"I wanted to be buried with a fork in my hand," she told him.


The Pastor stood, looking at the young woman, not knowing quite what to say.

The young woman explained that her idea came from a story that she remembered her Grandma telling.... (continued on page 5)





Her Grandmother described the many, many church socials and potluck dinners she had attended throughout the many years. She remembered that when the dishes of the main course were being cleared, someone would inevitably lean over and say, "Keep your fork." It was her favorite because of she knew something better was coming - like velvety chocolate cake or deep-dish apple pie. Something wonderful and well worth waiting for!

As the Pastor listened intently, the young woman continued, "I just want people to see me with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder, 'What's with the fork?' Then, later, you can tell them - I know and I want to remind them that you must 'KEEP YOUR FORK...the BEST IS YET TO COME."

The pastor's eyes welled up with tears of joy as he hugged the young woman goodbye. He knew this would be the last time he would see her before her death. But he also knew that the young woman has a better grasp of heaven than he did. She knew that something better was coming.



At the funeral, people walking by the casket, over and over said the same questions, "What's with the fork?"

Later, during his message, the pastor told of the conversation he had with the young woman shortly before she died. He also told them about the fork and what it symbolized for her. The pastor told the people how he could not stop thinking about the fork and that they probably shouldn't either.
