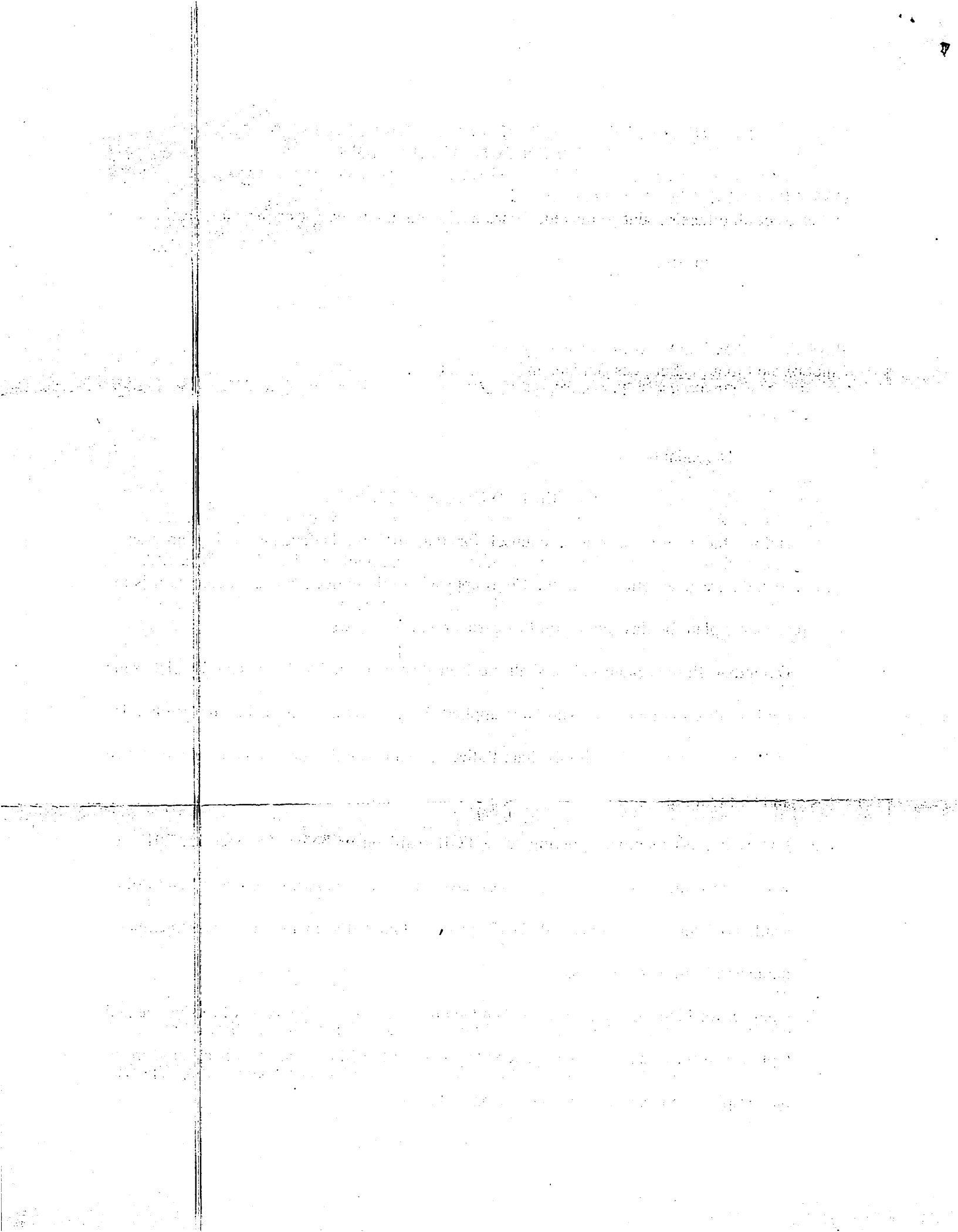

ORDER FOR CLASS NOTICE

Before the Court for status, counsel for Plaintiff and Defendant having previously conferred and agreed as follows, and the Court approving said notice plan, and agreeing it is the most reasonable plan for class notice for this case, orders as follows:

1. Defendant Illinois State Police shall, no later than October 24, 2017, send by electronic mail to all class members who have applied for a FOID card on or before October 15, 2017 and for whom the Illinois State Police have an e-mail address a copy of the Notice and Opt Out Form attached to this order.
2. For each class member applying for a FOID card on or before October 15, 2017 for which the Illinois State Police does not have an e-mail address, the Illinois State Police shall, no later than October 24, 2017, provide Plaintiff's counsel the class member's name and last-known address.
3. Counsel for Plaintiff shall, no later than October 31, 2017, mail a copy of the Notice and Opt Out Form to each class member identified by the Illinois State Police, pursuant to paragraph 2, above, as not having an email address.



4. Beginning October 16, 2017 until this case is dismissed, final judgment is entered, or until further order of the Court, Defendant Illinois State Police shall include in the electronic receipt sent to all FOID card applicants upon receipt of their applications the following statement:

NOTICE: A class action lawsuit entitled *Gary Sterr v. Jessica Trame, et al.*, Case No. 15-L-1337, has been filed in the Third Judicial Circuit, Madison County, Illinois, which may affect your rights. Please visit www.foidcard.info for more information, where you may download a form to opt out of the class if you desire.

5. Plaintiff shall post, on its website www.foidcard.info, a copy of the Complaint, the class certification order, this order, and the attached Notice and Opt Out Form.
6. Any person who applied for a FOID card between March 15, 2015 and October 15, 2017, who wishes to opt out of the class in this case, must mail, to Maag Law Firm, LLC, 22 West Lorena Avenue, Wood River, IL 62095, a properly marked and signed Opt Out Form, no later than December 14, 2017.
7. Any person who applies for a FOID card on or after October 16, 2017, shall have 90 days from the date of applying for a FOID card, excluding the day of application, to opt out of the class in this case, if they so choose, and to do so, must mail, to Maag Law Firm, LLC, 22 West Lorena Avenue, Wood River, IL 62095, a properly marked and signed Opt Out Form, no later than 90 days from the date of applying for their FOID card.
8. At least every 30 days, Plaintiff's counsel shall forward to the Court and counsel for Defendants all timely post-marked, signed, and properly completed Opt Out Forms received by Maag Law Firm, LLC and not previously forwarded under this paragraph. An Opt Out Form shall be deemed timely if it is post-marked within the time allowed.
9. In the event that the Maag Law Firm, LLC, receives any late or nonconforming Opt Out Forms, it shall, at least every 90 days, forward a copy of the late or nonconforming Opt

The Court may, on its own motion or on the motion of any party, order that any or all individuals submitting untimely, unsigned, or nonconforming Opt Out Forms shall be excused from the class and unbound by any judgment in this case, notwithstanding this paragraph.

10. The attached Notice and Opt Out Form is approved.

11. Ninety days from the date of this order, and each 90 day period thereafter that this case is pending and the \$1.00 at issue is being collected, Plaintiffs and Defendants will file status reports with the Court delineating the status of class notice for this case, opt outs, and issues related thereto.
