance with the documents, that while made sense when they were first adopted, no longer match what should be reality or acceptable in today's environment.

In the next month we will provide you with details for your review and ask for your consideration to approve the changes. These changes will include satellite communication dishes, yard signage, restrictions on certain building materials (such as vinyl windows), and the issue of converting your home to rental property. Valentine's Day

In light of this long celebrated "sweetest" day, here are some fun facts

Valentine's Day originated as a liturgical Christian celebration commemorating the martyrdom of Saint Valentine, the popular saint who was imprisoned then killed for performing weddings of soldiers previously forbidden to marry under a Christian service.

Tt was English poet, Geoffrey Chaucer who first created a strong association between St. Valentine's Day and romance. He wrote a poem in 1381 honoring the marriage of King Richard II of England and Anne of Bohemia, "For this was on St. Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.

The exchanging of Valentine's Day cards dates back to the 18th Century, when a British publisher issued "The Young Man's Valentine Writer", a book featuring sentimental verses and short poems for young lovers. Of course, printers soon started printing cards with some of those verses called "mechanical valentines"- the precursor to cards of today, including e-cards.
