- This is potentially the last VIRTUS class to be offered at St. Mary's into the near future which means that you would have to complete this class in another parish at another time before you can undertake your desired duties for the parish.

Plan to attend this wonderful opportunity to honor the beloved patroness of our Parish!

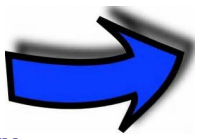
MAY HEAVEN'S GATES BE OPENED

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Taking the Name of the Lord in Vain

2150 The second commandment forbids false oaths. Taking an oath or swearing is to take God as witness to what one affirms. It is to invoke the divine truthfulness as a pledge of one's own truthfulness. An oath engages the Lord's name. "You shall fear the LORD your God; you shall serve him, and swear by his name."
2151 Rejection of false oaths is a duty toward God. As Creator and Lord, God is the norm of all truth. Human speech is either in accord with or in opposition to God who is Truth itself. When it is truthful and legitimate, an oath highlights the relationship of human speech with God's truth. A false oath calls on God to be witness to a lie.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA

Tomar el Nombre del Señor en vano

2150 El segundo mandamiento prohíbe el juramento en falso. Hacer juramento o jurar es tomar a Dios por testigo de lo que se afirma. Es invocar la veracidad divina como garantía de la propia veracidad. El juramento compromete el nombre del Señor. "Al Señor tu Dios temerás, a él le servirás, por su nombre jurarás" (Dt 6, 13).
2151 La reprobación del juramento en falso es un deber para con Dios. Como Creador y Señor, Dios es la norma de toda verdad. La palabra humana está de acuerdo o en oposición con Dios que es la Verdad misma. El juramento, cuando es veraz y legítimo, pone de relieve la relación de la palabra humana con la verdad de Dios. El falso juramento invoca a Dios como testigo de una mentira.

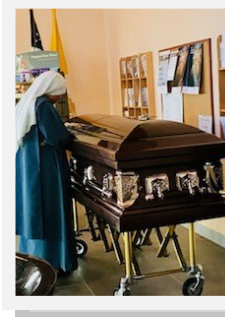
