2020 in Review: A Very Weird Year for All, But We Did[®]Okay!

Calling 2020 a "Weird year" is probably the understatement of a lifetime! We have NOTHING to compare 2020 to but most of us managed to survive it. Our Club took some hits but it managed to survive in pretty decent shape, too.

We had to shut down and cancel shows from April through June, and had to reschedule and re-locate others. We "cautiously" started back on July 4th at 'Cue Barbecue, with a variety of COVID safety precautions in place. We had extremely good participation, partially due to the fact that many were more than ready to get out, and partially due to the fact we had little competition. At one show, we had a participant come up from Florida and another from Alabama!

Donations were also quite good, as you can see below. Our biggest enemy on many show days was "Mother Nature," with everything from snow to rain to Tropical Storms. Once again, we made the best of the situations and "kept on trucking!"

Our other major issue was lack of Club volunteers to help on show day. Some of our "veteran" volunteers made the decision to Shelter-In for health reasons. We managed to make everything work, with those dedicated few carrying the torch, show after show. Our thanks to those dedicated members that came out early and stayed late to make things work!

Our last two shows for the year drew capacity crowds and AMAZING donations to the event's charity. We raised \$3,300 for local needy at our November show at Handy Ace Hardware, and collected 573 toys and \$3,067 at our Toys for Tots Cruise-in!

Looking forward to 2021, we really don't know what will happen. There is a bright spot with the COVID vaccine being approved, but we will be taking it one step at a time and see what happens. We have several shows scheduled for 2021, and hope that they will happen as scheduled.

In a very TOUGH year, we did pretty well. We raised nearly \$23,000 to help some very good charities! Thanks again to all that helped make it possible!
