



## 60 SECOND UPDATE February 12, 2021

### COVID-19 Cases

As of February 12, 2021, there have been 5739 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Lenawee County; 25 new confirmed cases since yesterday. We currently have 493 active confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Lenawee County; 18 of those cases are hospitalized. We have not been below 500 active COVID cases since the middle of November. There have been 107 confirmed and 4 probable COVID deaths reported to date in Lenawee County.

Please continue to practice prevention strategies to prevent the spread of the virus; wear a mask, maintain 6 feet of distance from those not part of your household and wash hands frequently.

### Vaccine Update

The COVID vaccine is currently available in limited quantities and is being distributed based on the vaccination prioritization guidance from Michigan Department of Health and Human Services [https://www.michigan.gov/documents/coronavirus/MI\\_COVID-19\\_Vaccination\\_Prioritization\\_Guidance\\_710349\\_7.pdf](https://www.michigan.gov/documents/coronavirus/MI_COVID-19_Vaccination_Prioritization_Guidance_710349_7.pdf). The following groups are currently eligible for vaccination.

#### Phase 1A

All groups (healthcare)

#### Phase 1B

Group A - Those age 75 and older.

Group B - Pre-Kindergarten through high school teachers, support staff and child care workers who usually have direct contact with children. First responders not covered in Phase 1A (firefighters, police, conservation officers). Corrections workers (staff in prisons, jails, juvenile justice facilities) Workers in homeless shelters, congregate child care institutions, and adult and child protective services

#### Phase 1C

Group A - Individuals age 65 to 74 years. This includes those in a congregate setting that were not reached in prior phases.

## **Weekly Vaccination Information from the Health Department**

- We were allocated 900 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine this week for first dose appointments.
- This week's appointments were full within one hour.
- Total vaccine received from the state: 7,550 doses to date.
- 5,033 first doses have been administered.
- 1,696 second doses have been administered.
- There are currently 30,000 Lenawee County residents estimated eligible for vaccination under the current priority groups.

At this time, there is not enough vaccine for all the individuals who are eligible to receive it. Until we begin receiving larger quantities of vaccine from the state, this is unfortunately unavoidable.
