

Knock, Knock...And the Door Will Be
Opened!With Pastor Eric

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh." Luke 6:21b

When I was a kid, I loved reading the Chronicles of Narnia by C.S. Lewis. It was at Beaver Cross, an Episcopal Church camp in Springfield, N.Y. that Father Barnes

introduced me to the first book of the series, <u>The Lion, The Witch</u> and the Wardrobe. Over the years I read most of the series and learned a great deal about Christian faith without realizing it.

Few authors have shared the good news of the Christian gospel as compellingly as C.S. Lewis in the Chronicles of Narnia. In one passage the characters Eustace, Jill and Aslan weep over the dead King Caspian. After Aslan (a lion who represents Jesus) is wounded with a pierced paw and his blood splashes on the dead king the king is wonderfully revived; "his sunken cheeks grew round and fresh, and the wrinkles were smoothed, and his eyes opened, and his eyes and lips both laughed, and suddenly he leaped up and stood before them—a very young man, or a boy." When he turns to the children, he gives a "great laugh of astonished joy."

When Aslan is asked if Caspian hadn't died, the great lion speaks in a voice that sounds like laughter. "He has died. Most people have, you know. Even I have. There are very few who haven't." The resurrection invites laughter. The kind of laughter we sometimes experience when something so impossible happens we can do nothing else but laugh.

I love this response to resurrection. I have heard it at funeral receptions when families gather to discuss "what was" and "what

will be" now that life is altered for them. Laughter gives hope sprinkled with joyous memory. Laughter is a gift for defusing conflict and reducing stress because it makes room for a moment of perspective. When we can laugh at ourselves is perhaps the greatest gift and allows us to learn and lean into faith in both God and others.

Did Jesus laugh? I expect that he did quite often. Right now, our world seems especially fraught with angst and in need of "holy laughter." The kind of joy that brings tears to our eyes and sweet release – the joy of resurrection and new life. Try this joke to help bring some joy to someone.

In the foyer of a church, a young boy was looking at a plaque with the names of men and women who had died in various wars. He asked the pastor, "Who are these people?" The pastor said, "Those are members from our church who died in service." The boy asked, "The early service or the second service?" (based on true events ©)


